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## The Right Tool for the Job

This project was born out of the 2006 West Coast Championship. I decided to shoot an Unlimited Any Sight One-Fifth Scale entry, and for some strange reason I was in "The Zone" that day. Every time the reticle lined up with the animal all was right with the world, and they dropped like flies. That was until the last bank of rams, and I missed one.

Afterwards, I spent quite a bit of time analyzing the shot and my performance and equipment. I felt I had shot as well as possible; in fact, it could have been an unusually good performance for me. I don't pretend to be in the same league as Scott Mann, Jim Harris, Eric King, or Ted Zysk when it comes to whacking little critters at great distances.

The Kevin Randolph mid-gripped Anschütz with a Mike Dewey trigger could not be blamed. I've had enough conversations with Dick Kreischer to know he has tested numerous Anschütz barrels that were all dead nuts accurate. And Kevin and Mike's work produced a pistol that is right on the money when it comes to accuracy. Lapua's Super Club ammunition has proven itself time and again in this pistol; so, it could not have been at fault. It all came down to one thing - the scope. I was using a well known scope that many IHMSA shooters have selected, and it has always performed well until the advent of "Little Critters". It was just not up to the performance standards needed when shooting One-Fifth Scale. So, it was off to the drawing board to see if I could find the ultimate scope for Unlimited One-Fifth Scale competition.

Several months after the West Coast Championship, Todd Spotti wrote an article concerning the Leupold Custom Shop. Todd had mentioned that the Custom Shop was doing innovative things such as custom reticles, finishes, and laser engraving.

Also, Leupold has had a special spot in my heart after I took a factory tour several years ago. First, it is an Oregon company with products made in the United States of America. I like that a lot. Second, it is celebrating its one-hundredth anniversary this year, and it remains a family owned company. Only one or two percent of all family owned companies in America can tout that they have survived as long as Leupold & Stevens. And, it continues to flourish and grow to boot.

Considering what Todd had written about Leupold's Custom Shop and its corporate history, I decided to contact Leupold to see if they could design the right tool for the job.

Quite a bit of time and discussion went into the final design. Some of the add-ons were purely cosmetic. Others were designed to wring out every ounce of the scope's potential on One-Fifth Scale animals. I also learned quite a bit in the process.

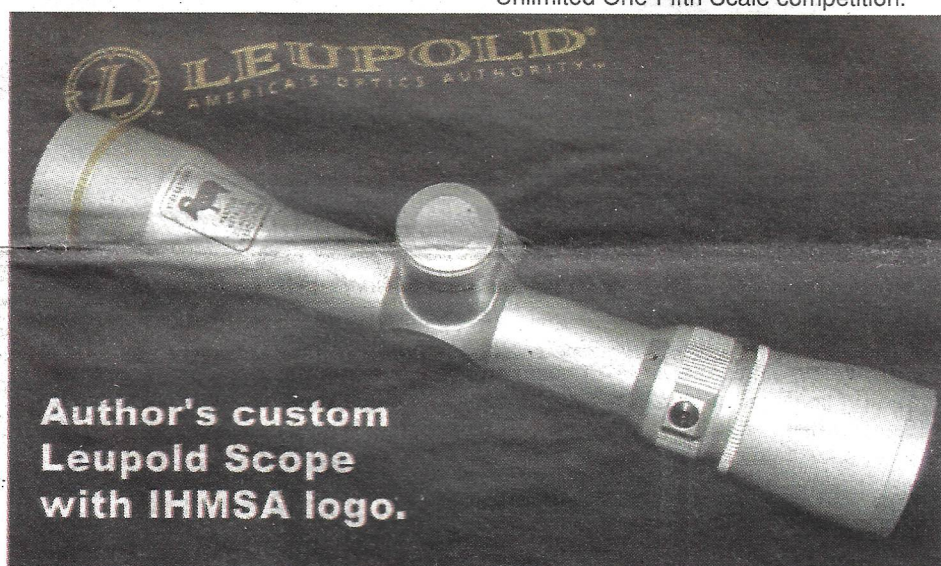
The first choice was the scope itself, and that was a no brainer. The only possible choice was a Leupold VX-III 2.5-8x32mm. It had proven itself in IHMSA competition for so many years that it wasn't funny. The Anschütz was a combination of stainless and blued finishes; so, I decided that silver would look best. Adding to the "for looks only" column, the folks at Leupold suggested laser engraving the IHMSA logo on the scope bell. That sounded too cool to

pass up.

Next, it was on to the "get 'er done" options. This was where a bit of investigation paid off. You can't have an adjustable parallax on a handgun scope. You have to live with what comes from the factory. I asked and was told that the factory standard on Leupold handgun scopes is a 90 yard parallax. But heck, that's almost to the ram line. Again, the folks at Leupold and I discussed the matter and came to the conclusion that a 60 yard parallax would be best for Small Bore. Leupold will set the parallax on any scope for a lousy \$14.99 (\$9.99 if done in conjunction with other Custom Shop work). That's a bargain; so, a 60 yard parallax was the first "get 'er done" option. I had a yellow Alumina Intensifier on my Big Bore/Half-Scale pistol, and that works so well in defining the target and differentiating the black target from the black reticle that one was added to this scope. One thing I did not get but plan to before summer is a bronze Intensifies. That should make the targets really pop in bright sunlight.

The next option was an experiment to see if it would even work. It was the addition of Leupold's new Custom Bullet Drop Compensation Dial. The theory behind this option is that Leupold calculates the necessary number of clicks at any predetermined distance you might want. In order to

## The New Silhouetter

Thinking Outside the Box

While banging a nail into a 2x4 with a

mon-  
k e y  
wrench is  
inefficient and  
unconventional,  
it may still be an ex-  
pedient way to get  
the job done. On the  
other hand; using a duct  
tape wrap to join an extra  
magazine to the one dangling from an M-  
16, although equally unconventional, is both  
efficient and effective. So, when you're  
"thinking outside the box," some ideas can  
be just good enough while others are great.  
Recently, I decided to do some of this so-  
called creative thinking with a  
muzzleloading rifle scope (presently, I do not  
own any muzzleloading firearms at all).

When I first became conscious of Nikon's  
Omega series scopes, the feature that im-

mediately caught my attention was what it  
calls its BDC-250 graduated reticle for in-  
stant points of aim. BDC stands for "Bullet  
Drop Compensating." There are a series  
of four small circles on the vertical axis be-  
low the crosshair intersection; after sight-  
ing-in at the closest distance using the  
crosshair, the circles below the crosshair are  
used for sighting out further. Each BDC  
circle represents a change of about 2 MOA  
at 100 yards. According to Nikon, with  
the proper muzzleloading load, the  
crosshair/circle system is accurate  
for 100 to 500 yards (in 100 yard  
increments) for "regular" loads  
and 200-600 yard increments for  
magnum loads.

Now any of us who have  
been shooting for a  
while know that  
the world  
is n't

quite that simple. Loads vary considerably,  
one from another, and we've all seen the  
often used caveat about how just because  
a load performs one way in a particular fire-  
arm, it may perform differently in yours.  
Nevertheless, the concept of multiple aim-  
ing points within the same scope tube is a  
well-known benefit, from simple double hori-  
zontal lines intersecting the vertical axis to  
multiple mildot hash marks. Changing  
points of hold in our silhouetting game is a  
legitimate alternate to using clicks and  
clearly identified reference points such as  
any mark on the vertical axis of a reticle  
take much of the guesswork out of the pro-  
cess.

So, after getting my hands on a Nikon  
Omega 3-9x40 scope, my first take on it for  
applications in our game is that there are  
nine points of aim. In addition to the  
crosshair, each of the four circles has a top  
and a bottom. While the full circle may be  
good enough for a muzzleloading rifle, each  
of the two intersections with the vertical axis  
can be used for handgun silhouetting. Re-  
quiring no more than four points of hold (I  
usually use fewer with flat shooting bullets),  
the utility of the Omega's BDC-250 reticle,  
although not initially designed for the pur-  
pose, would be more useful for a handgun  
silhouetter than for a smoke pole.

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## My Next Shot

Please read the News for the clarification of the Forend rule. Some questions so the Board thought it needed to clarify the rule book.

I will try again this year to get a forum started where anyone wanting to go to the Internationals can post what they would need in order to make it. You might want to share travel, motel, spotting and other items.

New this International will be Fifth-Scale .22. Anyone shooting this, needs to shoot tight groups, the shootoff chickens at 100 will be very small. There will be 2 banks at Ft. Stockton.

Again I will request you to bring out one new shooter this year. I have one lined up.

Read the News for the Incentive Program, it could mean a good prize for you. It will take place over six months of shooting.

## From the Editor's Desk

As I mentioned previously there were many items at the SHOT show that caught my attention and have nothing to do with shooting sillywhettes. One of those items is The PF-200 Power Flare Safety Light. These 4.25" diameter disc are rugged enough to withstand being run over by an airport fire truck as seen in their video on their website. It emits light 360 degrees from sixteen LED's. These are extremely bright and have varying patterns of flashes which can be seen for a very long ways. Up to ten miles when viewed from the air.

The PF-200 Safety Light has nine flash patterns, including U.S. Coast Guard approved "SOS" (MORSE CODE) and solid on like a lantern. They run up to 100 hours on either Lithium CR-123 batteries in the PF-200 model or AA NiMH rechargeable batteries in the Model PF-200R. Batteries are replaceable in both models. The PF-200 with the Lithium batteries has a shelf life of ten years which would make them ideal for leaving in the trunk of the car in case of a break down or flat tire. The Model PF-200R rechargeable unit has a shelf life of 30 days out of the charging unit. These are designed to be left in the charger when not in use.

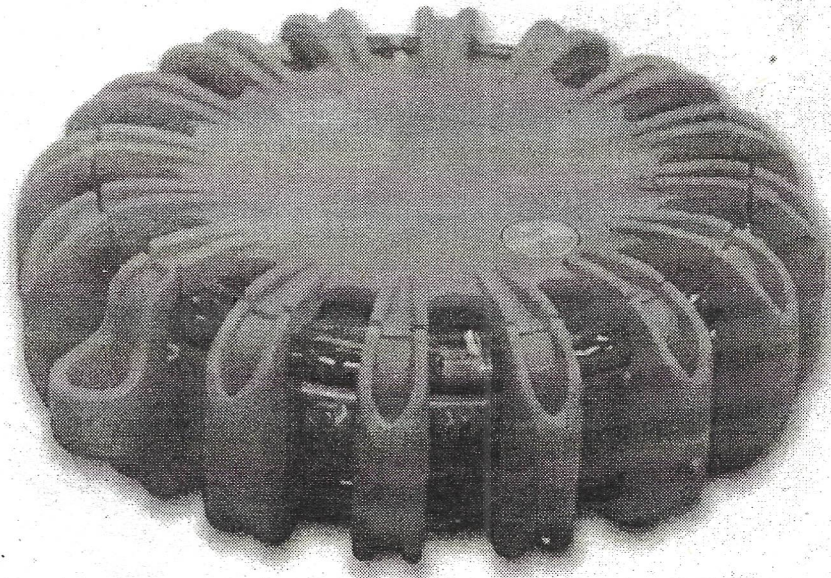
The units are hermitically sealed so they can be used in a hazardous environment. And with a gas leak this could be a truly life saving feature. With all of the weird weather

patterns we have been experiencing one never knows what will happen. We have all seen it happen to other people. And it is human nature to think it won't happen here or to us. But it can.

Unlike the triangles we have all seen that seem to be a magnet to other drivers to run over these little devices will withstand being run over by a vehicle. They can also be used as a signaling device in an emergency to help rescuers locate you. They can be placed in a window during a natural disaster to let rescuers know you are in the house or used in the house in a power outage. On the personal side the can be clipped on a belt or backpack if you are hiking or biking after dark. They are even water proof to 80 feet and the PF-200 floats so they can be taken in the boat with you.

Now these little devices are not cheap at \$45.00 to \$50.00 each. But what is the safety of our families' worth if they have a problem when away from home. Think about mom and the kids on the side of the road with a flat tire or just waiting for the tow truck. Stick one of these on the deck lid or the roof of the car to let them find you easier in the mall parking lot.

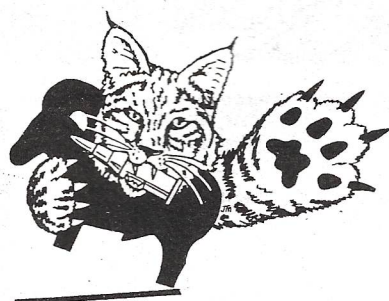

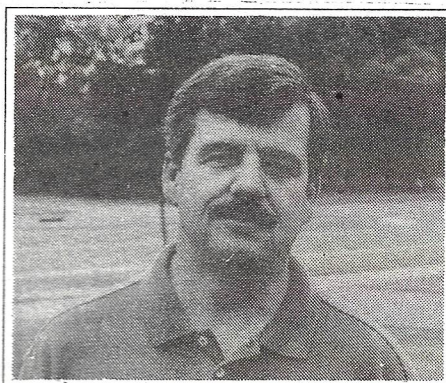


# Wildcat Corner

In a previous issue we looked at a mini-search for the "perfect bullet" to use in a cast bullet load for a military rifle. There has been some reader comment that expressed interest in the detail regarding the sized diameter of the cast bullet and how some of these old guns seem to favor larger bullets. For our silhouette handguns (and other cast bullet applications as well), we need to always remember that the use of cast bullets has one "general guideline" that we need to be willing to apply....do not be afraid to



- Using a wooden dowel, which is placed up against the base of the bullet that is slightly smaller in diameter than the bullet, lightly tap on the end of the dowel, pushing the bullet into the throat area.
- Hold the gun up to a strong light and looking into the muzzle end, see if you can see light around the bullet's perimeter and the inside of the barrel's bore.
- If light is present, repeat the process, tapping a little more on the dowel until there is no light present. At this point

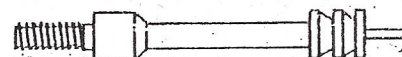
is no resistance felt then the round is not long enough. The key is to have just a small amount of felt resistance. My overall length went from 2.370" to 2.418".

The second item that helped the accuracy improve was to be assured that the bullet was not being pushed too far back into the case when the bolt is closing, which you can feel when the bolt is closing. By experimenting with different size bushings in the neck sizing die, the ability of the bullet to stay put or be pushed back into the case can be influenced. The necks on the Lapua 220 Russian cases that I was using had been turned to about 0.0083" thick. This is thinner than most factory necks are. When the necks are thinner it takes a bit more of a "squeeze" by the neck to keep the bullet in place. The tighter squeeze is provided by using a smaller size bushing. During the 2005 match season the bushing

size that I was using was 0.327" and in 2006 I was using a 0.324" bushing. It's only 0.002" but it made a big difference.

So I'm a believer in those two key ammunition assembly details for use with cast bullets....bullet seating depth into the case and neck tension on the bullet.

At our recent IHMSA silhouette match someone asked me about a possible source of cast bullet loads for rifles and some handguns. He was looking specifically for a load for his old military rifle. So as has been mentioned in previous issues here, I have often said to look at the Cast Bullet Association's Fouling Shot publication (or the CBA website) where there are the loads and many key component details that each competitor was using at the match. And there are many matches being reported on all across the country using both rifles and handguns.

# Shooting With the Winners

## Cartridges of the 2006 Internationals

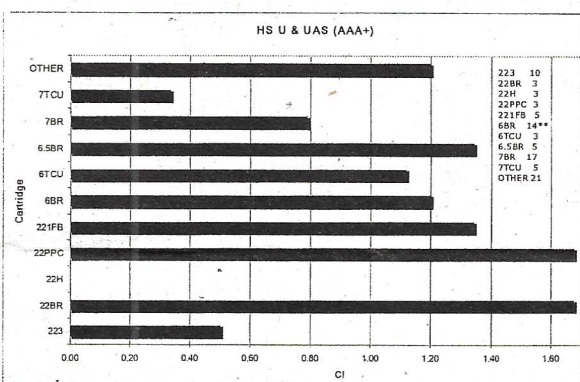
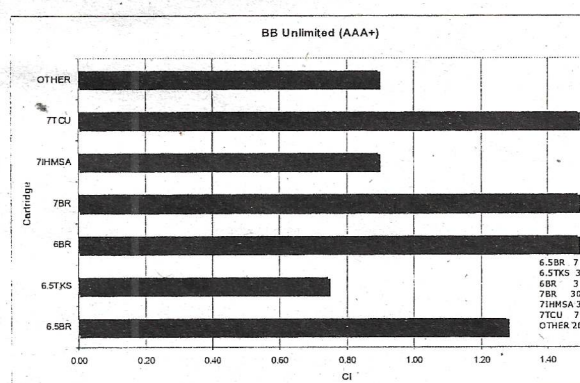
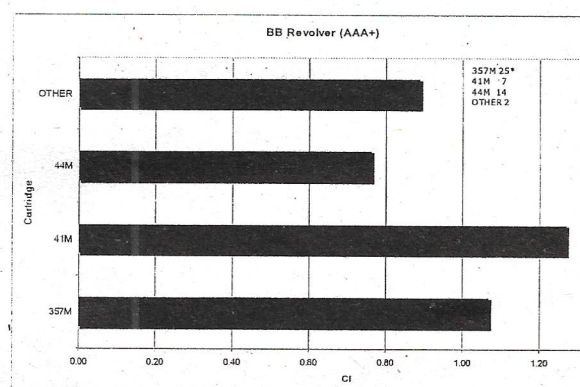
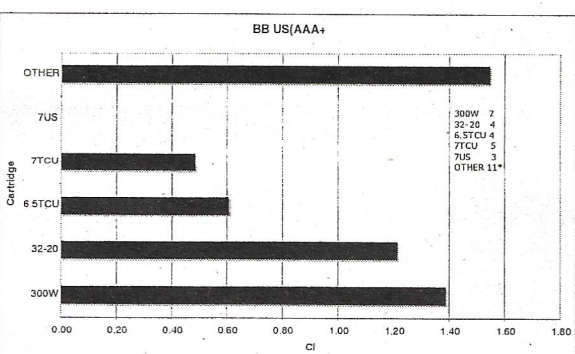
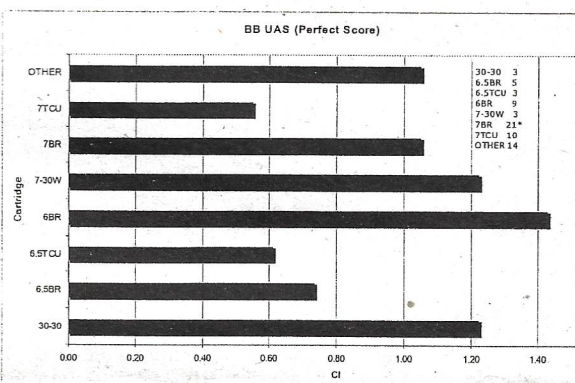
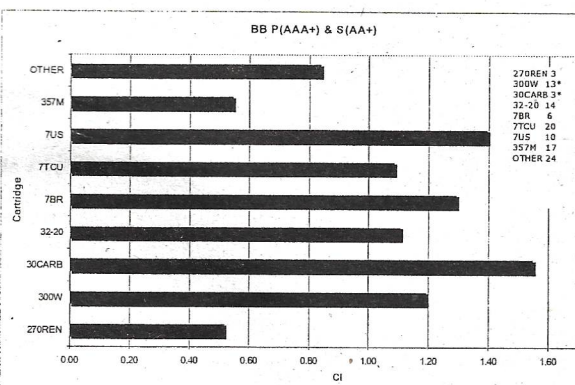
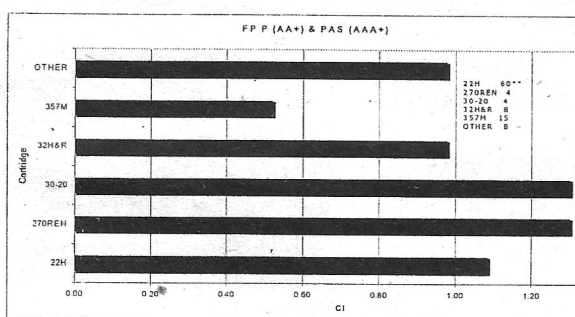
Welcome to the second part of the analysis of the relative competitiveness of the guns and cartridges of the recent Internationals. This time the cartridges take center stage.

Remember, there are several reasons you should be cautious in interpreting these results. First, the analysis does not take into account the ability of the shooter. (You might want to take a look at the match results to see who was the champion for each category. Good shooters can do well with almost any cartridge!) Secondly, the analyses include the same cartridges being shot in several categories possibly by the same shooter. Thirdly, I've only listed cartridges that were shot more than two times for each category analyzed. This is just for completeness-the CI is meaningless for small samples. And most importantly-don't base your decision on choosing a particular cartridge solely on these data! Just remember when perusing the charts to look at how many cartridges were included in the analysis. (The total number of each cartridge is included on the charts and the winner indicated with an \*.) Ten would be a nice number to achieve-but not usually possible with the size of the match. I have combined categories as much as possible to improve the statistics. When this is done different cut-offs may be used for each category and this is indicated on the chart. I've also included a new cutoff for BB UAS-Perfect Score since so many of the competitors shoot 80x80s.

Briefly, a Competitive Index (CI) of 1 is the average cartridge. (See last article for a full definition.) A higher CI means the cartridge COULD, MIGHT, MAYBE be more competitive-remember, look at the numbers!

Please note the "Other" category. The guns in this category include those, which were used only once or twice. Note that the winner could well be from the "Other" category.

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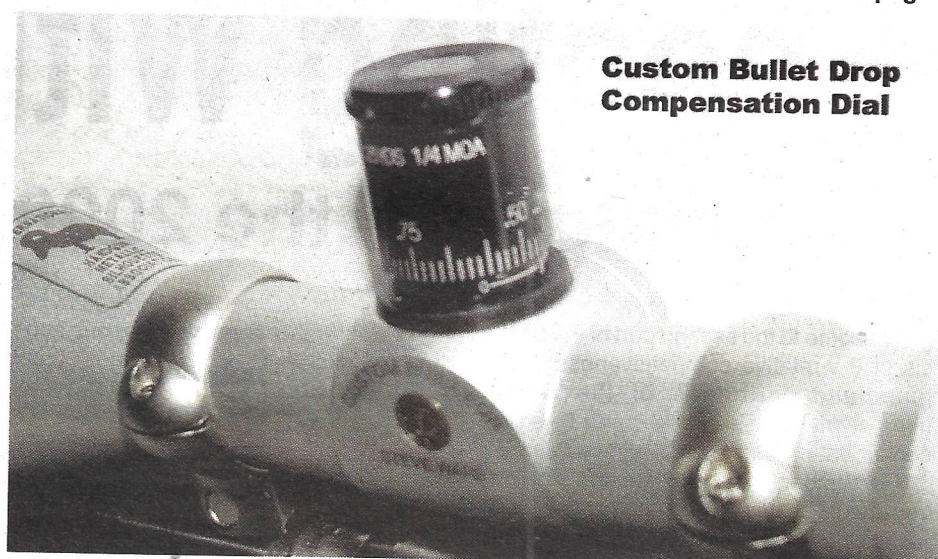

**Custom Bullet Drop Compensation Dial**

allow Leupold to create this dial, I contacted Kaltron-Pettibone, a Lapua distributor, to find out the Ballistic Coefficient of the Super Club bullet. My contact was kind enough to get in touch with the factory in Finland and obtained the bullet's BC. I then ran two five shot strings over my PACT Model 1 chronograph. In addition to creating a spreadsheet with both strings I also combined them to give the results of a single 10 shot string. The spreadsheet was then e-mailed to Leupold.

The last option falls into the "safety and security" column. That was the addition of Leupold's Alumina Flip-Back Lens Covers. These guys keep your lens clean and free of dirt and grime. They are also handy because they ensure you do not accidentally get any bore cleaners on the lens when cleaning your handgun. They are a great add-on that will give you peace of mind.

My wish list was complete, and all that was necessary was to sit back and wait for the scope to arrive at my doorstep. It didn't take long.

After unpacking it and drooling a bit at the cool IHMSA logo, it was over to my good friend Charlie Dean to have the scope mounted. After that, it was a trip to the range to zero the scope and try that new fangled Bullet Drop Compensation Dial. It took only a few shots to zero the scope. After that, I went for pig, turkey, and ram settings. Much to my chagrin that new dial didn't seem to be working because the ram setting was eight clicks below what Leupold predicted. I shot the upcoming Small Bore match with it and was pleased with my performance as sight settings were being refined from my initial trip to the range. I ended up with a 39 in Small Bore and a 37 in One-Fifth Scale.

One discovery came from that match. The scope was useful at full eight power from the twenty-five yard chicken line all the way out to the ram line. My old scope was useful only to about three or four power at the chicken line. This wonderful discovery was thanks to that custom 60 yard parallax setting.

However, I was still troubled by the Bullet Drop Compensation Dial. There had to be an answer there somewhere. As happens many times, it came when I wasn't really thinking about the problem. The scope was mounted on the Anschütz with a Ken Light Reverse Mount. That elevated the scope substantially above the center of the bore line. The Bullet Drop Compensation Dial was created assuming a standard height above the bore line.

I drove down to my favorite gun store and bought a set of 22 mid-height rings. Charlie predicted these would be sufficient to ensure the lens cleared the pistol. Charlie then remounted the scope. I flopped down on my living room floor and focused the reticle looking out my glass sliding door into the woods with the bolt out and chamber empty. Screwing the eyepiece all the way in gave me all the eye relief I needed to shoot from my normal Creedmoor position. Additionally, I discovered that the reticle was much clearer than with the reverse mount. I have determined that has something to do with prescription glasses, the height of the scope, and how I look through it.

Our Big Bore match was the following Sunday after Charlie remounted the scope, and I decided to take the pistol along and set some swingers if things got slow toward the end of the day. I was anxious to see if remounting the scope

would solve the problem of the Bullet Drop Compensation Dial. Things did slow down, and I set a chicken swinger at twenty-five yards. It didn't take long to have the scope zeroed in. I then reset the Bullet Drop Compensation Dial to 25 yards and continued to get a good twenty-five yard setting. A few extra shots had things squared away, and the dial was reset to twenty-five yards again.

The Half-Scale chickens would make a good fifty yard target, and no one was using them. I set the dial to fifty yards and took a shot. That chicken was hit dead center and fell over. I was shocked that the little Anschütz would take down a one inch thick AR-400 steel chicken! To prove the sight setting, I drew a bead on the head of the next chicken, and it went down with a center hit. That certainly proved the twenty-five to fifty yard setting worked on the dial.

No targets were at seventy-five yards; so, I decided to try one hundred yards on the Half-Scale pigs. Again, the Bullet Drop Compensation Dial was right on the mark with center hits on the pigs and one taking an intentional hit in the ear.

The match was winding down and fewer shooters were on the line; so, I moved the chicken swinger to seventy-five yards and dialed down to that setting. Every shot hit the chicken dead center.

I was satisfied that Leupold's Bullet Drop Compensation Dial was a winner. There would be no more counting clicks. All I would have to do from now on would be to move from the twenty-five yard setting to the fifty to the seventy-five and finally one hundred. Getting back to zero on the chicken line would be as simple as turning the dial back to twenty-five.

There is no question that there are less expensive scopes on the market that are suited for this game, but if you are going to get serious about shooting "Little Critters" and you want to find the limits of your ability without the restrictions of equipment, this modified Leupold scope is the right tool to get the job done, and I'm finding it hard to wait until the next Small Bore match to put it through its paces.

Some may say that Leupold is a pricy product. However when considering price, I always think of what my father once told me, "You can't buy a Cadillac for Chevrolet prices." Plus, there is one thing that you get for free with every Leupold Golden Ring product and that is their forever no BS full lifetime guarantee. It is based on Fred Leupold's original promise that every customer is entitled to a square deal. The guarantee simply reads, "If any Leupold Golden Ring product is found to have defects in materials or workmanship, we will, at our option, repair or replace it. FREE. Even if you are not the original owner. No warranty card is needed. No time limit applies." The only way this guarantee can be voided is by having your scope worked on by anyone not authorized by Leupold to do so. Yes, you can buy a scope for far less money, but it isn't a Leupold!

So if you are finding Half Scale or One-Fifth Scale to be a bit of a challenge, take a long hard look at your scope. Consider giving the Custom Shop at Leupold a call to discuss your needs and desires. In all probability, they can come up with a solution.

# SIMMONS 90MM SPOTTER (THE DUDE)

A new trend in the spotting scope marketplace first appeared a couple of years ago and seems to have accelerated into 2007. What I'm talking about is the growing numbers of relatively low cost spotting scopes with gigantic objective lenses.

In the past, it went without saying that big objective lenses = big bucks. It wasn't that long ago when an 80mm lens was restricted to the super premium brands. There was even a extremely expensive German 100mm scope floating around that was a near custom job that was used by that country's Olympic shooting team. The price was enough to feed a family of six in Africa for at least fifty years.

Then, interestingly, a number of manufacturers started to put out some very inexpensive 80mm scopes. I guess it was their way to satisfy Joe Lunchbucket's lust for a big objective spotter. However, the performance of those cheap 80's left a lot to be desired, which is why I've never bothered to review those products.

Next we saw the 90mm Meade which I reviewed in these pages a couple of years ago. The resolution, brightness, and lack of distortion of the scope is as good as it gets. However, it's basically an astronomical instrument with a very reasonable price tag that has been modified as a spotter, and as such lacks the toughness necessary for a scope that might be taken into the field. It's outstanding as a range scope, but definitely is not a field scope.

Fortunately, for those of us who aren't related to Daddy Warbucks or Bill Gates, a couple of what I would call mid-priced 80mm scopes then followed that are really very good for the money - the Simmons Master Series 80mm being one of them, and which I favorably reviewed last year.

However, this newest trend is now pumping out 90mm and even 100mm scopes for around \$250. Could it be that you could have your cake and eat it too? In other words, could extremely big, well performing optics be had for a price that the average working stiff could easily afford?

When Simmons announced its new line up of spotting scopes last year I have to admit that I was immediately curious about its middle grade Wilderness series 90mm. It was modestly priced and it had that huge lens. It was also a scope that would seem to have no problem surviving in a world of outdoor hard knocks. Was it a bargain, or was it one of those low quality gun show specials that one so often sees. I decided to find out.

Sometime later the UPS man dropped (literally) this huge cardboard box at my front door. (Well I guess I won't have to bother with a shock test.) Upon opening it, I found a very nice



aluminum carrying case. Just like Simon's top of the line Master Series scopes, the Wilderness Series spotters also come in an identical case. Neat! Nestled inside the good quality foam lining were the scope, a basic nylon carrying bag, a shoulder strap, and a small bench tripod. On taking the scope out of the case my first impression was that this was indeed a big, heavy dude.

The specifications confirmed my impression. This guy is over a foot and a half long, and is nearly 5 inches wide at the objective. Although polycarbonate is used as a body material to reduce weight, the big nine-oh still comes in at about a hefty 4

pounds. I should also point out that while polycarbonate doesn't have the panache of brass, aluminum, or magnesium as a body material, ounce for ounce it is a very tough material and so is to be actually preferred in many cases. The scope is also fully armored with a tough high density rubber - a big plus if it's going to be roll-

ing around in the trunk of your car as my scopes sometimes do. - Unlike this Simmons, some other brands just use rubber paint on their spotters instead of real armor, so be aware. Nitrogen purging makes it fog proof as well. I was also gratified to see that it was also fully waterproofed. Many scopes in this price range, and even some costing \$100 and even more, are rated as "water resistant". This means that they can be rained on without affecting the internal optics but nothing more. Being water proof means that the product can actually be submerged in water. I'll take waterproof over water resistant every time.

The scope also comes with two plastic lens caps. The one for the objective is a snap on type that was ok but was not that positive when pushed into place. In fact, it had a tendency of falling off now and then. The cap for the eyepiece was the standard threaded type and worked fine. The sliding lens shade is a nice feature which will help to increase image contrast when the scope is pointing towards the sunny side of things. This shade felt a little loose, but it also worked just fine.

Unfortunately, the little tripod included in the kit is just not up to the job of holding this big heavy scope in a secure fashion. The scope's considerable weight and size just overpowers the tripod's ability to hold it, making it susceptible to tipping over. Additionally, every time you wanted to make a focus adjustment or what ever, the scope would shake like a frightened rabbit even after you removed your hand. Like all big, heavy scopes, this dude requires a serious tripod with a lot of mass and stability.

One feature that I really was pleased to see on this spotter is a metal band attached to the scope's mounting plate. Loosen a thumb screw on the metal band, and now

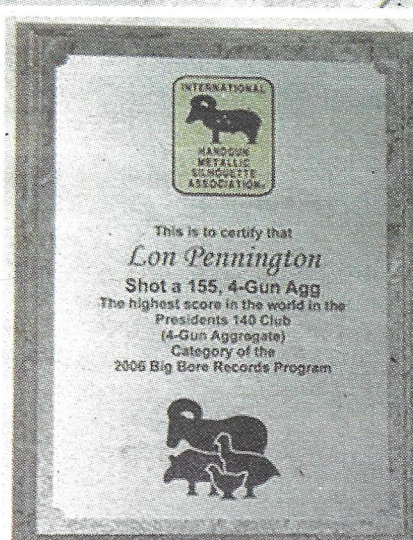
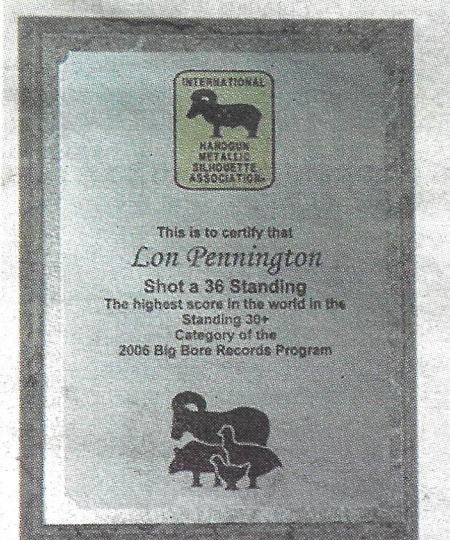
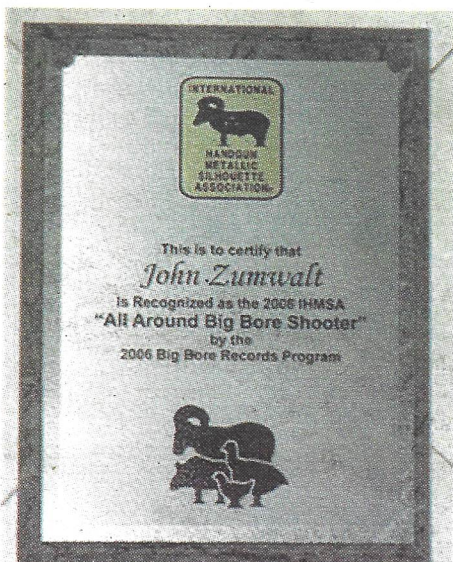

# Forend rule clarified by amendment

I have been asked to write this advice to the membership on behalf of Blair Hamilton, chairman of the Rules committee.

Blair's father passed away late January and he is, understandably, somewhat distracted at this time. We extend our deepest sympathies to Blair and his family for their loss.

As many of you would be aware, there has been some degree of controversy at recent "Internationals" because of innovative forends on unlimited guns that either were on the edge in respect of the ATF ban on dual grips on handguns or could have infringed the spirit and intent, if not the letter of the rule, regarding artificial support, depending on how they were utilized when in the firing position.

I think it important to take a step back so that those of you who are relatively new to the sport, that is, not twenty plus year veterans as some of us are, understand the basis of the thinking of the founders of the sport and the majority of the board when it came to considering the place of such innovative forend designs.

The following quote in respect of this issue was printed in the July, 85 edition of the "Silhouette" (now the *IHMSA News*). There were many similar clarifications published both before and after this but the one chosen appears to best cover the majority of the issues. As a rule clarification, this had the same force as anything printed in the rule book.

## Funny Forends

Again it is time to call attention to the ongoing attempts to circumvent the artificial rest rule as well as the spirit of the rules

regarding forends.

There are continual attempts to devise, create and build forends (primarily for unlimited guns) that have knobs, protrusions or other extensions (some with special checkering and/or rubberized surfaces) that are designed so that the net result is to provide a shooting aid (artificial rest) to the competitor.

Likewise, there are continual efforts to create similar "funny forends" with wedges or melon slices cut out of one side (or both sides) of the forend with the idea of providing a contour effect to fit the shooter's leg or some other part of his anatomy as a shooting aid.

There are likewise attempts to add on material to create the same sort of inverted curve or indentation to fit the shooter's leg or anatomy.

ALL OF THESE AND OTHER VARIATIONS HAVE LONG AGO BEEN VOTED BY THE COMBINED COMMITTEES AS VIOLATING THE ARTIFICIAL REST RULE AS WELL AS THE SPIRIT OF THE RULES.

Match directors and their juries have the authority (and are so directed) to rule on any funny forends at any match. If, in their opinion, any of these funny forends violate either the artificial rest rule, the spirit of the rule, or both, they are directed to not allow the entry of any such gun in any sanctioned match."

This issue was discussed at some length by those members of the board present at the '06 Internationals and by the whole board since via email and the following rule amendment has been written by Blair Hamilton as chair of the rules committee and agreed to by the majority of the board.

Section VI: Handguns; B. Unlimited 10.

10. Stocks and fore ends shall be generally traditional in design and shall meet all criteria of the US Tobacco and Firearms regulations for a handgun fore end. Custom stocks and fore ends are allowed provided they are not configured in such a way to act as a shooting aid.

A) Custom stocks and fore ends are allowed provided they are not configured in such a way to act as a shooting aid (i.e. specifically contoured to fit body anatomy).

B) Designs that allow grasping the fore end at an angle greater than 60 degrees from the bore line are not allowed.

C) Adjustable stocks are allowed, provided the adjusted configuration meets all other IHMSA rules.

The Taco hold, which primarily involves the gripping of the barrel, scope or scope mount, remains legal in IHMSA competition so long as the forend/stock conforms to the principles enunciated above.

Despite what some members may think, we are not in the business of stifling creativity and innovation but we do have an obligation to preserve the integrity of the sport and ensure that we are not in violation of any law or regulation.

In short, no forends that provide artificial support and no forends that could be construed as violating the ATF ban on dual grips on handguns.

If you want to innovate, run it past the board **before** you sink your hard-earned cash into something that may not be allowed.

## IHMSA, Inc Board Member votes March 2007 Proposed rules changes to IHMSA 2007 Rules Book

Section 6. Handguns; A. Production; Article: 6

From:

6. The handgun must be complete at all times in form, finish, and mechanical function as manufactured. Except as otherwise allowed by the rules, only internal and external parts that are a manufacturer's standard catalog items for the particular model of handgun may be used for repair or replacement.

A) If spare parts for a discontinued handgun are not available, a broken or dysfunctional part may be replaced by a newly made one provided that:

1) The newly made part is identical, in material, form, dimension, configuration and finish to the original part. Exception: see 7-A).

B) No main part (i.e. frame, cylinder) except the barrel may be duplicated.

To:

6: The handgun must be complete at all times in form, finish and mechanical function as manufactured. Except otherwise allowed by these rules, only internal and external parts that are the original handgun manufacturer's standard catalog items for the particular model of handgun may be used for repair or replacement.

A) Where original replacement parts are no longer available for the handgun in question, a broken or unserviceable part may be replaced by a newly made one provided that the newly made part is identical in material, form, finish, dimension and configuration to the original part.

B) The only main part, i.e. frame, cylinder, action or barrel that may be replaced is the barrel so long as it conforms to A) above.

Section 6 Handguns; A. Production; Article 7:

From:

7. Fox Ridge Outfitters and Thompson Center (T/C) Custom Shop replacement barrels are allowed on T/C Contender and Encore frames.

To:

7. In the case of barrels fitted to Thompson Center Arms "Contender", "G2" and "Encore" frames, the following shall be allowed:

A) A barrel that does not exceed 10 3/4" in overall length.

B) A sight radius that does not exceed 10 5/8" in length.

C) A barrel outside diameter that does not exceed that found at the breech end of a standard Thomson Center Arms barrel as fitted to the model in question.

D) Barrels that are blue, stainless or plated may be used so long as the maker of the barrel offers the finish being utilized.

E) A cartridge that conforms to **Section VII** of these rules.

Barrels that are fluted, stepped or have a reverse-taper are not allowed

Another feature I like about this scope is the long eye relief, a comfortable five inches. I've always been conscious of the consequences of creeping a scope ever since my one and only forehead crescent some years back. I've decided never to have one of those again, so the additional couple of inches over a standard relief is something that's welcome. I guess you might say that it's a feature that caught my eye so that I won't catch my eye! (Interestingly, I've seen some shooters do the forehead crescent routine repeatedly to the point that, while at first I thought they were just stupid, it appears that they must like it!)

While the BDC-250 reticle is found exclusively on Nikon's muzzleloading scopes, the BDC concept is applicable to other scopes as well, including a BDC-200 reticle for slug guns. While I tried the Omega muzzleloading rifle scope, I'm sure the BDC reticles now available throughout Nikon's new Monarch line, as well as select Monarch Gold, Buckmasters and ProStaff models, could serve as well. For me, multiple aim points sure beat the heck out of fiddling with clicks between steel animals. I can't recall how many times I've forgotten to reset my clicks after the rams so that the next time I shot at the chickens my first bullet was way high. Now, if I can only remember which of the nine aiming points to use for each animal, I can be right on target. Yeah, I know, there's still the trigger control, breathing, follow-through and the like, but that's for another article.

Just to save you the trouble of looking up the rest of the specifications for the Omega, here they are:

I see that Nikon has also gotten back into the Dotscope game. A few months ago, when I did some research for my foray into Dotscopes, I was disappointed that Nikon had discontinued its offering. Now that they're back, I'll have to get my hands on one to test. Currently, there's only one (catalogued as three separate models, the only difference being the finish - matte, silver or Realtree APG). What immediately got my attention were the variable dot sizes, ranging from 1 to 10 MOA. It's the "1" that interests me since a major complaint with dots is that they're too big; if the reticle

brightness is such that the dot can be seen in daylight, that "1" seems like the right answer.

Last month, when I wrote about the Hodgdon Annual Manual, I mentioned that a number of cartridges were dropped from the data. I didn't mean to imply that this was through error; the Annual Manual clearly states that only the 50 top reloaded rifle and pistol cartridges were included. Of course, that's disappointing for silhouette loads, but with all the other shooting I do, the data is great. Anyway, I got to thinking about the idea of top reloaded or most popular reloaded cartridges, how it was determined and the validity.

As far as I know, the popularity of cartridges that are reloaded is measured by sales of new dies as reported by one or more manufacturers. At best, that's the least imperfect measurement there is. Few bullets are cartridge specific and although a handful of powders may have been developed for a particular cartridge, soon after their introduction, multiple applications are the rule, not the exception. So, with no ability to use bullets or powder as a measure of popularity, die sales are chosen.

Unless abused to the extreme, dies that are worn out by excessive use are rare. That means there is a whole lot of reloading being done on dies purchased long ago, making the measure of popularity of cartridges by measurement of die sales suspect. I doubt we'll ever have a really accurate way of measuring popularity, but I have some speculations.

First, specialty cartridges such as we use in IHMSA Big Bore will never make the list, even though they are virtually all an exclusively reloaded group. There just aren't enough of us and despite huge quantities of cartridges reloaded by IHMSA shooters in 7mmBR, 7mm TCU, 7mm IHMSA and the like, the numbers would pale in comparison to common cartridges loaded a few at a time by the cadres of paper punchers, plinkers, hunters and other "casual" shooters (as well as in quantity for those of us heavily engaged in the target sports).

Perhaps a quick look at the more popular factory fodder would be indicative of what is being reloaded. As pedestrian as cartridges such as 9mm Luger, 38 Special/357 Magnum, .223 Remington, 30-30 Winchester and 30-06 Springfield might be, these very same discount store cartridges that feed those same discount store guns always make the list. Although we may be somewhat more intense in our reloading activities, those 25% of shooters that reload from the casual class produce a whole lot

more ammo than we do.

For new die sales, entry-level reloaders would tip the scales toward cartridges that have a reputation of being easy and forgiving. Additionally, many of the bread and butter starter cartridges are popular because they're relatively inexpensive. If a new shooter is trying to save a couple of bucks by using inexpensive cartridges, that same driver might be pushing the die sales also. So, it's no great mystery why die sales of, let's say, 38 Special/357 Magnum would be consistently way up there.

I suppose there may be some spikes in die sales from newly introduced cartridges, but am somewhat surprised that they would all jump on the most popular list. I've seen a good number of .204 Rugers showing up at the club, but to-date have not seen many of the short and super short cartridges that all the paid writers seemed to by hawking beginning a few years ago. The next rifle in 300 RUM that I see being used will be my first official sighting. Perhaps so many of these cartridges make the list because the top 50 is too large a number for measuring popularity. The forty-ninth or fiftieth most popular cartridge isn't very popular at all! For that matter, there's probably a much lower threshold between popularity and

specialty.

Also on the list are some pretty cavernous cases where I'd guess that relatively few cartridges are actually reloaded, as compared with cartridges that don't make the list which are loaded in copious quantities. I think it would be a pretty good bet that more cartridges are loaded annually for a 7mm TCU (didn't make the list) than for a .338 Winchester Magnum (made the list). If a casual IHMSA shooter shot 100 7mm TCUs a month, that's a 1200 round annual requirement. A .338 Winchester Magnum isn't the kind of round that you casually plink off a bench. It's more likely sighted in once a year and then taken to the field perhaps two or three times at the outside, resulting in maybe a box or two of ammo. Assuming 40 rounds a year for the .338 Winchester Magnum, the 7mm TCU has it beaten by 30 times!

So where does this all take us? Nowhere, I'm just thinking out loud. For the time being, new die sales are the best indicator we've got, albeit there are some flaws in using that measure for cartridge popularity. Meanwhile, whether the dies are selling hotly or not, the most popular cartridge is the one you're loading at the moment.

the scope can be rotated right or left. This is a feature that was often found on scopes made in the 50's and 60's and then for some reason disappeared. The advantage is that with some bench mounts, or scope stands used by standing shooters, the scope is mounted sideways. This then puts the focus knob in an awkward position. However, by loosening the metal band, the scope can now be rotated so that the focus knob is now in its proper position on the top where it's supposed to be, or in any other position that's best for your particular needs. Later, when you mount the scope on a regular camera type tripod, the scope can be rotated back to its normal position if you wish. The ability to rotate the scope gives the shooter a tremendous amount of flexibility in positioning it to the most useful position.

As is my practice when reviewing scopes, if a company makes a claim of waterproofing, etc. the scope is going to get my yellow bucket and freezer test. That means it's going to spend an hour in a big yellow bucket full of water and then get plopped dripping wet into the freezer for 24 hours. If it survives that with no leakage or fogging, it passes on to the next stage of my evaluation. The Wilderness 90 passed the test with no problem. OK, enough of the mechanical stuff, let's talk about the optical side of the coin.

The main reason one would want a giant objective lens on a spotting scope is that it would presumably present a brighter image to the eye than a scope of equal quality and of a smaller size. Indeed, the image on the Wilderness 90 was nice and bright, especially when set on 25X, its lowest setting. Almost without exception, I always have my spotting scopes set on their lowest settings because it provides the brightest image, the highest resolution, the widest field of view, and longest eye relief that the scope is capable of producing.

Another advantage that the brightness of a large objective lens provides is that it allows the manufacturer to boost the mag-

nification power without the image becoming so dark that it's almost unusable. On those occasions when higher magnification might be necessary (like 500 meter handgun silhouette) big objectives are definitely an advantage. In this case, Simmons has boosted the magnification power up to 75X, while most other big objective scopes have their magnification levels restricted to 60X.

To check out this scope, I used my standard home made resolution target which consists of several lines of the letter "O" in descending sizes. This target is something that anyone can throw together on their home computer. The idea is to identify the smallest line of type in which the blank space inside the "O" can be seen. When the optics reach the limit of their resolution, the line of O's look like a length of braided rope.

The day of the evaluation was cool and sunny with no mirage - perfect viewing conditions. I first put up my target at 50 yards. As mentioned before, the image at 25X was nice and bright. The smallest line of type that could be discerned was 12 point, which I consider to be good performance. My computer will only print down to 9 point which is easily seen by first quality scopes. The target was then moved to 100 yards. At that distance, 24 point type was the smallest that could be consistently resolved.

I also observed that the image in the scope had a relatively "soft" quality to it as opposed to the almost painfully sharp image that you would find in the high dollar premium scopes. I also noticed a very subtle condition that I haven't seen in a while.

My resolution target is printed on standard white typing paper and I had it stapled to a larger sheet of blank white paper on my target board. I hadn't noticed it at first, but the edges of my resolution target appeared to have a small violet border around the four sides. A little later, the edges appeared to be a lime green (my head was also probably in a slightly different position).

This condition is called chromatic aberration. This is a situation in which different portions of the light spectrum are focused in different places. The most common way for a scope maker to deal with this is to use an achromatic lens, which is a sandwich of crown and flint glass. An acromat lens will eliminate this optical condition to the point where it is almost totally undetectable.

The fact that I was seeing this makes me suspect that the large objective lens on this scope is not a achromatic doublet, but rather a simple one piece lens. This would also explain how the various manufacturers could afford to put these huge lenses in a very modestly priced scope. However, this is absolute pure speculation on my part as I have no way to determine this definitively without tearing down the scope. What ever the cause, the good news is that when I directed the scope away from my resolution target towards a "normal" background, I really had to look intently to detect the condition. I doubt if one person in a thousand would notice it, much less be bothered by it. I certainly wasn't. There's also no doubt that the use of BaK4 prisms and multicoating in this scope go a long way to produce the very practical and useable image that I found.

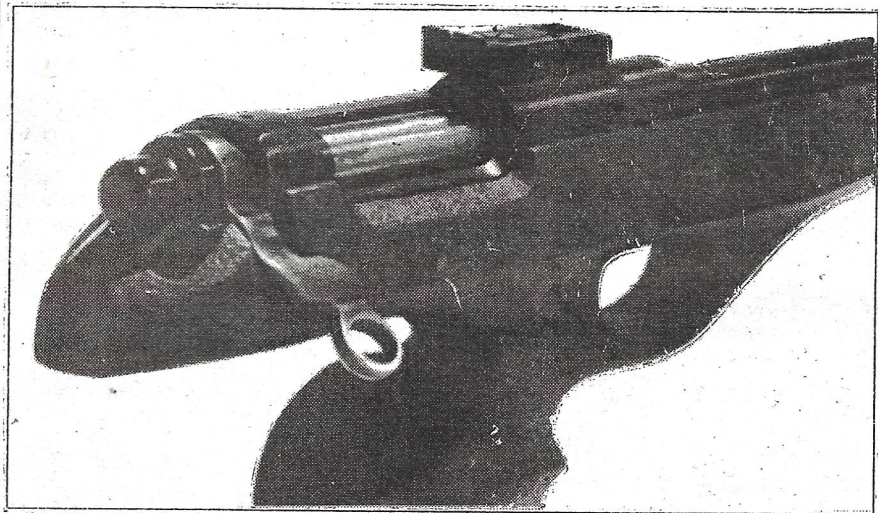
So how useable is the image? Well my good friend Jon Ocab who is a long range rifle shooter was practicing his standing shooting next to me with his AR-15 on a

200 meter paper bull. When I trained the Wilderness 90 on his target, I had absolutely no problem seeing the 22 caliber holes in the paper. While still trained on the paper target I then cranked the power all the way up to 75X and asked several people to take a look. "Not bad" "Not bad at all" was the common comment. "How much does it cost?" "Only \$250?" That's a good deal." The only other remark I got was a desire for more eye relief. Indeed, while eye relief is rated at 12mm's at 25X and 7.5mm's at 75X, I found I could see much better if I took off my glasses and moved my eye forward to the point that my eyebrow was touching the eyepiece. I definitely would have preferred to have more eye relief.

All and all, I found that while the Wilderness 90, like any other scope, had its imperfections, they were often small, subtle shortcomings that could easily go unnoticed. This scope gives excellent value for the money and provides a huge objective lens and extraordinary magnification to the shooter that can't put down the equivalent of a car payment for a spotting scope. With its tough construction and very useable optics, I found that the Wilderness 90 is a sensible and practical product. Indeed, I wouldn't have any problem at all using it at the Internationals or at any other important match. Give give the dude a look. Good luck and good shooting.

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# Ekspurt Advice

**Q:** I know that I was gone for awhile, but when did we get a separate category for Auto's in SB? I've always shot mine in Production. I really don't look at my score card very often, as I just enjoy shooting. I know when I walk off the line if I'm happy with my score or not, as I'm the only one that has to be happy with it.

I've noticed that we try to keep the BB and SB categories in line with each other, Half-Scale and other categories. We're always looking for ways to get new shooters into this game, but most seem like they're against adding new categories. More to the point, why not an Auto class in FP? That way when your new shooter shows up he'll have a place to shoot, without being told that he will be shooting against the specialty guns....Just a thought and my \$.02 worth. Val

**A:** Val. When I started shooting silhouettes back in the late eighties there was an "Auto" check-box on the score cards next to Small Bore Production. This had always been an optional category at the discretion of the match director. Those ranges with a large enough attendance might have enough competitors interested in shooting their Colt Woodsman or some such other to make it a viable separate category. At the time there weren't really any suitable semi-auto .22s for the silhouette game, mostly due to inadequate sights. I haven't gotten my new card yet and wasn't aware the Semi-Auto check-box had returned.

As to a Semi-Auto category in Field Pistol, Steve Ware in Oregon and a few other ranges have been shooting just such a category for a few years now and the locals really seem to enjoy shooting their auto Colts, Glocks, etc. for a separate, fun and completely local honor. I don't expect to see this shot at the Internationals and can't remember ever seeing a separate Semi-Auto category shot there for Small Bore although I'm sure they must have at some point.

It has been my opinion for some time now that any new category for IHMSA should be on a voluntary basis as the number of categories has become cumbersome for the match director and bewildering to investigators. Although, I guess if you think about it, all categories are optional at the match director's discretion. However, it just

may get someone in a twist if they show up for a match expecting to shoot, say standing, and the match director has decided to lump that discipline in with UAS. Ekspurt

**Q:** Simple question, I was going to give this whole shooting steel thing a try as soon as it warms up. I have a nice little 10 inch 32-20 barrel that I would like to use, but it has an aftermarket Williams FP rear sight on it, the blade, not peep. I have a drawer full of old TC rear sights, so I could switch it out, but I like it. Is it legal in Production FP? Okiecruffler

**A:** As long as your Williams sight is made for the TC it is legal. Either blade or peep is okay. Ekspurt

**Q:** I've been practicing my offhand shooting mostly in the comfort of my own home, dry firing at a 1/4" dot on the wall. I'd gotten pretty good at it, managing to hold the crosshairs right on the dot for most shots, and eliminating any gun movement when pulling the trigger. This technique seemed to work very well at the range on a windless day, allowing me to hit the turkey on almost every shot. Last weekend, however, we had a lot of wind in this area, and my groups went straight to hell. I simply couldn't hold the crosshairs on the target long enough to get a good shot off. A friend of mine who happens to be a former Marine gunnery instructor suggested I try a different technique. Instead of trying to hold the crosshairs motionless on the center of the target, he advised me to practice with the scope moving across the target in a predictable way, then pulling the trigger just when the crosshairs passed over the center of the target. I've gotten pretty good at timing my shots in this way, but I haven't had the opportunity yet to see whether this technique works any better in real world (windy) conditions at the range.

**A:** Andrew. Trigger time with dry-firing exercises is great but the absolutely best way I've found to practice in my basement is with an air pistol. You get immediate feedback on shot placement and can shoot cheaply enough to shoot thousands of rounds in practice, experimenting with different techniques and getting used to the ergonomics of getting five shots off in two minutes.

Your wobble method is a good one. I try to use it myself for iron sights but for scoped classes my theory is to use plenty of magnification and just fire when I see black. For shooting in the wind the best thing I can suggest is to put on weight. Sometimes a man just needs a little ballast. Ekspurt

## Match Publication Policy

As we continually have new match directors, following is the IHMSA News' policy on publication of state, regional, and "specialty" match notices and match results.

Any IHMSA sanctioned club in good standing may publish a notice of their club's state or regional championship match at no charge for three months. State match notices are limited to 2 1/4 "x5". Regional match notices are limited to 4 3/4 "x5". If a club is holding a "specialty" match and that match does not replace one of these championships, the *IHMSA News* will publish a 2 1/4 "x5" notice at no charge one time. These notices will run in Section B only. The club may publish additional notices of the same size for \$45 per issue. Ads must be prepaid before printing. All payments are to be sent to IHMSA HQ, P.O. Box 901120, Sandy, UT. The club may specify whether the paid notice is published in Section A or B.

State match results can list both first and second place finishes. Regional match results can list first, second, and third place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a state championship may publish first and second place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a regional championship may publish first, second, and third place finishes. All other match results wherein the total number of handgun silhouette entries exceeds 11 (including all IHMSA, NRA & non-member guests) can list only the first place finish. Matches with less than 11 total handgun entries as defined above can list all IHMSA handgun entrants and their place. Regardless of the above, all 40's, 60's, and 80's (depending on the number of rounds fired at the match) can be published from ANY IHMSA match.

An IHMSA club holding a dual sanctioned (IHMSA/NRA) match may submit a match report for publication in the *IHMSA News* containing both IHMSA and NRA results. The number of published NRA results may not exceed the number of published IHMSA results. **Publication is limited to IHMSA sanctioned handgun disciplines only.**

## Small Bore Records

by Rich Hawkins

I'm going to repeat a previous column from last year. With a new shooting season starting up, I would like to explain a few of the rules on how to enter the .22 records program. The program is open to any current IHMSA member.

We will have four "Presidents Club" awards this year as I've listed below. Award pins for each club are available through headquarters. If you have a score that qualifies, the pin on your hat or shooting box is a cool standout item. Take pride in your achievements.

**Presidents 100 Club (3-gun).** The idea here is to score a total of 100 or more points out of a 120 possible using 3 guns. The shooter must shoot a STANDING score of at least 20 and then shoot scores in two other classes such as Production, Revolver, Unlimited Standing, or Unlimited. An example score might be Standing-24, Production 39, Unlimited 38.....these scores would total 101 and can be entered into the program.

**Presidents 140 Club (4-gun)** is the same as the 100 except you would use 4 guns for the Aggregate. Again, Standing is required, and then add your choice of 3 of the following: Production, Revolver, Unlimited, or Unlimited Standing. 140 points would be the minimum out of a possible 160 points.

**Presidents 60 Club:** This popular club also has its own pin. Standing and Unlimited Standing scores that add up to 60 or

more. Only about a dozen shooters each year get to wear one of these.

**Presidents 80 Club:** This is an award we're going to reserve for those that shoot perfect 80's with Open Sights. Since there are only a handful of matches that are 80 rounders, the pressure to perform flawlessly with open sights will be enhanced.

In addition to the above, the monthly records column will include scores with the following criteria:

**Standing:** Any Standing score 28 or higher will be listed in the records program.

**Unlimited Standing:** Any US score 32 or higher will be listed in the records program.

**Standing Aggregate:** Any Standing and Unlimited Standing score that adds up to 60 or more will be posted.

**Revolver 40x40:** This speaks for itself. Shoot one of those rare 40x40 scores with a .22 revolver and you get your name on the list.

The scores may be fired at a one day match or a multiple day match. However, the scores cannot be carried over from one match to another. The scores must be fired at one continuous match, like a 3-day Regional or the 6-day Internationals. Scores using 60 or 80 targets are eligible, (converted to a 40 round match score) and may be entered into the 100 and 140 club scores. However, those scores cannot hold a IHMSA 100/140 club record. Only scores fired on a 40 round course of fire may hold an IHMSA 100/140 record.

Our range tried something that we've never done before - host an IHMSA State Championship match. Our past reluctance was primarily due to the physical limitations of our range. Our normal layout provided 2 positions each of Small Bore and Field Pistol and only one of Big Bore - with some unique characteristics. But since no other range had scheduled a State Championship match for 2006, we decided to give it a try.

We talked about it at our July match and it was late August by the time we got the approval from the club's Board of Directors and really started to put things together. We would have to make some changes to our layout in order to provide for sighter targets and shoot-offs. We needed to use some of the space usually set aside for our Big Bore position for this so we could only offer Small Bore and Field Pistol. Well, better than no match at all.

It was a good bit of work, both physically and logistically but a lot of people pitched in. Rowland Smith's wife, Diane, volunteered to handle the sign-ups and gun certification. She had done this in prior years for both the Wilkes-Barre and Keystone clubs, so she was a great asset. She somehow coaxed her sister to assist her and she even brought some crock-pots with hot meals for the shooters. I was very impressed by how many Falls Township Club members, both IHMSA shooters and non-IHMSA shooters, helped with the range set-up or whatever was needed. The regular match crew, Rowland Smith, Ron D'Alphonso and Mike McCahan did a lot of the final set-up/breakdown work in addition to putting in full days on our match weekend.

We had to rely primarily on word-of-mouth and the mailing of flyers to publicize the information for our late October match. Considering the late notice, late in the season match date and the match weekend forecast - rain on Saturday and then wind gusts on Sunday, I think we had a reasonable turnout.

We are only a few miles from the New Jersey border, so New Jersey shooters regularly attend out matches. Being a New Jersey shooter myself, (and the actual New Jersey State Director - in spite of the IHMSA News listing John Sullivan) I wanted to incorporate the New Jersey State Championship into the same match weekend. New Jersey, unfortunately, hasn't offered IHMSA shoots in a number of years, but we thought the shooters deserved the chance for some championship competition too. Some of the shooters receiving our flyer were surprised that we remembered them and were very appreciative of that fact. I hope we'll see them in the future at our regular matches and the next time we hold a championship shoot.

Just a final word before the listing of the results to say thanks to all that helped out and especially those that showed up to shoot. I hope that we'll be able to do this again and that next time I'll have the results out within the same calendar year. Thanks so much for your patience.
