## The New Silhouetter

I wouldn't sully the discussion of a laser rangefinder by reference to need. I doubt that even five or ten percent of my shooting accessories would qualify under that silly criterion. Like any self-respecting hobby, the shooting sports are largely driven by desire rather than necessity. While less emotionally secure individuals may need to justify frivolity by some rationalization such as need, I'm not bashful when it comes to

such things. So, need or not, when ready to look at an electronic rangefinder, why not start at the top, with Leupold's RX Series Digital Rangefinders.

The laser rangefinder concept is simple enough today; a low intensity laser beam emerges from the unit, bounces off a target and returns to the unit. The time necessary to make the roundtrip converts into the distance to the target. For about the last 20-30 years or so, we've been the benefi-

ciaries of ongoing new applications of affordable electronics, including laser rangefinders that have become more practical for ownership by individuals.

Like so many other endeavors of Leupold, quality and durability are applied to its RX Series. Within the line, there are currently four models (RX-I, RX-II, RX-III and RX-IV). The former two models have 6x magnification and can range a reflective target out to 750 yards; the latter two models have 8x magnification with the RX-III going as far as 1200 yards and the RX-IV going even farther, to 1500 yards. Realistically, my applications with a laser rangefinder stay within 200 meters, setting targets on otherwise unmarked shooting fields. However, with desire already eclipsing practicality, I decided to take a look at the RX-IV 1500-yard model.

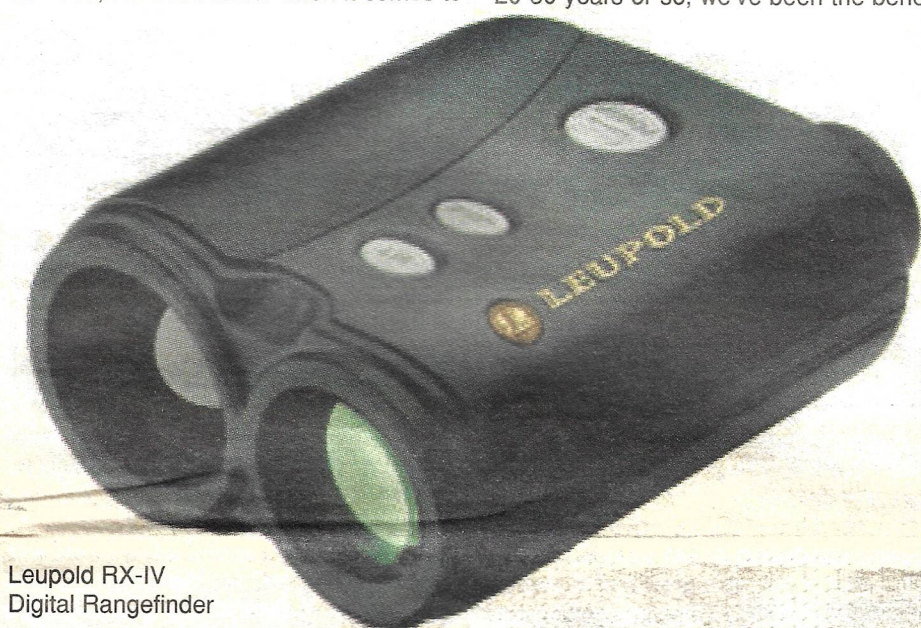
Besides the obvious, the RX-IV model has an incredible array of features, including distance measurements in feet, yards and meters, as well as inclinations/declinations and conversion to true ballistic range (TBR). Rather than regurgitate all the features here, you can find complete specifications on the Leupold website at [www.Leupold.com](http://www.Leupold.com).

By the time I got home the day my Leupold RX-IV Digital Rangefinder arrived at my door, it was too dark to freak out my neighbors by peering at their houses with what would appear to them to be a pair of

binoculars. I guess that would be about one notch below seeing a red laser beam coming into your house. But I didn't let the darkness deter me from immediately opening the package and fiddling with the Rangefinder within the house, ignoring the operating instructions that clearly suggest a reverse approach. Fortunately, unlike toy assembly projects, no harm was done to the Rangefinder whose operation is, fortunately, fairly intuitive, which is quite helpful in understanding the written instructions. While the operating instructions in the owner's manual are not idiot-proof, the controls are sufficiently intuitive for basic operation of the unit. As special features are explored, such as TBR, rain mode and others, persistence will overcome frustration and you'll get the hang of it. I guess I'm somewhat of a crank pot when it comes to operating manuals and I rarely have exemplary comments on them.

I was immediately surprised at how accurate it was at the short distances in the house. Now I know how far the TV is from where my butt was firmly planted on the couch. Eventually, I got off my derriere and confirmed the distance in feet, yards and meters, information as useless with a tape measure as it was with the RX-IV. Due to the short distances and variations in lighting, I did get my share of errors, but my surprise was that the unit worked at all un-

## The Ranging Shot

Smith and Wesson announced in the middle of December that it had purchased Thompson Center Arms for \$102 million. S&W essentially borrowed the money and paid cash in the deal. There was immediately some concern among fans of the Contender and Encore pistols that the guns might be pushed aside for some reason or another. Rest assured that the Contender and Encore are safe and that there are no changes envisioned for them.

At first I also was a little concerned about the sale as S&W is a handgun company and knows nothing about long guns. TC on the other hand is for the most part a long gun company with just a small toe dipping into the handgun pool. Additionally, S&W's products are essentially geared toward the security, police, and self defence markets and only slightly towards the outdoor world. TC on the other hand with 50% of the blackpowder market, is totally oriented toward the outdoor sports - a realm S&W doesn't understand very well. However, I was reassured when I found out that the president and CEO of TC was being retained by S&W. This is a good move by S&W to preserve that expertise.

One particularly interesting fact that arose out of the sale announcement was that TC will be bringing out a bolt action rifle to the marketplace probably in the mid to late summer time frame. Should be interesting.

### 7 IHMSA

Was trying to think of a subject for this column the other day and for some reason or another the 7 IHMSA cartridge popped into my mind. Unless you're an old timer like me, there's a very good chance that you

probably don't even know what a 7 IHMSA is. It's basically a 300 Savage case necked down to 7mm with a 40 degree shoulder and blown out slightly. BTW, if you don't know what a 300 Savage is, you could call it a slightly smaller version of a 308 Winchester. Thus, the 7 IHMSA is similar to a 7-08 but just around 12-15% smaller.

What made the 7 IHMSA unique was that it was one of those hot silhouette cartridges that became a real milestone in the history of our sport. It achieved that status because it was the cartridge that largely transitioned the unlimited class from 14" Thompson Contenders to XP-100's.

Let's do a little historical review. Back in the mid to late 70's, THE #1 overriding is-

sue in handgun silhouette was the lack of knockdown power. Nothing is more frustrating than to hit a ram or even a pig and not have it go down. Back then, it was a regular occurrence.

A big part of that problem was the lack of uniformity in the targets and rails. Almost all of the targets then were home made with whatever steel scrap a club could lay their hands on. Looking at photos of early silhouette targets one can't help be surprised to see that chicken targets shot with even revolvers often would be deeply cratered, thus indicating that very soft steel was often being used by many clubs. I'm personally convinced that soft steel targets have the ability to absorb some portion of the impact momentum of a bullet striking it. Additionally, target weights varied, rail materials ran from fresh cut pine logs (used by my old Florida club) to railroad ties, or railroad rails that were bent and tilted one way or another. Some clubs even sat the animals down in the dirt and hoped the ground wouldn't be muddy that weekend. The mud could hold the animals down like glue and significantly increased the weight of the target when they got covered with the sticky stuff.

The 14" Thompson Contender was definitely the most popular unlimited gun at the time. The cost was modest so almost anyone could afford one. It was also reliable, had interchangeable barrels, could take a good trigger job, and was backed up with a good warrantee. However it was limited as far as cartridge selection was concerned.

The 30X223 was an early attempt to find a reliable ram buster in a Contender. As

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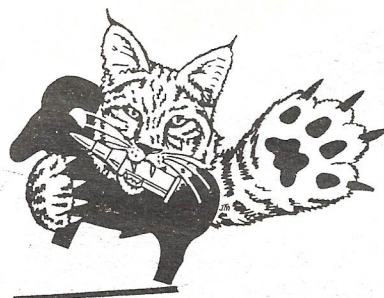
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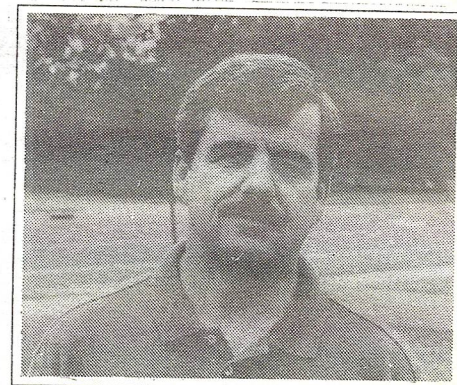

## Wildcat Corner

Every now and then this column will deviate from a technical topic and that's the case this month.

Here in Minnesota we have a state silhouette association (MSA), founded in 1979 at the start of the rapid growth of interest in silhouette shooting. At that time getting new members wasn't a problem. It was almost a standing room only thing at the weekend matches and even worse come state championship time. But in today's climate where there is intense competition for our own individual time and our entertainment dollar, the interest in silhouette shooting continues its downward trend, a trend which has been with us for quite a few years.

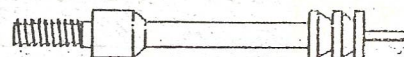
In 1989 the MSA decided that the way to attract new silhouette shooters was to get them to come to a match as a guest and shoot for free. But with all of the IHMSA gun categories, shooting positions and safety requirements, we knew that absorbing all of this by simply walking up to the line and shooting would be intimidating for some people. So we decided to put on a short organized talk to the shooters and then let them get on the line and give it a try. We called this organized presentation a First Time Shooter's Clinic. We didn't make the mistake that other clubs did in trying to charge these new shooters for the "privilege" of listening to us...we did it at no cost or FREE.

This effort has been conducted every year since 1989. When we (the members of the MSA) meet in late fall each year as a group to set-up our next year's silhouette

match schedule, the first date we put on our calendar is the First Time Shooter's Clinic. The clinic is held on the Saturday morning of a two-day match, our first match of the season. After we spend a few hours with our new "students" we turn them loose to shoot as our guests for the balance of the day. We try to have an experienced shooter, with a spotting scope, behind each shooting position to help the new shooter make his way through the course of fire.

After a few years of doing this, IHMSA adopted our booklet that we pass out to all clinic attendees. This, along with a few other items, eventually became known as the IHMSA clinic kit. In checking with IHMSA headquarters as the years went by, I learned that only a few clubs every now and then asked for the kits. The only club that did this on a regular basis was the Oakdale Gun Club in Lake Elmo, MN in conjunction with the MSA.

In closing on this short column, I'd like to take this opportunity to remind all of our IHMSA gun clubs that this vehicle for introducing and recruiting new shooters is a viable one and in addition to the other recruiting methods that you read about in The IHMSA News, the First Time Shooter Clinic should be included in your efforts to help our sport grow. It takes a little more work, some planning and advertising, but our experience has shown that this method does bring in new shooters each season, some of which stay with us for the long haul, having FUN shooting silhouettes!

## Ekspurt Advice

*Note: This is a continuation of a discussion I had with Don who is an old friend whom I hadn't seen since the 2002 Internationals at TUSCO.*

**Q:** Back to the 30 Herrett. I've been trying to think of a factory cartridge that I could use for silhouette where I don't have to make brass. That is why I was looking at the 7.62x39. (A mutual friend) uses one in his XL but he is impossible to reach for comment. Yes, the Herrett has more punch but I was always down loading it to reduce recoil and blast. Any way, we now have Half-Scale and people like smaller pills. I've been hoping the 6.8 Rem SPC would take off. Seems about perfect if accuracy can be perfected. My real problems are failed eye sight, not being able to hold steady, and four blank membership cards and a fifth with only two match dates.

Don.

**A:** Don. Great to hear from you again. Making brass is a pain but should only have to be done once if you make enough of them and take care of them. You can't beat the TCUs for simplicity's sake. For Half-Scale the 6 TCU is perfect and is a one pass necking-up operation. Personally, I've invented my own cartridge for Half-Scale. It's the .22 TCU but for some reason, it just hasn't taken off like I'd hoped.

There is an article in the December, 2006 issue of Precision Shooting about a 6mm SPC project but the focus is on NRA across the course competition.

I know what you mean about unused score card space. I failed to make even one Big Bore match last year. However, hope springs eternal for this coming year.

**Q:** As for the 30 Herrett, looking over my log book I see I have fired 10,000 plus rounds. Most in competition. Wow! But the brass. A lot of work, but worth it. One problem always stood out. Split necks and shoulders. Early writings claimed this was from not getting the crush fit in the chamber. Not so. Yes, they must fit the chamber but my brass failed any way. It has taken me 18 years to get close to understanding why. Slow, aren't I? With the opening of a shooting range near home (what a blessing), I

went out to fire form some very old Herrett ammo. This ammo was over 10 years old. The brass had never before been fired. They split down the neck and shoulder at a rate of 80%. Taking the unfired ammo home for inspection I found hair line cracks down the necks and shoulders of some cases. ??? This is new, unfired brass. My brass forming was by the book. Lube a 30-30 case and run it through the full length sizer die and trim off the excess. I went to (Another mutual friend) for a conference. He also has two 30 Herretts. Seems he uses the trim die to push the shoulder down, not the FL die. I have tried this but haven't fired any yet. He claims he NEVER gets split brass. Could it be the expander stressing the case? Now I am on my second set of dies, having long ago worn out my first set. I use the best forming lube money can buy.

**A:** Don. I can think of a couple of possibilities for your neck splitting problem. First, it may be that the brass has become work hardened and needs to be annealed. Second, it might just be a bad lot of brass. (Yet another mutual friend) had a problem with case separations with his Hornet and was about to give up. I started using a similar load in my Hornet with no problems so he tried another lot of brass and the problem disappeared.

Even new brass can take a lot of abuse during forming if there are several steps involved and may require re-annealing half way through the process. Also, brass is only annealed at the neck/shoulder area. Shortening for the Herrett may be trimming most of the softened metal away. What's left is slightly thicker brass which may not be fully annealed.

And, a tapered expander ball such as those on the Hornady New Dimension dies is easier on brass too. Take care of yourself, Don.

## Notice to IHMSA Members.

From the President of IHMSA, Inc.

The board of directors of IHMSA, Inc. has, by majority vote, determined that the following proposed amendments to the bylaws be decided by referendum.

### Proposal number one - elections

Article VI, Section 3, Paragraph 4 presently reads "If no valid nominations are received prior to the 28th day of February, a nominating committee of at least three members of the board shall be formed, and they shall present at least **two eligible nominees** for each vacancy to be voted upon by the membership."

To amend Article VI, Section 3 paragraph 4 to read "If no valid nominations are received prior to the 28th day of February, a nominating committee of at least three members of the board shall be formed, and they shall present at least **one eligible nominee** for each vacancy to be voted upon by the membership."

Rational: No valid nomination was received for the office of President by the closing date and it then fell to the nominations committee to identify two suitable candidates to be put to the membership. Despite considerable effort and the seeking of expressions of interest via the pages of this publication, only one eligible candidate has emerged. In these circumstances, the election for the office of President cannot proceed and the proposed bylaw change appears necessary.

### Proposal number two - quorums

Article X, Section 7 presently reads, "A quorum for the annual business meeting shall be **fifty** eligible members. Unless otherwise prescribed, a majority vote of the eligible members present will be required to carry a motion."

To amend Article X, Section 7 to read, "A quorum for the annual business meeting shall be **thirty** eligible members. Unless otherwise prescribed, a majority vote of the eligible members present will be required to carry a motion."

Rational: The last two Annual Business Meetings have failed to achieve a quorum and no business could be transacted. This is a situation that cannot be allowed to continue and it appears necessary that the current quorum of 50 eligible members be reduced to a level that is more likely to be achieved in 2007 and beyond. Thirty eligible members is the number recommended as to go below 28 could see the board constitute one half of the eligible members present and that is not seen as desirable.

der the conditions. When I told my wife how far she was from me, she was unimpressed, still wondering why it was more important to me to be working with the Rangefinder than to eat dinner. So, great diplomat that I am in maintaining domestic tranquility, it was dinner first followed by the review of the operating instructions.

My first range run with the RX-IV occurred in a roundabout manner. I was at a lever action silhouette match and was looking to spot some bullet marks on steels during pre-match practice. I had forgotten a spotting scope or binoculars when I remembered I had the RX-IV in the car. It suddenly dawned on me that, range measurements aside, the unit had an 8x magnification, perfect for the task at hand. However, once in hand, I decided to give the RX-IV a good workout. For lever action silhouette, we had pistol cartridge targets (our IHMSA Field Pistol, or Half-Scale) set at 40 yards, 50 yards, 75 yards and 100 yards. Rifle cartridge targets (IHMSA Big Bore) were set at 50 meters, 100 meters, 150 meters and 200 yards. To test the RX-IV, I ranged targets at each of those distances. Steadying myself against a roof support column at the forward edge of our poured concrete shooting pad, I was as impressed at the precision of our club crews who had installed the target rails as I was with the accuracy and repeatability of the unit.

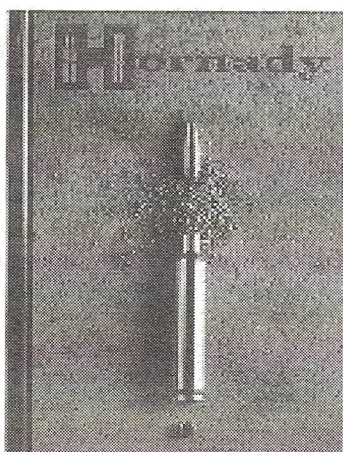
All rangefinders have reflectivity of the target as a criterion for accuracy. This was an observed phenomenon as I was ranging the Big Bore targets. It started with the pigs, where four of the animals measured 101 meters and one measured 100 meters. I measured them again with the same result. Then when resetting the targets between relays, I changed the sequence of the positions of the pigs and each one still measured the same as it had previously, despite its new position. I guess it was the pockmarks, but somehow, the reflectivity was different (all measurements were within the 1 yard/meter accuracy specifications). The same happened with the rams, one errant sheep refusing to yield on its 202-meter measure.

Even testing on a pair of golf courses attached to a family vacation spot earlier this winter, I hardly approached the distance capability of the RX-I, let alone the RX-IV. However, laser rangefinders are one of those tools where more is generally better. I've never heard anyone complain that the distance capability of a rangefinder was too far. So, while I'd be happy with any of the RX series, the RX-IV elevates that happiness to a superlative level.

Sometimes little things make a big difference and that applies with reloading accessories just like anything else. The Quick Change Cylinder from RCBS definitely falls into this category. Once in place on my RCBS Uniflow II powder measure, changing between the large and small metering screw assemblies was a snap. All that needs to be done is loosen the set "screw" (actually a conveniently sized 1/2" set bolt), pull out one sized screw assembly, insert the replacement, tighten the set bolt and you're all ready to drop powder; it actually takes less time to change than it took me to hunt and peck this sentence. Besides the metering screw assemblies, the unit also

comes with a totally neat drain adapter. Without the adapter, emptying the powder hopper between powders requires either repetitive handle strokes or removing the measure from the bench and turning it upside down. With the drain adapter in place, the entire hopper can be drained right into the original powder container with a single stroke of the powder measure handle.

I just got my hands on the 7th Edition Hornady Handbook of Cartridge Reloading. Yes, it does have a lot of new data, both for old and new cartridges. For example, you'll find everyone's current petite darling, the 204 Ruger there. My initial surprise on getting the Handbook (emphasis on the "singular" name) is that there weren't two volumes as customarily published by Hornady. The surprise turned out to be the show stealer in that Hornady has eliminated the second volume in favor of publishing ballistics information in a special new section of its website.

The idea was so fresh that after I reviewed the reloading data the first time, the website portion was still under construction. Even today, as I write this, the terminal ballistics segment is still being put together. Hopefully, by the time you read this, everything will be there at [www.hornady.com/ballistics](http://www.hornady.com/ballistics). Anyway, having been involved recently, although peripherally, with the development of some websites, I can appreciate how much effort goes into the process and when the result is one as good as this one, I appreciate it even more. The site is well organized, easy to navigate and fast.

More important (well, I guess that depends on to whom), the ballistics info is just what it takes to make a trajectory, speed and energy junkie swoon. There is a separate link to internal ballistics, external ballistics, terminal ballistics and a ballistics calculator. The internal ballistics segment, although already presented in the handbook, is a nice complement to the printed material, extremely well-done and nicely illustrated. The external ballistics segment is a delight for those of us interested in such things and as straightforward as such a technical section has a right to be while still retaining accuracy of the material. As previously mentioned, the terminal ballistics section could not be reviewed at the time of this writing.

The ballistics calculator is excellent. I suppose I've been working with ballistics software for more than a decade and while I use several programs, they are usually either too simple or too complicated. While one of these two extremes is sometimes

desirable, it seems that Hornady got it just about right for the average application. While a few compromises are made, the overall product gives enough information for most situations. Here's an example I put

Just to see the impact, I increased the speed by 100 fps, changed the zero range to 150 yards, made it colder and added a slight bit of wind. All of that took less time than it took me to type this sentence. Here is the result (note the addition of the wind drift calculations):

There are no passwords, so even without the 7th Edition Handbook, I suppose you can go to the Hornady website and use the ballistics calculator, but with all the new loads and updates of bullets, powder and components, this loading reference guide is a must for my reloading library. For example, a quick look at the powder burn rate chart shows new powders such as ZIP and Trailboss. There are lots of other changes that reflect changes in components and the

text is extremely well done. Thanks, Hornady.

Another valuable reloading resource comes from Hodgdon, with the release of its 2007 Annual Manual. Ever since Hodgdon started the publication of these regular annual updates, I've eagerly awaited them, both for the new data and the articles that accompany them. It's a double hit, containing top-notch articles and the latest in data from Hodgdon. This year's pleasant surprise is the incorporation of load data for IMR and Winchester powders right in the same cartridge tables as Hodgdon branded powders. That will save a lot of book-to-book time as well as cut down on errors from writing down the data from several locations.

together in seconds, assuming a 150-grain bullet strolling along at a modest 1900 fps at the muzzle. Any of the inputs can be changed.

I did note, however, that quite a few cartridges were dropped from both the rifle and pistol data, including IHMSA favorites like the 7mm TCU, 7mm BR and 7mm IHMSA, among others. I'm not sure why this was done, deliberately or through the copy to print process. Nevertheless, there is so much in new data for non-IHMSA cartridges that I shoot, that the effort in keeping the previous (2006) Annual Manual on hand for the cartridges that are not addressed in the 2007 issue, is well worth it. Hopefully, for the 2008 Annual Manual and beyond, the complete lineup of cartridges will again be published. Anyway, the bottom line is that, as is, this is a very good addition to my reloading library.

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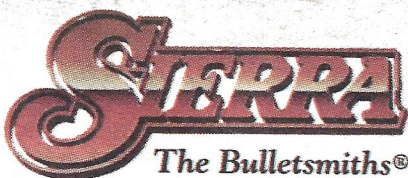
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# THE 2006 IHMSA

There seems to be a trend developing here. In the past couple years the winners in some of the categories were decided in the last couple months of the year. For 2006, it came down to the last few weeks of the year.

Accepted for the WIN that is! Congratulations Paul!

In my last article I questioned where were all the Air shooters. Well, they showed up in December. Richard Kiesov from TX has been preparing a new Crossman for battle in production against all the 747's. Richard had Steve Martens install his sight set-up and had Mike Stimson to tune the trigger. Richard found the Crossman Premier pellet to his pistol's liking and printed a nice .654" group. Nice shooting Richard. Steve Martens and a contingent of MN shooters gave the competitions a try back in November and December and sent in their best. Steve, Gary Hanneman, Dan Harder, and Jarred Richards all shot very respectable groups with their 747's with Mr. Martens coming out on top at .308". This is the second year in a row that Steve has captured the Burris Cup with groups in the "threes". Congratulations Steve and nice shooting.

The Weaver Trophy is heading to NC this year thanks to Taylor Byrum's spectacular group in the "one's". No late challengers were received in this category as the bar was set pretty high. Congrats Taylor. The Merit Challenge is likewise heading to NC this year as Ronny Brown's 1.836" iron sight group bests all challengers. Keep in mind that Ronny shot this sub two inch group with a production gun. Great shooting Ronny and congratulations.

This concludes our 2006 wrap up folks. We had a total of 25 entries this year which is two more than last. Thanks to all who participated. Remember, the IHMSA Marksmanship Competitions are for you. If there is anything you would like to change or another category you would like to see drop me a line and let me know. A couple shooters have inquired about a category for revolvers. Perhaps open to all IHMSA legal revolvers, iron sight, freestyle (no benchrest), at 100 yards? You tell me. Let's make an effort to get in more entries in 2007 so keep the Marksmanship Competitions in mind your next trip out to the range.

The 2007 silhouette season will be starting up very soon and I hope to see you on the range somewhere. I will be contacting the trophy supplier in the near future and will mail the trophies to the winners. If you would like your targets returned, drop me a letter, call, or email. Again, congratulations to the winners.

For clarification, the format and rules for the 2007 IHMSA Marksmanship Competitions remain unchanged and are listed below.

### Format for the 2007 IHMSA Marksmanship Competitions.

#### The Burris Cup:

Scoped .22 Long Rifle caliber handguns only. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in a freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

#### The Weaver Trophy:

Scoped centerfire handguns. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

#### The Merit Challenge:

Centerfire handguns with iron / open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

#### The Daisy Avanti Trophy:

Air Production guns with Iron /Open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

**General Rules:** All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver, and Merit classes.

**Witness:** Winning groups must be witnesses by an IHMSA or NRA member. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooter's IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.

Send in your best group. The more info the better so include your gun make, scope or sight type and make, caliber, and any bullet and load data you care to share. Send those targets to:

Dear Leo:

I have noticed a significant change in the manner in which IHMSA implements rule changes over the past few years, and I find this change rather disturbing as it appears that the Board has ceased communication with the membership.

In the past, we had articles in the *IHMSA News* from the Rules Committee informing the membership of approaching deadlines for proposed rule changes. After the annual meeting, articles were published informing the membership of new rules that were passed or rejected by the Board or delegates and the implications of those changes. Over the past two years, that communication has been non-existent.

Rules are posted on IHMSA's web site. As of January 23, 2007 there are two sets both appearing to be the 2007 rulebook. These rules are not consistent with each other. One Section VI.B.10. addresses fore end width and another references BATF rules and regulations. Thus, as a match director it is impossible for me to know what is or is not to be enforced.

While the Board of Directors may pass any rule change without notice, it does not promote discussion between the Board and membership when this is done. There has been no notice of this new paragraph 10 other than a rather obscure statement in the President's Report. I had hoped to see something that would allow member input. This did not happen.

The final irony of this fiasco is that apparently the pistol that spawned this rule change and its owner are prominently featured on the front of IHMSA's full color promotional brochure.

Hopefully, the Board will comply with the bylaws of this organization and begin to publish Board votes starting with who voted on this change and how.

**Dear Leo and the General Membership of IHMSA.**

I had hoped that writing this letter wouldn't be necessary but recent events and actions by members of the Board of

Directors have forced this action. Some events in this may be addressed in the Jan/Feb issue of the *IHMSA News*, which I have not received yet.

In the August 2006 Presidents report, Mike Stimson reported a trend in firearms on Unlimited category pistols that "we don't like" and to look for a rule change in the October issue. Taking exception to this I emailed him asking to what the trend was referring to and who the 'we' in "we don't like" was. I then composed a letter that was emailed to all of the board of directors on September 15th, 2006. The text of which follows this letter. I received 5 replies, all thanking me for my input, one saying they were only involved if Blair Hamilton wasn't able to, and another asking me to defend my position. Over the next couple of weeks I continued emailing members of the board that were receptive to dialogue and trying to convince them of my view. Seeing no further mention of the issue in the September, October and November/December issues, I thought that cooler heads and perhaps some common sense was being used. I was wrong as evidenced by the 2007 rules posted on the IHMSA.org website as of January 24, 2007.

I have questioned the Board of Directors' ability to make or change rules at will and whether or not the membership could or would have any say. I was shocked to learn the by-laws of this organization make no requirement to inform or notify the membership of an impending change or vote. Nor do they require the board to present any issue to the delegates for vote during the annual business meeting. The Board of Directors is the steward of the organization and as such is to make decisions, rules and policy to guide the organization into the future. It is my belief that this decision was based on personal conflicts and not in the best interest of the membership or the future of our sport.

During the annual business meeting a heated discussion occurred regarding the configuration of foreends on the Unlimited category firearms. This discussion was between the board, specifically Rob Able and member Steven Byers. I have confirmed from a number of attendees that Mr. Able stated that he would write a rule then and there that would outlaw Mr. Byers' Unlimited stock. Mr. Able, I urge you to seriously consider your role within the organization. As a member of the Board of Directors, you are charged with a leadership role, this hardly sounds like the statement from a leader of an international organization. I sincerely hope this statement has been misquoted by multiple people that were in attendance. If the quote is accurate, it speaks volumes regarding your ability to hold a leadership role as well as a lack of consideration for the membership as a whole. At the very least a personal and public apology would be appropriate. To the rest of the board members, why was this tolerated?

The following excerpts are from the IHMSA.org website. I cut / pasted this information from the website on 1/24/07 at approximately 11am EST.

From the 2007 Rules (text link)

9. Revolvers and handguns with magazines may be loaded and fired single-shot.

10. Stocks and fore ends shall be generally traditional in design. Custom stocks and fore ends are allowed provided they are not configured in such a way to act as a shooting aid.

A. The greatest dimension, excluding length, of a fore end shall not exceed 2-1/2in, measured 3in (or beyond) in front of the trigger guard.

B. Designs that allow grasping the fore end at an angle greater than 60 degrees from the bore line are not allowed.

C. Adjustable stocks are allowed, provided the adjusted configuration meets all other IHMSA rules.

From the Rules (icon link)

9. Revolvers and handguns with magazines may be loaded and fired single-shot.

10. Stocks and fore ends shall be generally traditional in design and shall meet all criteria of the US Tobacco and Firearms regulations for a handgun fore end. Custom stocks and fore ends are allowed provided they are not configured in such a way to act as a shooting aid.

A. Custom stocks and fore ends are allowed provided they are not configured in such a way to act as a shooting aid (i.e. specifically contoured to fit body anatomy).

B. Designs that allow grasping the fore end at an angle greater than 60 degrees from the bore line are not allowed.

C. Adjustable stocks are allowed, provided the adjusted configuration meets all other IHMSA rules.

I am not going to speculate as to why there are two different copies of the rules available on the website. Please note this is not the only discrepancy that I found between the two documents. In any event, both versions of the rule change are vague enough and wide open enough to allow an interpretation that could disqualify ANY AND EVERY Unlimited category pistol that is currently being shot in competition. Please also note in the 2006 IHMSA rulebook, Section VI.B.8 states that any production gun qualifies to be used in the Unlimited categories. The forearm styles/designs that can be ordered from the factory (e.g. offerings from MOA and BF) could now be illegal if this rule is allowed to continue and be implemented.

We the membership cannot allow this rule to proceed nor allow the Board of Directors to continue operating without clear and concise communications with the membership for input. Having said that I have drafted the following revision to the by-laws requiring that the Board of Directors communicate all rule changes that pertain to equipment and competition with the membership and allow time for the membership to have a voice.

At present there are two proposed revisions to the IHMSA by-laws that are to be decided by a referendum vote. Neither of which addresses the issue that I am presenting. Per the official copy of the by-laws received from Rob Able via email attachment on September 23rd, 2006 there is no provision that requires explicit written notice to the membership of any pending proposal.

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posals or vote regarding the rules for competition. The only item that addresses required communication with the membership is Article X, Meetings, Section 2. Current wording...

**Section 2.** Written notices of motion for the annual business meeting must be submitted to the Secretary/Treasurer of the corporation not less than sixty days prior to the annual business meeting which, in turn, shall be communicated to the membership via the pages of the edition of the *IHMSA News* distributed at least thirty days prior to the annual business meeting.

Proposed wording...

**Section 2.** Written notices of motion for the annual business meeting must be submitted to the Secretary/Treasurer of the corporation not less than 120 days prior to the annual business meeting which, in turn, shall be communicated to the membership via the pages of the *IHMSA News* and shall be printed and distributed in at least 2 sequential issues prior to the annual business meeting.

Rational...

To ensure the ability of the membership to convey their desires / will to the designated delegates there needs to be sufficient time for the membership to receive this information. Since the *IHMSA News* is distributed primarily via bulk/3rd class US Mail, there quite often can be up to a 30 or more day lag from distribution to receipt by the membership. Additionally, members outside the U.S. may not receive their copies for 60 or more days. Changing the timing for the written notices of motion will allow the membership to at least have 30 days to consider any pending motions.

In addition I propose a change to Article XIV, Rules, Section 1.

Current wording...

**Section 1.** All competitions sanctioned by the corporation will be governed by the official rules adopted, and from time to time amended, by the Board of Directors. In cases of conflict between these bylaws and the rules adopted by the Board of directors, the bylaws shall prevail.

Proposed addition...

**Section 2.** If the Board deems a change to the rules is necessary and said change will not be considered at the annual business meeting, it must be submitted to and published in at least 2 consecutive issues of the *IHMSA News* in its final wording and form prior to a vote.

Rational...

This provides a clear method of communication with the membership of proposed revisions to the rules that we must all comply with. This also allows the membership the ability to provide input as to the general worth and value of any proposed change.

Lastly it gives the membership a form of 'checks and balances' to help prevent the Board of directors from abusing the power which it has been entrusted to it.

I ask each of you as members of IHMSA to communicate with your state and regional director in addition to the other members of the Board of Directors your desires and will in this matter and all future matters.

"We had several shooters with forends that were to say the least not what we want to see, so watch for a rule to cover forends by October."

My concern is that each of you as a member Board of Directors is considering a change to the IHMSA rules that will either restrict or control the configuration of Unlimited category stocks. Specifically the shape of the forend of a stock that facilitates shooting from the prone position by being of sufficient dimension to rest on the back of the hand (which is in-turn resting on the ground) as opposed to 'bridging' the hand and using a more 'conventional' stock design. I emailed Mr. Stimson regarding this statement to ensure the topic and to verify to whom the 'we' is referencing.

I am aware of the initial concerns of legality (with regard to federal statutes) stemming from the design of a stock that was shot at the 2004 Internationals in TUSCO. It is my understanding that the Board of Directors has been given a report that gives criteria as to what is legal and what is not. I am also aware that the original stock in question has been redesigned to comply with the findings of legality previously submitted to the Board of Directors. From what I have seen, this has inspired a number of shooters to modify their stocks to a similar configuration. Whether it's a training regimen, techniques or equipment used, it is the nature of all sports to in some way emulate those who have success. It is also in the nature of sports for some competitors to 'cry foul' when those who are having success are doing so by a method that is 'out of the norm'.

I have read the response from Blair Hamilton to the members of Michigan who had requested a ruling. He wrote, "These are my opinions... nothing official yet. When it comes to rules and handguns, I am a traditionalist. And as such, I am opposed to the modification indicated because it is specifically designed to facilitate a particular

stance / hold... as opposed to designing the stance / hold to facilitate the handgun. In the past, the Board has ruled that a pointed fore end on a gun jammed into the back of the calf is essentially an artificial support. I see the referenced fore end falling into a similar category. The "resting on the hand" hold is still achievable with a traditional fore end by elevating the back of the hand supported on one's finger tips... this hold is fairly prevalent among the prone shooters."

While I respect his opinion, I must offer the following...

It is my position, shared by many of my fellow members, that the stocks on Unlimited category firearms should be able to be modified /designed to facilitate the prone (or any other freestyle) position. The current 2006 rulebook clearly states that any freestyle position is 'any safe shooting position without artificial support. The handgun may only come in contact with the competitor's body, clothing and / or blast shield.' It further gives clear concise definition as to what is considered an artificial support. (Please reference 2006 IHMSA Rules Section V.A.2 and 3) Using the above

existing rules, the Unlimited stocks in question are clearly within the criteria established by them.

All high rise mounts, mid-rise mounts and 'taco hold' sight setups are all well known examples of where a shooter has come up with a method of 'designing a gun' to facilitate a shooting position. Making a scope mount so that it is easier to hold and shoot accurately is no different than making a stock that is better suited for shooting prone.

'The spirit of the rules' is a phrase that seems to be uttered when it's convenient to use in arguing ones position. The spirit of the rules has a different meaning to each of us, and it's an opinion, it's not a rule. I am confident that each of you can see past the opinions and see the fact that there is no rule necessary to regulate the configuration of stock designs in the Unlimited categories. The current rules already address the issue.

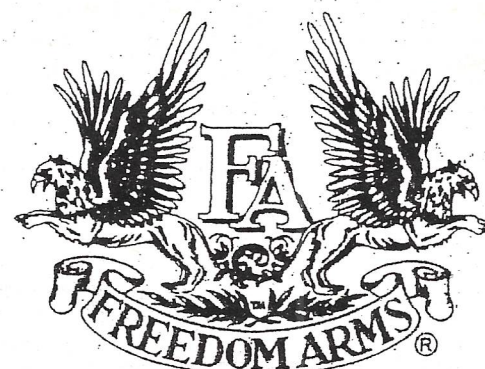
It's not a stock that will win a match; it is the competitor that is doing the shooting. I thank each of you for your time.

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
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
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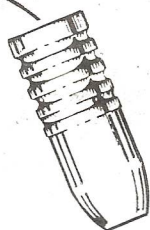

the name indicates, it was a 223 with the neck expanded to 30 caliber. It had a very tiny shoulder to headspace on and was often loaded with a 190 grain Hornady bullet. Velocity was around 1500 fps. RCBS made the dies and called it the 30 Silhouette. It actually worked fairly well but still had problems taking the rams from time to time.

The 30-30 was also somewhat popular in the Contender because heavy 30 caliber bullets could be used and it was widely available. However, if loaded to the top with powder, recoil was a big issue. If loading density was reduced, accuracy suffered significantly.

The 7 TCU when introduced, became a favorite almost immediately. Velocities of 1700-1900 fps with a 140 grain bullet were common. It was also very accurate, recoil was modest, and the rams were going over some what better than before when being hit by those relatively fast bullets. However, even it had reliability problems from time to time on those early targets.

Then there was the 7 International Rimmed (7R). This was a 30-30 case necked down to 7mm with a sharp shoulder angle. In fact it was a predecessor and twin to the later 7X30 Waters. The concept for the case was ideal i.e. take a commonly available case with lots of volume and neck it down. It was thought because of the larger case capacity that faster velocities would result and the rams would never be able to resist the impact. Indeed the silhouette gun writers of the time were enthusiastically reporting velocities over 2000 fps with 140's routinely and occasionally touching 2100 fps.

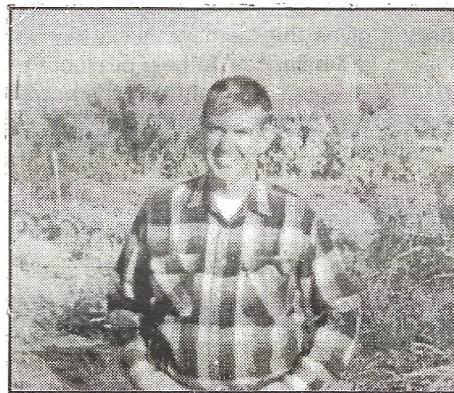
Execution into practice was a disaster however. Rather than offer new custom barrels for sale to the members, the people running IHMSA at the time sold TC factory fourteen inch 7 TCU barrels that were improperly rechambered into 7 International Rimmed. Brass life was zero. In the barrel that I had, a huge bulge in the case just above the rim appeared after only one firing. The bulge then prevented the case from being reinserted into the camber, and because of its location, it was impossible to iron out with the sizer die. Then the people in charge said use 375 brass instead of 30-

30 brass. They said that the 375 stuff was much stronger and wouldn't bulge. I think I got 2 firings out of a case before the bulge popped out and the case had to be discarded. The only way around the situation was to load the case at or below 7 TCU velocities. But what was the point of that? Why not just use a 7 TCU to begin with?

Shooters were so disgusted with the situation that the cartridge died immediately which was unfortunate as it had real potential. All it needed was a good barrel. As mentioned, it eventually came back in another version as the 7X30 Waters and was promoted as a lever gun cartridge by one of the big ammo makers.

The dissatisfaction with the guns and cartridges for silhouette probably reached a high point at the 79 Internationals. The rams were particularly sticky that year, even when hit with Nosler Partition bullets out of the 7 TCUs. Things then got ridiculous as shooters tried to come up with something/anything that would give near 100% knock-down. There is even a documented story about one silhouette shooter who being frustrated with the situation of the time started using a 14" TC barrel chambered in 45-70. He would drill out the nose of 350 grain cast bullets, and then pack the cavity full of Bulseye powder and glue in a pistol primer on top. Every hit must have been pretty spectacular and it drove match directors crazy. Obviously, the Contender and its associated cartridges weren't making the grade against the home made targets.

Then there was the XP school of thought. At the time, Remington's XP-100 was chambered by the factory in only one cartridge - the little 221 fireball. It also had this little short 10" barrel. Why? No one seems to know. Some silhouette shooters tried using the XP as it came from the factory by loading up the Fireball to the max with the heaviest 22 bullets that they could find. Now and then it might work but obviously most of the time it didn't. Then the guys with more money than most would buy a XP Fireball and hang a 15 inch barrel on it chambered in 308. If you weren't using 200 grain bullets in your 308 XP you were considered a whimp. The XP 308's definitely did the job of taking the rams down and they had the



accuracy, but they were comparatively expensive and recoil was not for the faint of heart or of stature.

The 7 BR then came on the scene in 1980 along with a factory XP chambered specifically for it. The combo blew up a storm of excitement throughout the silhouette world. Everyone knew that an XP would shoot and now here was a cartridge that was neither too small, or too big, and like Goldilock's porridge, was just right. Reviews of the gun and cartridge were extremely complimentary. "Shoots like a fury" they said.

However, there was a fly in the ointment. No, on further thought, it was more like a turkey buzzard in the ointment. There was no brass available!

Why Remington chose to produce a gun but not the brass is a total mystery. Evidently, at the time, they also had absolutely no intention of doing so either. What they did do though was to make available 7 BR "parent brass". These were "blank" cases that could be reformed by the reloader into 7 BR cases. To do so, a set of four custom dies was required which cost \$100 - which was big money back then and it ain't hay now either. Trimming and reaming of the reformed cases was also part of the equation. Making just 50 cases took several hours and that really turned people off - big time. Adding insult to injury, these "parent" cases were also hard to find.

That brings us finally to the 7 IHMSA / 7 International X. The basic idea here was to take the 7 BR XP-100 and rechamber it into a cartridge that was easy to make and that would do the job in taking down any home made silhouette target anywhere. Actually, the 7 IHMSA was part of a family of IHMSA cartridges designed by Elgin Gates that ran from 25 to I believe 35 caliber. They were all based on the 300 Savage which was probably the most highly regarded medium capacity 30 caliber case before the advent of the 308 Winchester.

However, it seems that nothing is easy when it comes to execution. The 7 IHMSA as originally designed had too much body taper to lend itself to being rechambered in a 7 BR barrel. Consequently, an almost identical cartridge but with less body taper

was put together for that purpose and called the 7 International X. Unfortunately the "big guns" writing in "The Silhouette" newspaper would refer to both cartridges as the 7 IHMSA and caused all kinds of confusion among the shooters.

Unlike the 7 BR, making 7 IHMSA brass is a piece of cake. All you have to do is very lightly lube the shoulder of the 300 Savage and run it into a small reforming die which changes the shoulder angle from 30 degrees to 40 degrees. Then you run it into the full length sizing die and that's it. People loved it. My XP 7 International X would drive a Hornady 139 at 2100 fps + and still be loafing along. Getting more velocity was very easy but mostly unnecessary. If a club's targets had a reputation for being sticky, you could easily drive 160's at the same comfortable velocity. If a Speer 160 (very strong bullet of the time) didn't take it, something was very wrong. The XP 7 IHMSA/7 International X became THE gun & cartridge to have. You saw them everywhere. Headquarters even made a deal with Federal Cartridge to make a run of special brass with a tiny ram stamped on the head of the case. (BTW, those cases have become collector items these days.)

However, as they say, things change. Remington finally wised up by the mid 80's and started making 7 BR brass. We also got our act together in IHMSA and mandated standardized targets and rails. Commercially made T-1 targets slowly became the norm and the scrap steel junkers faded away. The 7 IHMSA began to be regarded as being too much gun and the 7 BR as being something that was easier to shoot and just as accurate. Eventually, even the 7 BR would be regarded as being too much gun as the trend went to the 6.5s, with muzzle brakes no less. In early IHMSA days, it was a point of pride to shoot a heavy recoiling gun well. Today, recoil is recognized for what it is - a distraction to better shooting.

The 7 IHMSA does still live on after a fashion -- in the world of rifle silhouette. There are those rifle shooters who want a cartridge with less recoil than the 308s and 7-08s that are often used in that sport. The 7 IHMSA fits that bill nicely. In fact I own a rifle chambered in it as well that I use for general hunting purposes. In fact it may actually be one of the very first rifles to be chambered in 7 IHMSA if not the first. I was so impressed when I got my XP 7 IHMSA/International X in the early 80's I had a custom rifle built on a SAKO action for it. It has served me well ever since. Deadly accurate, medium recoil, and just plain fun to shoot. I think that says it all about this historic cartridge. Good luck and good shooting.

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# Shooting with the Winners

## Guns of the 2006 Internationals

Welcome to another analysis of the relative competitiveness of the guns of the recent Internationals. This time I've broken the analysis up into two parts-the cartridges will be analyzed in my next article.

Remember, there are several reasons you should be cautious in interpreting these results. First, the analysis does not take into account the ability of the shooter. (You might want to take a look at the match results to see who was the champion for each category. Good shooters can do well with almost any gun!) Secondly, the analyses include the same guns being shot in several categories. Thirdly, I've only identified guns

that were shot more than two times for each category analyzed. This is just for completeness-the CI is meaningless for small samples. Be warned that the result of even as many as five guns is just about as valid as the size of a five-shot group! Just remember when perusing the charts to look at how many guns were included in the result. (The total number of each gun is included on the charts and the winner indicated with an \*.) Ten would be a nice number to achieve-but not usually possible with the size of the match. I have combined categories as much as possible to improve the statistics. When this is done different cutoffs may be used for each category and this is indicated on

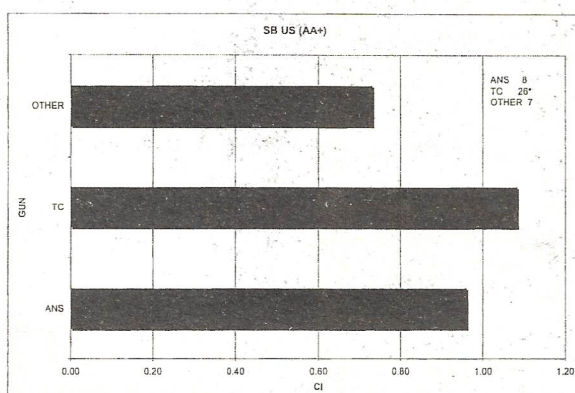
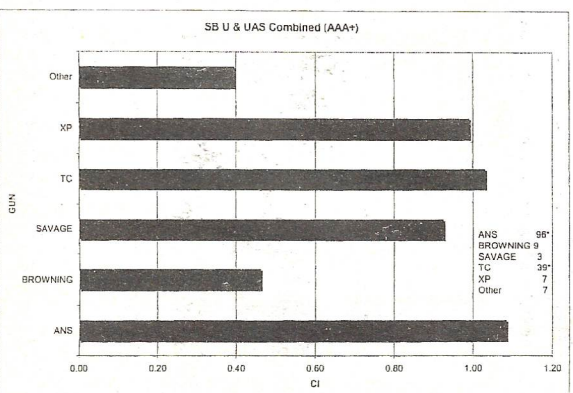
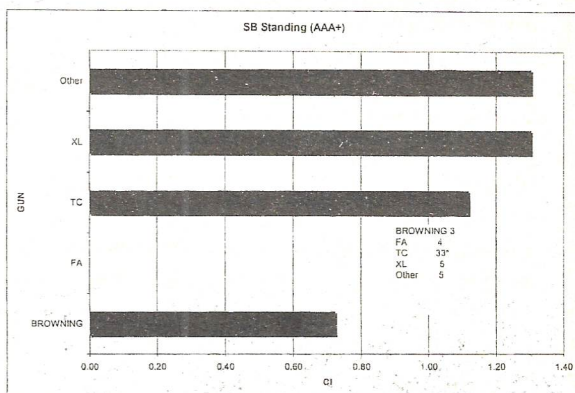
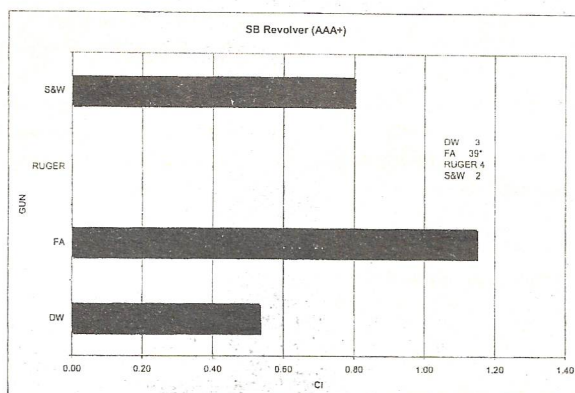
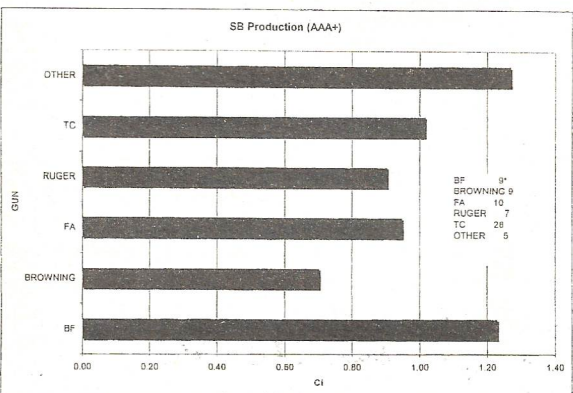
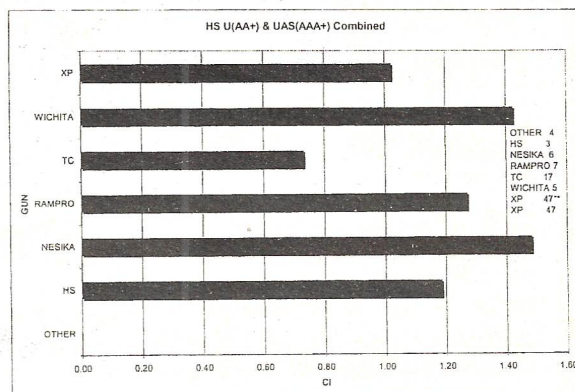
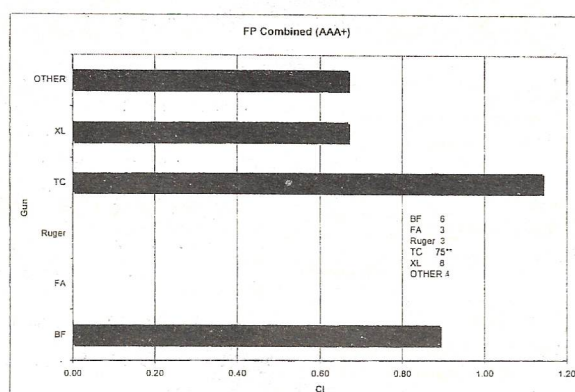
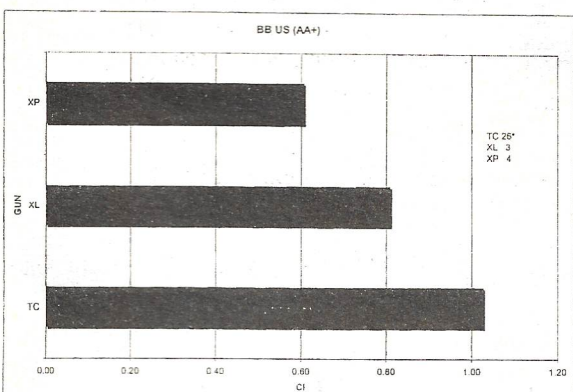
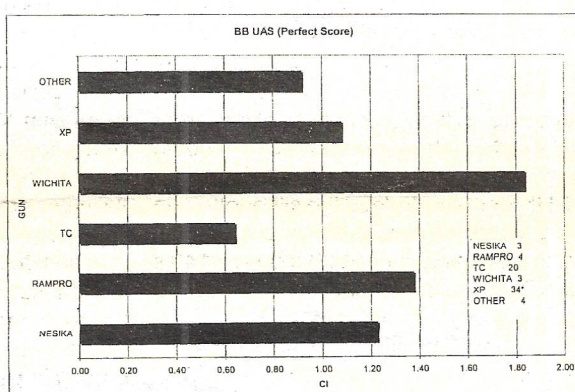
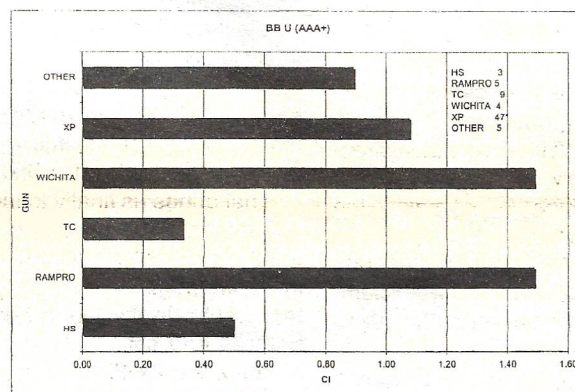
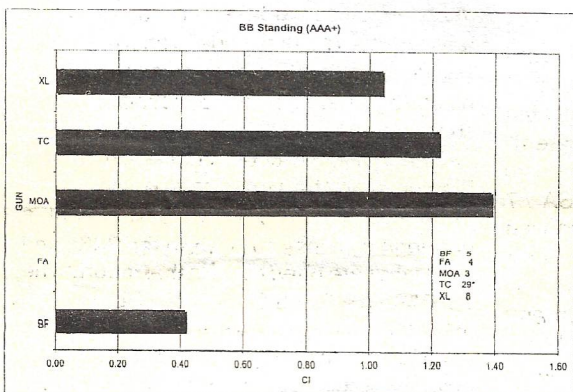
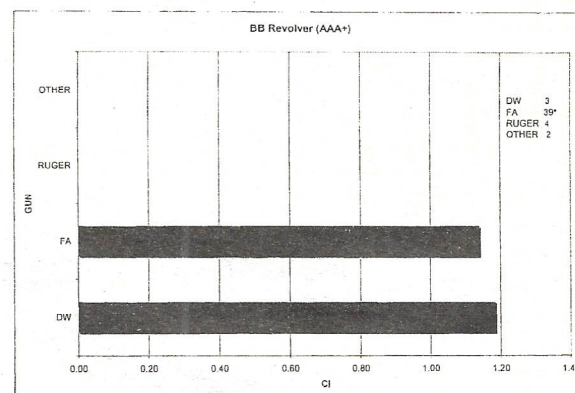
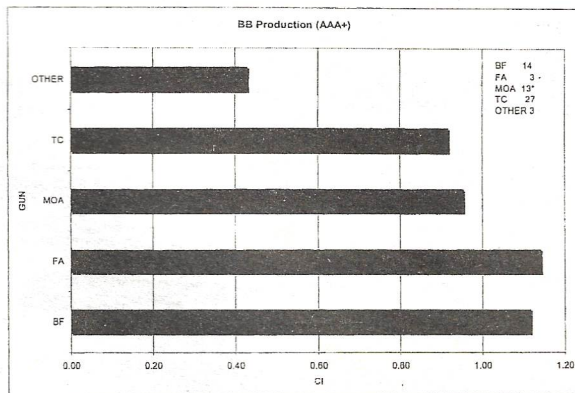
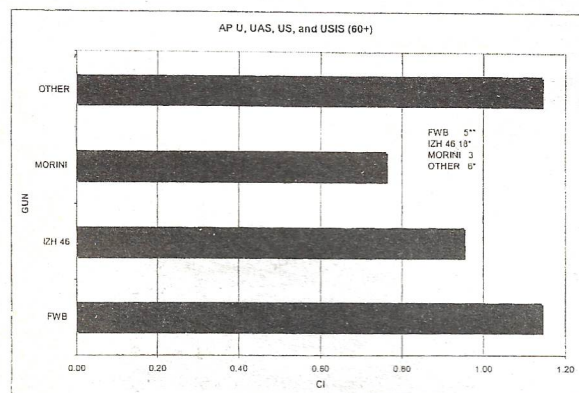
the chart. I've also included a new cutoff for BB UAS-Perfect Score-since so many of the competitors shoot 80x80s.

A Competitive Index (CI) is calculated for each brand of gun in each category. The CI is the ratio of the percentage of a given gun that makes or exceeds a certain score ("cutoff" score) divided by the percentage of all guns that achieved that score. So as an example let's say that for Big Bore (BB) Unlimited (U) the TT ("TUSCO Twanger") is used by a total of 5 shooters and 4 of these shooters shoot a least a score of 66 (AAA+)-80%. Overall, there are 30 shooters out of 50 competitors total in the U category that have shot 66 or above-that's

60%. The Competitive Index is just 80% divided by 60% or 1.33. A CI of 1 is average. (I wouldn't run right out and buy a Twanger, however, since the sample is too small to be meaningful!) A higher CI means the gun COULD, MIGHT, MAYBE be more competitive-remember, look at the numbers!

Please note the "Other" category. The guns in this category include those, which were used only once or twice. Note that the winner could well be from the "Other" category.

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# World Records

Over the past several months a couple of folks have asked if we could incorporate NRA records in our World Record program. Well, it is quite difficult to find people in IHMSA with all of our resources. Trying to find NRA folks well, we just can't do it. I belong to three drag racing sanctioning bodies and they all have their own record programs. I would like to mention one NRA record set by Lon Pennington at the "89" NRA Nationals in Ojai, CA. Lon shot a 308X320 Big Bore which is identical to our Big Bore discipline. Then Lon repeated his 308X320 in 2006 at the NRA Nationals in Raton, NM, as senior. Is that some shooting or what! Congratulations Lon.

Jim Fields Oklahoma's state director was on fire in 2006. Jim is not only one of the hardest workers in IHMSA he is also one of it's best shooters. Jim started a string of UAS-AIR 40's Nov. 11, 2003 without a miss through Jan. 23 rd, 2007 (and counting). This string includes three Internationals (80 round), three regional championships (60 round) and three state championships (60 round). The 60's were counted as 40 round, and the 80's were counted as two forty's. That is 2,820 shots without a miss (and counting). Jim had a total of 70 (seventy) 40's in-a-row in 2006; 23 AIR, .22 rimfire 22; Big Bore 15; Half-Scale Big Bore 10. Is that a bunch of 40's in-a-row or what! (In one year). He has the most .22 rimfire 40's in one year with 22 including Fifth-Scale, he shot five 40's in one match and four 80's at the 2006 Internationals in TUSCO. What an inspiration for us all. Congratulations Jim.

Next we have Jim Harris our Half-Scale records director. Jim has been a fantastic shooter for years and now a world record holder. Jim has signed up more IHMSA members than anyone I know ( Steve Ware and myself may be close). Jim has a passion for shooting silhouettes like none I have ever seen. He has had his share (or more than his share) of controversy but has never

stopped trying his hardest to get IHMSA to grow. Jim is charismatic, a great communicator and a good guy. I always enjoy visiting with him. Jim set the 60 round Fifth-Scale aggregate record at 117X120 and Fifth-Scale Open Sights record at 58X60. Congratulations Jim. I asked Steve Ware to write up a bio for Jim a while back and it should be in this issue.

Rich Hawkins our Small Bore records director was going through his old score cards and found that in 2002 at the Internationals in TUSCO he shot a Small Bore 3 gun Aggregate of 215X240 which ties J.R. Wythe's record, during that same match he shot a 293X320 four gun aggregate which is a record as well. Congratulations Rich, you are one heck of a shooter. You are admired by many including and especially myself.

Please IHMSA members contact HQ and order promo CD's and take them to the range with you to give to other members who have friends, to gun show/stores. A little effort by a bunch of us can make a BIG difference. Shoot soon, safe, often and most of all have fun.

# Jim Harris - Profile of a World Record Holder

Richard Kiesov contacted me several weeks ago and asked if I would write a profile of my good friend, Jim (Gun Zorro or simply GZ) Harris, for the *IHMSA News*. I immediately agreed. While many have been in the game longer than GZ, few have had the impact he has made on the game. Jim is certainly one of those fellows who lives on the edge and wants to find the limits of his ability. That edgy lifestyle has made his career somewhat of a rollercoaster ride of highs and lows; the lowest of the lows being a one year suspension from the sport following a rather public and intense debate at an International Championship with IHMSA executives. He was reinstated after the suspension and has gone on to hold both offices and records within IHMSA. Jim is also a firm believer of supporting all shooting sports hence he regularly shoots NRA silhouettes also.

Jim started shooting handgun silhouette at the Los Angeles Silhouette Club (LASC) in July 1989. GZ had spent several years of intense, but informal, long distance handgun shooting at water-filled containers in the desert preceding his decision to take up formal competition. He had already acquired a TC in 30-30 and .223, a Dan

Wesson in .357 Super Mag, and a 10" Ruger 10-22 before being introduced to organized silhouette. So, he had a basic startup collection of handguns, and was also an experienced handloader and bullet caster at that time.

GZ joined IHMSA in 1992 and shot his first large IHMSA Regional match in Las Vegas in 1994. He attended his first Internationals in Ft. Stockton in 1995 while running for IHMSA President. He was soundly defeated by the way. He won his first International Championship the following year at Ft. Stockton in Big Bore Unlimited Standing.

Jim earned the nickname "Gun Zorro" in 1996 at the second annual Cholla Challenge in Yuma, Arizona where he swept virtually all categories in the 500 meter handgun/rifle competition. The epithet later came to signify defiance of injustice and willingness to face-down opposition in a just cause (at least in his mind). Others might debate that, but that is one of the reasons for his rollercoaster career in IHMSA.

Jim won his first NRA National Championship at Puyallup, WA in Small Bore Unlimited in 1996.

GZ served in the position of IHMSA California State Director from 1999 through

2006 and has been a match director at LASC on several occasions as well as its president for two terms.

Jim is a prolific silhouette writer having been published in the *IHMSA News*, American Handgunner, and the third edition of the Vihtavuori Reloading Manual to name but a few. He was also the owner and publisher of the now defunct but always provocative National Silhouette Report from 1995 to 2003. The NSR was famous for barbed personality profiles and editorials.

Jim's contributions to the sport include a successful campaign to have the 25-20 adopted for use in Field Pistol, campaigning for the adoption of Unlimited Half-Scale and now maintaining the Half-Scale records program, experimenting with numerous cartridges and chamberings including an extensive evaluation of several 6.5mm chamberings, the creation of a massive load development database that he shares with shooters, and extensive load testing.

He has been an activist for change in the sport, especially greater transparency in and involvement of members in IHMSA elections and administration, simplification of our rules and inclusion of scopes.

GZ is the holder of the Unlimited Standing world record in 500 meter handgun

(17x40), and has held the record for the career number of perfect Half-Scale scores. As a member of the notorious "Pig Pounders" team at the NRA Nationals, he helped set a Half-Scale national record for an 80-round match with Marty Rossetti and Richard Mishler, 235x240.

On a personal note, I have used Jim as a resource on many projects including my last, the 6.5mm Lapua BR Nesika Bay switch sight Unlimited pistol. Jim has always been there to give suggestions and advise. Love him or hate him, it is difficult if not impossible to admit that Jim has been and continues to be an avid supporter of the sport of handgun silhouette, an explorer of the outer limits of handgun accuracy, and most of all friend to many who know him.

## Air Records

Greetings once again fellow air pistol shooters. I heard from quite a few of you in the last couple of weeks so I guess the AIR game must be up and going all around the country.

First up this month is Dave Stone. Dave is a senior shooter out in Oklahoma. In January, Dave shot a 32-USIS with his IZH landing him in that club and he also turned in a 36-P, 27-S and a 37-U for a 101 3-gun score. Nice work Dave.

Now I also heard from Jim Fields who happens to be the match director at the Oklahoma City Gun Club where Dave shot these scores. Jim has put in 24 years as the match director out there in both SB and BB, and started directing AIR matches back in November of 2003. Since that match, Jim has not missed a single UAS target with his Leupold topped Morini 16E2. He has accumulated some 2,820 targets in a row spanning over 3 years, 3 internationals, and 3 state matches. Jim also pointed out that he turned 70 last year and had a total of 70 40x40's in AIR, Small Bore and Big Bore. I guess he will have to go for 71 this year!

Match director Dan Harder up in Minnesota sent me some good scores. Dan himself turned in a P-39, S-25, and a U-40 for a fine 104 3-gun. An interesting note here is that that P-39 ended a string of 10 consecutive production 40's. My hat's off to you Dan. In the same match Steve Martens turned in a S-33 and a USIS-32 to land in the +60 club again this year. Marcus McCleery also did well with a US-37 and a USIS-36 landing himself over 35 and over 32 clubs respectively.

Had a few local shooters make their way into the record clubs this month as well. Rich Hawkins turned in a S-29, U-37, and a US-35. This gives him a 101 3-gun as well as 60+, US+35 and S+28 clubs. Mike Slusher shot a USIS-34 to get into the over 32 club. Ed Ledbetter had a good day back in December with one of the new Crosman 2300S pistols. He shot a P-40 and a S-26,

and then turned in a U-40 for a nice 106 3-gun. Ed's score doesn't show up below since it was in 2006, but it is listed in the permanent records. Ed has turned in a couple of production 40's with the new Crosman in as many outings. Now, Ed can shoot any gun well, but I think this proves that the 2300S is a viable option to the Daisy.

The new 140 club is in effect for AIR as of January 1, 2007. This will be a 4-gun aggregate that must include a Standing score, and cannot include a UAS entry. I had a good example of this. I shot a P-35, S-30, U-40, and US-38 for a 143 Aggregate. Unfortunately, I shot this score in the end of December so it doesn't count!

## Big Bore Records

The year has come to an end and unless there are some last minute entries, the standings are final. The trophies for the winner in each category are being made and will be sent out as soon as they are finished.

Joe Cullison posted the last score for the year sending in a S-31, P-40, U-40 and a US-39. These scores moved Joe up in the 4-gun agg to a 150 and in the US category to tie Jeff Hunt for the top spot. Not too bad for a December match.

The winner in the Standing 30+ category is Lon Pennington shooting a 54X60 which converts to a 36.

The winner of the Unlimited Standing 35+ category is Jeff Hunt shooting 39x40 (twice).

The winner of the Standing agg 60+ category is Jeff Hunt shooting a 73 of a possible 80.

The winner of the Presidents 100 club (3-gun agg) is Lon Pennington by shooting a 54x60 in standing, a 60x60 in Revolver and a 60x60 in Production for a converted 3-gun score of 116. A 116 is one point from tying the world record. There have been three 116 3-gun aggregate scores in the past two years. Joe Cullison shot two of them in 2005.

The winner of the Presidents 140 club (4-gun agg) is also Lon Pennington. Lon added an Unlimited score of 59x60 to his 3-gun agg for a converted 155 out of a possible 160. His actual total was a BB 60 round record at 233x240.

The winner of the all around trophy goes to the person that I felt really stepped up and shot above their normal level with at

least one exceptional performance. Joe Cullison placed well in all 5 categories but never really shot exceptional. Rich Hawkins made all 5 categories but he took plenty of trophies home from the Internationals. For this year I have chosen John Zumwalt as the IHMSA "All Around Big Bore Shooter" John made all 5 categories and set personal bests in US with a 58x60 (38 converted) and in the 3-gun agg with a score of 110 (in a different match). John shot a standing agg of 65x80 and a 4-gun total of 141.

The final State totals for this year are: OH-17, OR-15, CA-10, NC-9, IN-5, CO-4, WI-4, SC-3, TX-3, MI-3, AZ-2, IA-2, NV-2, MN-1

It looks like Ohio is the State powerhouse this year getting contributing scores from the most different people in any state. Well done Ohio. You better keep shooting well; we are coming after you in 2007.

Each person can make each category one time for their state, for a maximum of 5 per person. Help your state out and send in those scores.

**Teaser:** A 35 will not win the Standing 30+ in 2007, multiple scores over 110 and 150 have already been sent in. One state already has 9 entries in to the unofficial state race. A full report will be in the next issue.

Let's all shoot some great scores and please do your best to bring at least one friend or acquaintance to every match.

Great shooting to everyone, and thank you to all of the people that sent in entries for this year. I hope many more shooters make it in 2007. Shoot well and shoot often.

## Match Publication Policy

As we continually have new match directors, following is the IHMSA News' policy on publication of state, regional, and "specialty" match notices and match results.

Any IHMSA sanctioned club in good standing may publish a notice of their club's state or regional championship match at no charge for three months. State match notices are limited to 2 1/4 "x5". Regional match notices are limited to 4 3/4 "x5". If a club is holding a "specialty" match and that match does not replace one of these championships, the *IHMSA News* will publish a 2 1/4 "x5" notice at no charge one time. These notices will run in Section B only. The club may publish additional notices of the same size for \$45 per issue. Ads must be prepaid before printing. All payments are to be sent to IHMSA HQ, P.O. Box 901120, Sandy, UT. The club may specify whether the paid notice is published in Section A or B.

State match results can list both first and second place finishes. Regional match results can list first, second, and third place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a state championship may publish first and second place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a regional championship may publish first, second, and third place finishes. All other match results wherein the total number of handgun silhouette entries exceeds 11 (including all IHMSA, NRA & non-member guests) can list only the first place finish. Matches with less than 11 total handgun entries as defined above can list all IHMSA handgun entrants and their place. Regardless of the above, all 40's, 60's, and 80's (depending on the number of rounds fired at the match) can be published from ANY IHMSA match.

An IHMSA club holding a dual sanctioned (IHMSA/NRA) match may submit a match report for publication in the *IHMSA News* containing both IHMSA and NRA results. The number of published NRA results may not exceed the number of published IHMSA results. **Publication is limited to IHMSA sanctioned handgun disciplines only.**

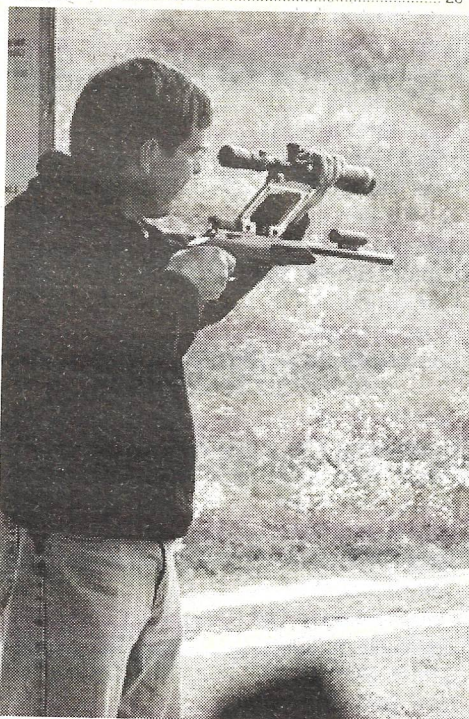

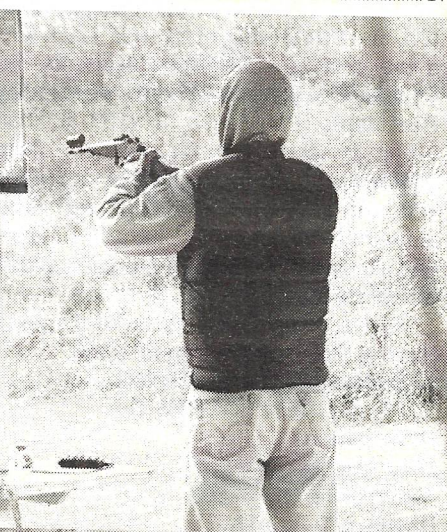

A shooter doesn't realize how much abuse their handguns receive after a few seasons of shooting. My BF has been around since 1994. I finally came to the conclusion that it might need to be re-barreled when I could literally put a bullet in the bar-





rel and then chamber a case. I got to figuring it up. I had used it to develop load data for the Sierra Reloading Manual, shot 11 or 12 Internationals with it as both a full size and Half-Scale UAS gun, let other people shoot it as a UAS gun at the Internationals several times also. Then there are the 11 or 12 years of local, state, and regional matches. I decided it was time that it needed a new barrel, so I spoke to Eben Brown at the SHOT Show about re-barreling it. When I returned, I boxed it up and sent it to him to get a new barrel on it. I had noticed that my accuracy didn't seem to be quite as good on shoot off targets as it used to be but it still shot well enough to shoot 80s with. Unfortunately, part of it may be that I'm not as steady as I was a few years ago either. If you notice some of your accuracy is falling off though, try to get a rough estimate of how many rounds you have thru it. That may have a bearing on it. If you are really looking for a match to find out just how good a shooter you are, you should try out the Cold Turkey Shoot Handgun match, that will be put on by Richard Mertz (MOA) in Sundance, Wyoming. It will be held June 14-16 and you will shoot at 500-750 and 1000 yards. John and Jack Wade will be holding our first match of the year of February 24 come rain, snow or sleet and the second match will be March 24. The way it has been this year, there could be snow or sleet then also. We have had some interest in IHMSA here in Missouri this winter but unfortunately, most of them live on the opposite side of the state. Well, hope to see you at a match. Lets enjoy this year.

Accordingly, nominations are now sought for the position of Director, Region 7. Nominations are to be submitted to the Secretary/Treasurer on the nomination form provided no later than April 30, 2007.

Any member in good standing, who is a bona-fide resident for the Region for which they nominate, is eligible to contest the election. A bona-fide resident is someone who has resided in the particular Region for a period of not less than six months immediately prior to the election.
