The 30th National Championships of IHMSA Australia Inc are over, but definitely not forgotten. All Australian States, except the Northern Territory were represented in the 39 shooters who entered. Over the 6 days of competition there were 395 matches shot which means 17,795 rounds being fired down range. This divides up into 149 Small Bore, 62 Field Pistol and 184 Big Bore matches. This can be further broken down so that you can see the popularity of the various matches.

Junior to Daniel Harding with a 66. The Open Field Pistol Two Match Aggregate went to Bruce Dunbar with a 66 and the Ladies to Melinda Mullen with a 55 and Junior to Daniel Harding with 25. The National Champions were, Production, Cheyne Fischer 39, Revolver, Matt Seears 40, Standing Wayne Christian 30, Unlimited, Joseph Brajkovich 40, Unlimited Any Sights, Terry Jolly 40, Field Pistol Production, Bruce Dunbar 35 and Production Any Sights Matt Seears 33. A good night was had by all.

Big Bore:

After a well deserved lay day, practice day, sight seeing day or whatever it was down to business again – trying to squish 8 matches into 3 days and allow time for shoot offs on the last afternoon before the sun set. Once again, the weather was very kind – no rain but strong gusty wind did necessitate the clamping of rams for a day. Russell Mowles set the benchmark early with a 40 in Production and over the 3

Field Pistol Matches. Everyone used a T/C frame with a large variety of different calibre barrels.

Production - All TC, 16x22 HORN, 5x32.20, 3x357, 2xG2 357, 2x22MAG, 1x25.20, 1x270 REN.

Production Any Sight - All TC, 22x22 HORN, 3x357, 2x32.20, 2xG2 357, 1x25.20, 1x270 REN.

The Small Bore and Field Pistol presentation was held in the big "shed" at SSPC – ACT with mention being made that there were 3 shooters in attendance that had also been present at the first Nationals held in Canberra in 1980, namely Bob Midworth, Rob Abel and Trevor Jessop. The only other two who were in attendance then and who are still shooting are Wendel Poschl who could not make it this year and Kim Emery who missed out on the first part of the shoot as he had been overseas competing. The Open 100m Small Bore Four Match Aggregate was won by Matt Seears with a 146, the highest Small Bore Aggregate shot at a Nationals for some time. The Ladies went to Melinda Mullen with a 133 and the

days this was followed by three others – John Harding, Cheyne Fischer and Kim Emery. Kim went on to hit 3 shoot off targets and claim victory. The highest score in Revolver was 38 by Wayne Christian and Russell Mowles. It took 3 goes at the shoot off targets before Wayne won the category. Standing also saw a shoot off with Keith Rigby and John Harding, both on 29. Keith scored more shoot off targets here to score victory.

There were five 40's shot in the Unlimited category – Cheyne Fischer, Kellie Coleman, Wayne Christian, Terry Jolly and Kim Emery. Everyone thought the shoot off could take a while, but when Kim hit 4 targets on the first run it was all over. The Unlimited Any Sight category was a very different story. Noel Warner, Joseph Brajkovich, Dave Larvin, Bob Midworth, David Robinson, and Dominic Piscioneri all managed the perfect score. In the first run of shoot off targets, (half scale chickens at 200m) David Robinson scored 4 and Dominic 3 to take first and second. Noel,

Small Bore:

While the weather was not ideal in that it was heavily overcast and threatening rain with the odd shower thrown in, light conditions were fairly consistent. IHMSA Practical Hunter Silhouette

The board has approved the two year trial of the proposed Practical Hunter Silhouette classes. The revised rules follow this article. The 12" barrel length was eliminated and a shorter overall length was adopted. This will allow common hunting guns such as currently produced T/C Encore and G2 with factory 15" barrels to compete, while keeping the longer bolt action guns such as the XP-100 out of the classes. The intent of these classes is to allow handgun hunters a place to improve their skills with a handgun and to compete with guns that look like their own. These classes will have many guns that are available at local dealers.

Silhouette has always been a "bring what you got and shoot it " sport, but as the game has evolved and the top shooters have push the envelope of what is possible with a handgun, we might say we have left most of the current handgun manufactures behind. It is a common misconception that a new shooter has to have the same gun as the top shooters to be competitive. Nothing could be farther from the truth, but when they are on the firing line next to a custom gun that cost 2 or 3 times theirs, they will get that impression. We tell them that with our class structure they are only competing against other shooters with like ability. But human nature is that we all want to be the best at every activity we attempt. They will get the idea that if they want to get to upper levels of the sport they will have to lay out the big bucks to be competitive. Again this is just not true, as most shooters will have tons

of stories of the much less expensive gun winning Regional and International matches.

The Board hopes that these new classes will dispel some of those misconceptions. We are hoping that we will see increased support from the current handgun manufactures. We already have a commitment for a donated handgun to be given away and that was before the SHOT SHOW. One idea for the handgun(s) giveaway is for everyone who competes in the new "P. Hunter" classes during the year is to get one chance for every entry you shoot. We will have a drawing at the end of the year. We could also give new members who join IHMSA during that year 2 chances for every entry they shoot. That would be a good way to monitor the amount of shooters we have participating and give us input at the end of the two year trial period.

We are working on promotional items for these new classes. They include posters you could put up at local gun stores, gun ranges, sporting goods stores, etc. We are working to get some articles about silhouette shooting in some publications. There also has been talk about doing a new "Silhouette loads" book that would collect the wisdom of our silhouette shooters, or maybe some "YouTube" videos showing how much fun you could be having at one of our matches?

We also need the support of the local shooters and match directors to attract new shooters to the sport. You are on the front lines and more than anything we need shooters at our local matches to grow this sport.

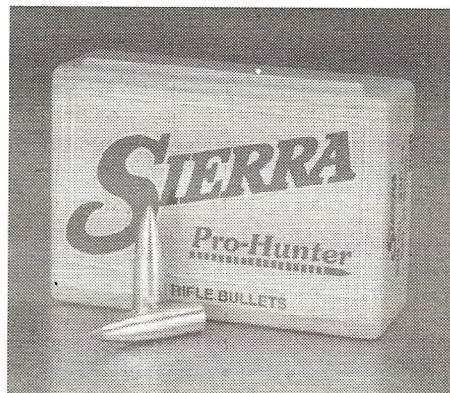

OFFICIAL BULLETIN

The IHMSA Board of Directors has voted to exempt Air Pistols from the muzzle break rule regardless of barrel length since the physics of a muzzle break on short barreled air pistols provide no safety hazard. In accordance with this decision, the following rule is now in effect and will be included in the next rule book.

Section X. A. 2. of the rule book is now changed to read as follows:

2. **Not Allowed:** The following equipment, accessories, actions are not allowed:

- A) Artificial rests or supports, slings, padded or unnecessarily heavy clothing, or any kind of wrist or arm supports or bracelets.
- B) Applied friction materials or rubberizing on any part of the handgun.
- C) Muzzle brakes, compensators or ported barrels on handguns with barrel lengths less than 12 inches in overall length, including the muzzle brake, compensator or porting. **(Unlimited air pistols are exempt from this section.)**

Note that the change in the rule is printed in Bold only for highlighting the change. When printed in the next rule book it will not be highlighted separately.

The pistols will not fire if the manual safety is in the "on" or "safe" position.

As a responsible manufacturer, we want to make our customers aware of this safety concern as soon as possible. Ruger is finalizing the design of a new trigger group which prevents firing when dropped and will retrofit at no charge all Ruger SR9 pistols with serial number prefix "330" (330-xxxx).

All owners will receive a FREE SR9 magazine as a "thank you" for their patience and cooperation.

All owners of Ruger SR9 pistols are urged not to use their pistol until it has been retrofitted with these new factory parts. If owners must use their SR9 pistol, the manual safety should be kept in the "on" or "safe" position except when actually firing.

Proposed New IHMSA Practical Hunter Classes

IHMSA is proposing to add 3 new Practical hunter classes on a 2 year trail basis to start Jan. 1, 2011 and end Dec. 31, 2012. These are optional classes to be offered at the discretion of the local match directors. They are not required to be offered at any State, Regional, or World Championship match. The purpose of adding these classes is to offer new shooters with hunting style handguns a place to compete with like style handguns in IHMSA.

Proposed New Class Names

Practical Hunter Long Course

Practical Hunter Short Course

Practical Hunter .22 LR Course

Class descriptions

All 3 classes are to be shot from any SAFE freestyle position including Prone, Kneeling, Sitting, or Standing.

The Practical Hunter Long Course will be shot on the 200 meter Big Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

The Practical Hunter Short Course will be shot on the 100 meter Field Pistol range with the standard targets at their normal ranges. The standard FP straight wall cartridges only.

The Practical Hunter .22LR Course will be shot on the 100 yard Small Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

Class Rules

Any hunting style handgun with a maximum overall length of 21 inches.

Optics are allowed up to a maximum of 6x power.

Gun must be as manufactured with only cosmetic modifications

Ported barrels are allowed as long as they are shot from a safe position.

A rest such as a bipod or a sandbag supporting the barrel in a prone position may be used by a new unclassified shooter and by shooters in classes A and AA.

The New Silhouetter Sight-In Days and Big Bore Half-Scale

The words "same time next year" can refer to an old Alan Alda film, the annually dreaded April 15 or to the great migration that occurs annually at Falls Township Rifle and Pistol Association (FTRPA). Of course I'm not talking about winged flocks or prancing herds, but rather the perennial sojourn of shooters to our sight-in days. For those of us who shoot all year round and have regular access to gun clubs, we sometimes forget about the millions of casual shooters, many of them hunters, who fire just a couple of shots per year and lack a practical means of determining whether their guns are sighted-in year to year. For these folks, we annually open our doors to the public for sight-in days and I've been a member of the club crew hosting the event for a number of years now. I look forward to helping people get their guns on target and I also like the entertainment value of watching how others shoot.

The skill sets of these folks cover the gamut of poor to impressive. On the impressive side, some shooters are there just to confirm a previous year's zero and at 100 yards print a sub-MOA group within a reasonable point of aim. For others, "group" is an inappropriate word; "pattern" would be more descriptive. One to the right, another to the left very high, the next one off the target board, and so forth. So many of these people are going to be in the woods and fields that if I were a hunter, I would give it up!

For those that are off the target board, a boresighter can get them there very quickly. This year, I gave Laserlyte's Kryptonite Laser Bore Sighting System a good workout. I've reviewed several Laserlyte products in this column in the past, all positively and the Kryptonite System does not stray from on the Brand's typical upscale quality.

Like other Laserlyte systems, this Bore-sighter inserts in the business end of the barrel, using a series of interchangeable adapters for anything from .22-.50 caliber. That makes it a useful tool for pistols as well as rifles. In addition, there are adapters that can accommodate 12 gauge or 20 gauge shotguns, a real plus for all the pump action slug guns that show up at our sight-in days.

The advantage of the Kryptonite system is its green laser, which, according to Laserlyte, is 100 more times visible to the human eye than traditional red lasers. I don't know how that 100 times is measured, but it is clearly more visible, especially in brighter light. Having both red and Kryptonite systems with me, some fellows at the club assisted in aiming them side by side at increasing distances. The farther out we went, the green laser got the nod. The most common comment was along the lines of "who woulda thunk"? Anyway, that's the way it is. While the traditional red systems work just fine (and are less expensive), if I were to have no laser system at all and I were in the market for one, I'd definitely go the Kryptonite route. On the other hand, if your shooting conditions avail themselves to traditional red laser sighting, then the non-Kryptonite systems put out by Laserlyte are fine as well.

This year, in addition to running the sight-in days, we reinstituted a turkey shoot which has not been run at FTRPA in quite a while. We tried to keep it simple, having plaster turkey heads painted in blaze orange at 100 yards or a proportionately larger red balloon heart in a cardboard deer at 200 yards. All shooting was from a standing position. The shooter could choose either target, using any of the following: Rifle shooting .243 or larger cartridge; slug gun using smoothbore Foster

slugs or rifled Sabot slugs; or pistol, having 6" or longer barrel firing a conventional straight-wall centerfire handgun cartridge. Scopes were limited to 4x or a variable set at no greater than 4x.

We kept the entry fee reasonable in relation to the cost of a turkey prize, worrying just a bit about a handful of named IHMSA shooters who could wipe us out and send us deeply into the red. Nevertheless, we ran the event anyway; none of the "dreaded" good shooters showed and very few entrants hit the mark. Most of the turkey heads that were destroyed were by us crew members, practicing when things got slow during the day. I even hit a few myself.

For slow time, most of us bring something to shoot ourselves and I find this is a great time to get some sight settings, especially on guns that I haven't shot in quite a while or new loads for other guns. It's been a couple of years since I mounted a scope on my S&W Model 629. This 44 Magnum revolver with its 8-3/8" barrel was the first gun I ever shot in IHMSA competition, firing Big Bore and Field Pistol, an 80 round day that showed me the way toward more suitable IHMSA cartridges. For me, it's a fun gun up to about 25 rounds or so and it frequently languishes in the safe for long periods of time between range sessions. I had decided to change the iron sights to glass, mounted the scope and then hopped onto another project, never getting it sighted. So, during a lull in the action, I heated up the barrel pretty well with both full house loads and many more tempered to about 44 Special power. The reduced loads will be suitable for Field Pistol. I haven't shot Field Pistol Any-Sight in some time and am looking forward to getting back in that game next year.

In addition to an assortment of other guns, I also brought out my .17HMR outfit that I described over June and September last year. Since my last outing, I've accumulated some more loads beyond the eight reported. Included were Winchester's 17 grain V-MAX and Hornady's 15.5 Grain NTX. These two were brought to the sight-in days, just for fun.

My first thing was to see where they were hitting. Since wringing out the eight loads reported in September, I had not changed my last 100-yard zero. Five shots of each load printed sub-MOA groups, both slightly to the right of dead center aim, the NTX holes being slightly lower and a bit more open (still, less than an inch center to center), not surprisingly, the NTX bullets, being lead free and naturally weighing less than more traditional lead-based bullets. Even in a mild wind, 15.5 grains of anything is subject to more movement. With just a few clicks, I brought the Winchester 17 grain V-MAX load directly on target. Since the wind was a bit erratic, I decided to go my next route with the heavier bullet.

Now the really fun part began. I took the outfit to the turkey shoot position. Although not qualified for the official shoot since it did not meet the .243 caliber minimum, hitting a few heads from an offhand position was exhilarating. No, I did not hit every one; in fact, had I been following the official entry rules that allowed only three shots, I would have gone broke. But enough bullets met their intended target. In a few cases, I barely nicked the head and just like larger bullets that found their plaster-of-Paris mark, a chip was removed. However, the V-MAX bullets that found a solid mass powdered the head spectacularly, as a varmint bullet should. As I said, this was a lot of fun.

Looking back over my stats in last year's shooting matches, I just about held my own in Sporting Clays and took a real nosedive in CMP. About the only area where I made some headway is Big Bore Any-Sights Half Scale. I finished the year with two 38s in December and a solid AAA classification. Better, I even know why they weren't both 40s.

I put my toes in the Half-Scale water several years ago with my regular Big Bore 7mm TCU outfit. While some may subscribe to the adage that there is no such thing as too much gun, this is really overkill for the task at hand in Half-Scale. Keeping my ears to the ground, the wisdom at the time pointed to the 22 Hornet and I then acquired a 14" barrel for my T/C Contender. Using the same loads I had been using in my 10" Field Pistol barrel in 22 Hornet, I tried these 55 grain bullets with abysmal results. The bullets would destabilize, especially past 150 meters. I tried adjusting the powders, but in some cases, I couldn't even hit the target board at 200 yards even if I got reasonable turkey groups at 150 meters.

I've never slugged this barrel, but being of modern manufacture, I'd guess it to be 1:12 twist or 1:14 at the outside. To my knowledge, only some very old 22 Hornet barrels might be found in 1:16. Even at 1:14, a standard 55 grain FMJ should be okay, but in this barrel, it is not so. Unless a bullet is a flat-nosed cylinder (a la wadcutter), some twist rate data are in the realm of dark art, at best. We usually relate appropriate twist rate with bullet weight alone. However, bearing surface and overall length of the bullet are just as important. If the ogive is gradual as opposed to sharp, the bullet will have a longer overall length and a shorter bearing surface. Rather than dwell on the issue, I decided that the most expeditious thing to do was go to a lighter (therefore shorter) bullet.

Contemporary offerings of loaded 22 Hornet ammunition from the Big Three (Federal, Remington and Winchester) have bullets ranging from 30 grains to 46 grains. The only bullet weight common to all three is 45 grains. So that's where I started,

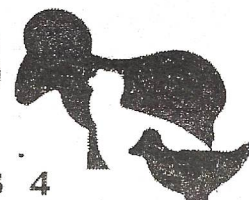

with a Winchester Super-X. Returning to the range, as expected, I had absolutely no problems with stabilization. So I began handloading with bullets more appropriate than 55 grains. While I'm guessing that I could have been successful with 50 grain or even the less ubiquitous 52 and 53 grain bullets extant, I decided to go the other way on weight and honed in on 40 grain bullets, especially Nosler's Ballistic Tip and Sierra's BlitzKing. To date, these two bullets are working fine and wring out all the accuracy of the T/C Contender barrel when loaded over 12.5 grains of Hodgdon's Li'l Gun powder.

As far as Li'l Gun is concerned, it is the only powder I currently use for the 22 Hornet and that's the only single-cartridge powder on my bench. I've always preferred multi-purpose powders, ones that can be used for a variety of loads, but Li'l Gun, originally developed just for the .410 Bore Shotgun, has proven to be a superb powder in the 22 Hornet. I was first advised of this by Chris Hodgdon shortly after Li'l Gun was introduced and my enthusiasm is mirrored throughout website blogs and other sources. It is so good that I abandoned my multi-purpose powder philosophy to make this one an exception.

Some shooters have asked me as to the adequacy of 40 grain bullets in Half-Scale. While I know this weight to be theoretically marginal for the rams, I have yet to ring one. True, there has been a skipped heartbeat or two between the shot and the hesitant topple, but in the end, all my hit rams have fallen. I may try some 45 grain bullets in the future since I have them on hand, but the 40s have been adequate thus far.

Earlier, I had mentioned that I knew why I had blown perfect scores. In my first relay, two turkeys avoided the Hornet projectile due to vision issues. I normally shoot extended handguns with my cross-dominant left eye. I just had some focus issues on this day and I saw slight doubling of the very thin reticle of the scope on the first bank of turkeys. Add to this the fact that the turkey targets were half in sun and the other half in shade and my slowness in switching eyes and my score was limited to the attained 38. By the time the targets were reset, I made the decision to switch to my right eye and the difficult reticle and poor lighting were now manageable.

On my re-entry, I lost the fifth pig of the first bank by pulling the shot. I thought I was running out of time and rushed the shot; as typical, I had plenty of time and I just blew it for nothing. I was getting tired and subsequently sloppy on a second bank turkey, setting my ceiling and achievement at another 38 score. If I can just be more

careful during 2011, I'll be shooting 40s and make INT in this category. All in all, I like this Big Bore Half Scale event and the 22 Hornet is a superb cartridge for it. It's accurate, has sufficient knockdown power and is gentle on the shooter. There are good choices in bullets and at least one very superior powder. Who could ask for more?

Physically Challenged Report

I'm currently working with a shooter to find a suitable adaptation to a disability that has developed. The challenges involved in coming up with a suitable adaptation are illustrative of the purposes of the Physically Challenged program and the workings.

The guiding principle in designing a suitable adaptation is the mission statement of the Physically Challenged program: "The mission of the Physically Challenged Program is to give a physically challenged person whatever is needed to compete with the able-bodied person – no more and no less."

This particular shooter is a long time IHMSA shooter who shoots from the traditional Creedmoor position. The disability that has developed prevents the shooter from being able to use the leg against which the gun rests. Keeping in mind the mission statement of the PC Program, here are some of the thoughts for developing a suitable adaptation.

A "replacement leg" should have as many of the same characteristics of the leg of an able-bodied shooter. This includes dealing with bracing the gun against a slant and the susceptibility of the leg moving in a strong wind.

An able bodied shooter has the advantage of using the leg muscles to control the leg against which the gun is braced. An adaptation for a physically challenged shooter will need to provide a substitute for the control provided by the able bodied shooter's leg muscles.

The device for providing a "substitute leg" should not go so far as to be the same as a rest like a sandbag on a bench. This would be providing more than the able bodied shooter.

The adaptation may have to change as the disability worsens. (This particular shooter's disability has the potential of becoming more of a physical challenge.)

The shooter and I as well as some of the experienced disabled shooters have been kicking around ideas and are still working on the adaptation. One thing I have learned is that many of these adaptations may vary from individual to individual depending on the nature of the physi-

cal challenge. I've also seen that there is a lot I don't know about medical conditions. Fortunately I go to church with my personal general practitioner so I have an opportunity to ask for general information medical conditions. It is also why we ask for a doctor's statement for the particular physically challenged shooter. This helps the PC program understand the physical challenge and documents the challenge for which the adaptation is authorized.

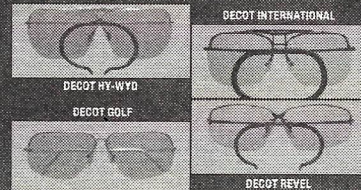

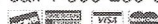

Steel Target Maintenance

The following article was originally published in the December 1, 2010 edition of the Shooting Wire and is reprinted here with permission.

Steel Target Maintenance

Editor's Note: Today's timely maintenance information comes to The Shooting Wire from MGM Targets. Mike Gibson offers some thoughts on how to make your steel targets last longer and perform better.

Someplace back in time, maybe 50 years ago, U.S. Steel developed a product affectionately known as T-1, designated by the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) as A-514. Sometime after that, shooters decided it was a great steel to use for targets. It did a great job then, but there are better products out there now. The catch is, virtually all of them are heat hardened steels, so there are some complications related to repairing them.

The easiest and best way to repair damage to steel targets is to purchase steel that isn't easily damaged. Pretty basic, but frequently overlooked while trying to save a relatively inconsequential amount of money. That's why we at MGM Targets use the 500 Brinell hardness steel (with the exception of our .22 targets) on everything we sell. AR500 plate can range in hardness from 460-530. At MGM we only accept steel rated 495 or higher.

(If your organization has old steel, like most do, we hope the information that follows will help you make better repairs until you can replace the old stuff. If you have any questions, please feel free to call us at 888-767-7371. We'll be glad to help in any way we can.)

One of the most misunderstood, or overlooked factors impacting target life is heat. Virtually all target steel in use today is "quenched and tempered", meaning that at the time it is rolled (at the mill) it is heat treated. The chemical content of

the steel certainly plays a big role in target life, but any heat applied after the mill heat treatment will adversely affect the life of your targets. This stuff isn't mild steel, so you can't treat it as such.

There are some manufacturing processes that affect hardened steel during fabrication. The first thing that comes to mind is the cutting process. The hardened steel cuts nicely with an oxy-acetylene torch, but the heat that is put into it when the torch travels at 30-40 inches per minute is significant. At MGM we cut all of our steel with a laser. The heat affected zone is about .0005" or about the thickness of two sheets of paper and basically only at the extreme edge of the target. You'll never notice it under pistol fire, but it can be seen to an extent when you begin to hit the edges with high power rifle rounds.

If you have to repair cracks, our recommendation is to use the edge of a grinder to grind the crack out, all the way to the bottom. You may need to grind some from both sides, rather than all from one side. If you don't remove the cracked material, and just weld over a crack, the life you'll get out of the repair will probably be half (or less) than if you do it right. It is unreasonable to think that your repair will never crack again. You have a heat treated hardened area, coupled to a chemically hard but soft area (softened by the heat you introduced into it), coupled to a soft weld area. "Ductility" is the technical word describing the rates with which metals flex or bend. The ductility of the three areas of your repair is all different. You WILL get another crack there. The only question is, when? If you are the person who did the welding, don't take it personally. Without the technology, welding facilities, (and expense) of NASA, everyone should expect a new crack at some point in the future. Like death and taxes, it's inevitable.

When you weld on any heat treated material, use multiple small, hot beads, rather than a large one. The object is to limit the amount of heat you put into the steel as much as possible. Let the first weld get cold enough to touch before you make the second pass, or before you make a pass on the other side. This will minimize what is technically called the "heat affected zone", and consequently minimize the amount of temper that is removed from the parent material. Heat on mild steel has very little effect but it is critical when you are working with heat hardened steel. If someone delinquently or intentionally shoots a hole in one of your targets and you have to fill the area, you've got two real problems. First, all of the area surrounding the weld repair (or plug) will be softened because of the welding heat. Second, your welding filler material will be the same hardness as mild steel. The trouble with this is you have a spot of 135 Brinell hardness on your target. This is going to significantly crater the first time it sustains a direct hit from a .38 Super, or something similar. Your welding supply store may be able to suggest a much harder filler metal than the traditional E-7018 or E70S-6 wire, but it's never going

to be as hard as it was before the repair.

You half the replacement cost of the targets, or more, especially if you have to pay freight there and back. Additionally, they usually need to know specifically what type of steel you have and what you want done to it. They might be able to recommend a generic treatment, but it is a safe bet they aren't going to guarantee anything without knowing the specific chemical composition of the material. If you are the original purchaser of the material, you can probably find that out from your supplier. If the purchaser has moved on and you can't locate the source of the steel you may be out of luck.

If you want to really lengthen the life of your steel target make sure you turn your target as soon as it gets a curve in it. Hard steel will go convex (bulge toward the shooter) soft steel will go concave (bulge away from the shooter). Turning your target will double the life expectancy of a steel target. TURN YOUR STEEL. We don't have all the answers, but we'll be glad to help you to the best of our ability. Just give us a call at 888-767-7371.

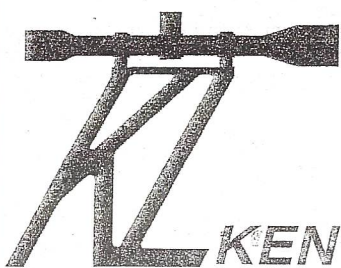

Rule Change Notice

In accordance with the need to periodically review and amend the price cap to insure the integrity of the production class as well as assure availability of suitable guns to shooters, the IHMSA Board of Directors has voted to adjust the price cap on the Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) on the Production Class Air Pistol to \$375 U.S. This rule will take effect immediately upon being published in the November/December 2010 issue of the *IHMSA News*.

Effective immediately, Section VI: Handguns, Part A. Production, Paragraph 19 of the Rule Book is as follows:

"No Production AIR Pistol shall have a manufacturer's suggested retail price greater than \$375.00 U.S., based on MSRP. This cap shall be reviewed and amended for inflation as needed to insure the integrity of the production class.

"No AIR Pistol will be re-categorized solely on the basis of movement in the MSRP or the price cap. The re-categorization of an AIR Pistol will require a vote from the board after a recommendation from the evaluation committee. The list of approved production AIR Pistols is available on the IHMSA web site or from the evaluation committee."

Note that this rule will apply to newly introduced air pistols and current AIR Pistols that were not previously classified as Unlimited based on the MSRP and price cap in effect when the pistol (or Production Pistol category) was introduced. As the rule states, "No AIR Pistol will be re-categorized solely on the basis of movement in the MSRP or the price cap." A pistol will have to be re-evaluated by the evaluation committee and voted on by the Board to change from the Unlimited to Production category.

Part of the reasoning for setting the current amount is based on the planned price point for a production class pistol with competitive sights that one of the airgun manufacturers is planning to introduce. This was compared against the MSRP of the most common production AIR Pistol, the Daisy 747, and the price of the aftermarket sights commonly seen on this model in competition.



- The Weaver Trophy:**
Scoped centerfire handguns. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.
- The Merit Challenge:**
Centerfire handguns with iron / open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.
- The Daisy Avanti Trophy:**
Air Production guns with Iron /Open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.
- General Rules:** All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver, and Merit classes.
- Witness:** Winning groups must be witnessed by an IHMSA or NRA member.. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooter's IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.
- Targets:** Targets submitted must contain no more and no less than 5 shots in each bull zone.



There is still time to send in any scores from this year, so please let me know and I will get them posted. I know from reading the *IHMSA News* that there are more qualifying scores out there but I need someone to submit them. Since there is nothing much going on I will post the instructions for making the Big Bore Records Programs.

There are 5 categories in the BBRP, these are:

2. 35+ Unlimited Standing is the same way, shoot a 35 or better score in an entry marked as Unlimited Standing (this can be shot with open sights but is usually done with a scope).

3. 60+ Standing Agg is the total of the Standing and Unlimited Standing scores, 60 or better qualifies.

4. Presidents 100 club also known as the 3-gun aggregate. This category uses the scores totaled from 3 guns, Standing and the highest scores from 2 guns in Production, Unlimited, Revolver, or Unlimited Standing.

5. Presidents 140 club also known as the 4-gun aggregate. This category uses the scores totaled from 4 guns, Standing and the highest scores from 3 guns in Production, Unlimited, Revolver, or Unlimited Standing.

The State totals for 2010 are: OR-10, CA-10, OH-5, CO-5, NC-3, GA-3, IN-4, WA-2, TX-2, WY-2, MT-1, MI-1, AK-1, VA-1

Please bring at least one friend or acquaintance to every match. Together, we can keep IHMSA growing.

In Small Bore UAS, Dave Calloway scored a 40+10, with Don Leisure just 3 shoot-offs behind him. John Maple topped the Field Pistol shooters and made the 60 Club with a 30 in Production, and a 33 in PAS.

I always look at the last match of the season with mixed emotions. On one hand I won't have

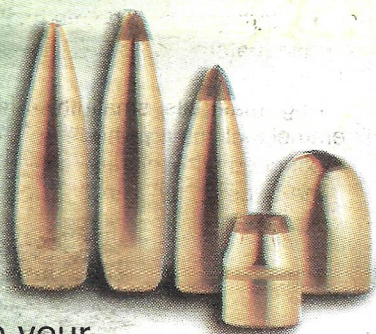

WORKING UP A LOAD FOR

Now before you think I've gone completely mad, let me explain. I have had many shooters ask me what brand of 22 ammo I shoot in my Small Bore guns and I've seen numerous postings on the various website message boards asking similar questions. What ammo is the most accurate for a Buckmark or a Ruger revolver, etc? If you think there is one brand over another that will shoot more accurately you are correct. The only problem is that it not only depends on the make and model of the gun, but each individual gun or barrel. I have two 10" Thompson Center Contender 22 Match barrels that are both very accurate; however they are the most accurate with two completely different brands of ammo.

The secret to an accurate Small Bore gun is not much different from getting the most out of your center fire gun. It involves finding a bullet and powder combination that it likes the best. Except in the case of your Small Bore gun the ammo is already loaded for you. Now that being said, there was a time back in the day when men braver than I would carefully pull bullets from 22 rimfire cartridges and swap out powder or bullets then gingerly reassemble them, but current IHMSA rules restrict that practice these days. So, the only way to really find out is to conduct some good old fashion scientific "trial and error."

Many shooters are of the opinion that the more expensive the ammo the better the groups it will shoot and in some cases that is true. However, I have found over the years of playing this game that there are many instances where you can get some very accurate results without having to mortgage the farm to buy a case of 22 ammo. I have somewhat of a budget when it comes to shooting and I try to work within my means as much as possible. So the less I spend per round means more rounds to shoot per dollar, which equals much more fun. I have found the best way to approach this "experiment" is to first set some parameters. There are three main factors I consider when choosing a brand of 22 ammo. First is the accuracy in that particular firearm at 100 yds. Second is the cost of that accuracy in relation to all the brands tested. Third is not as important as the first two, but still a factor and that is trying to use similar ammo for multiple guns. Of the six Small Bore categories that I regularly shoot I usually can get by with just three types. For shoot-offs or Regional matches I'll add a fourth.

So let's look at the first two parameters more closely. I always test ammo at 100 yards or meters. That is the maximum distance for Small Bore and that is where you need to see what the bullet is doing. I have found many times that ammo that shoots dime size groups at 50 will sometimes open up to 12" or more at 100. If you're testing at any closer distance you could be just wasting time and ammo. Being somewhat budget minded brings into play the second parameter. I like to test a variety of different brands but still have my budget to think of. This is where you have to make some decisions. How much are you willing to spend and just how accurate does your pistol have to be for our game? If you asked a dozen people you would most likely get a dozen different answers so I will just give you my criteria. I like to do most of my testing with what I refer to as "mid-priced" ammo. I usually avoid the bulk pack bargain basement varieties that most manufacturers offer. Mainly because I have found it to be very inconsistent from batch to batch. It might test great at first, but then the next brick or bulk box you buy is very different or you may get a few "fliers" off and on. Although I know of a few shooters that use it, and still do ok with it. I am also too



cheap to shoot the super high end stuff on a regular basis. I have one pistol that groups well with a mid-priced brand, WOLF Target, but produces incredibly small groups with Eley EPS. I shoot the WOLF 90% of the time but for big matches and shoot offs I'll pull out the pricey stuff. So how accurate is accurate enough? If I can find a mid range ammo (\$4 to \$6 dollar for a box of 50) that will consistently give me groups close to 2" at 100 I'll call it good. If it's an UAS or U gun where there is a good possibility of having to "shoot off" then I will also test for ammo that would hopefully get me in the 1" or less range. This will be a personal choice for you based on what categories you shoot and what your demands are. If you are happy with 3" groups and are just shooting the standard Small Bore targets then go with it. If you plan to shoot the "runts" (Fifth-Scale) or get into shoot off situations a lot, then you are going to need to get the most accuracy you can from your pistol. When considering the third parameter I will usually just start my testing of a new gun or barrel with ammo brands that I am currently using in other pistols. If I get acceptable accuracy then that's a plus. If not, then it's back to the drawing board

and I start testing other brands and types.

So how does one go about finding the right ammo for a particular pistol? I try and remove as many of the "variables" as possible. Some, but not all, variables can be: wind and weather, gun movement, target visibility, trigger control, and bore condition.



The first item on the list, wind, can be a real accuracy killer. I try and do my testing all on the same day and in the same weather conditions, preferably a nice calm clear day. If you test one brand with a strong wind and another in calm weather, you really can't be sure if the group will be an accurate representation of that ammo. What if you have a great 9 shot group and get a flier, was it a gust wind or the ammo? Remove the variables! Although most rim fire ammo is not real temperature sensitive, extreme temperature changes can affect performance also, so I try and test in weather that is similar to what I will be shooting in. If you do all your testing in the cold of winter, but do most of your shooting in the hot summer months you may get some inconsistencies.

To eliminate gun movement I use a combination of sand bags or an adjustable front rest and a sand bag under the grip. If you use an adjustable rest be sure it has some way to secure the forend of the pistol. Use either a "rabbit ear" type bag or a soft rubber "V" notch to keep it free of any movement. The object here is to remove as much tilting, side to side, and up and down movement as possible. I prefer to totally secure the pistol with sandbags as in the photo. It holds well and allows great consistency from one shot to the next.

For target visibility I recommend mounting the highest magnification rifle scope you own on the pistol with a good solid base and ring system. Since the recoil of the 22LR is minimal a rifle scope can be used and has definite advantages over using open sights or even a pistol scope. Higher magnification allows you to be more accurate in sighting the same point on your target for each shot. I like to use a target that either has a very small dot to aim at or one that has vertical and horizontal lines on it to line up with the crosshairs in the scope. Again, being consistent shot to shot is paramount.

Trigger control can make a huge difference in your ability to consistently obtain the same point of aim shot after shot. Be certain that you are not moving the gun while squeezing the trigger and be very diligent to hold the gun in the same way with as little pressure as possible for each shot. Having a fairly light trigger with little or no creep is a must. I had a friend that was doing some ammo testing on his Contender. He called and said he had tested over ten different types (even some high end brands) and wasn't getting any of them to group much better than 5" to 6" at 100yds. He asked if I would give it a try with my set up. I met him at the range and after the first shot from his gun realized the problem. His pistol had about a 5 pound trigger pull with a lot of creep that felt like dragging a lead brick over cobble stones. We swapped his barrel to one of my frames and the groups immediately tightened right up.

In regards to bore condition, it can be debated for months as to whether or not to clean, how to clean, and what to clean with, for Small Bore barrels, but for ammo testing I am more concerned about consistency rather than method. I will explain the method I use when testing and why I do it. I think, whether you believe in cleaning or not, it is important to start with the same "condition" of barrel with each brand or type of ammo you are going to test. To do this I clean the chamber and bore with a brush and solvent, then run 4 or 5 patches down it. I will do this, keeping the same procedure each time; at the end of testing one brand, before starting to test the next. I then shoot 3 or 4 "fouling shots" with the next brand before putting it on paper for group. Each type or brand of ammo can have a different lube, lead

alloy, plating, etc. and I want to be certain that I am testing just that one type without any residue left from the previous one. I like to shoot at least 10 shot groups as this will give you a very good idea of what you can expect out of that particular brand. If I am testing many different types of ammo I will start off at 50yds. to "weed out" some of the less accurate ones. Then when I have three or four types that have promise, I'll set up and shoot them again at 100yds. to find the best.

If you are diligent, be consistent in your testing methods, and try to remove as many "variables" as possible during your testing, you will have an excellent chance of finding a brand or type of rimfire ammo that will give you excellent accuracy in your particular pistol. You might just find that you don't have to spend \$15 to \$20 a box to get also! One last tip; once you've found the "perfect load" purchase as much of that one lot number that you can afford. Sometimes even the mid to high priced ammo will vary slightly from one lot to another. Also, when you restock, do a quick accuracy test to see if the new lot is still shooting as well as the last. If you have a year or two's worth stockpiled of the same lot number, you can shoot with confidence that your ammo won't be the reason if you miss a target.

Speed Loading the Bikal 46M

I am "The New Silhouetter" when it comes to the IHMSA game and it certainly has been a learning experience. I unpacked my old NRA Hunter Pistol equipment and went to the Nebraska State matches at Holdridge this year. I shot ammo loaded in 1991, trusted the scope setting still on the old ten inch contenders, and actually managed to hit some of the targets. I must admit not setting targets in the IHMSA matches is much more fun than not setting targets in the NRA matches. The NRA unset targets are simply the ones you missed and you had to walk down there anyway, the IHMSA range all the targets were set automatically. My heartfelt thanks to the match directors and the staff of the Holdridge range for all the hard work building the range apparatus and setting up the very well attended event.

Usually winter is a down time for competition here in the northern climates but one Michael Kunkee of the Isaac Walton League in Lincoln sets up the organizations clubhouse for the Air gun Silhouette Matches once a month. Same venue, auto set targets, illuminated backstops, and a five hour window to shoot your matches. I had always wanted to own one of the Bikal MP-46P Free Pistols and Mike's matches provided the perfect format to own this fine piece and keep myself in marksmanship trim. The price and accuracy of these instruments is amazing but as with all single shots there is one drawback; getting the pistol loaded for five firing sequences in the time allotted is very difficult.

I have substantial hands, and an arthritic thumb. On many occasions my last shots are rushed or never get sent downrange due to the time restraint caused by fumbling the loading sequence, picking up the dropped pellet, examining which end of the pellet to put in first, and once more picking up the dropped pellet, etcetera. I am sure that someone makes some sort of device to load these pistols rapidly but I have done some rudimentary searching and nothing seems to fit the bill.

With the month between these matches and my current retired status I spent some time experimenting and wish to share with you the possible solution to the time constraints inherent to loading the Bikal 46 while shooting the unlimited standing matches.

The pressure transfer gate opens to accept the pellet and leaves a space between the breach and the frame of one inch. (That is 2.54 centimeters for you, comrade.) The longest pellet I have found in my arsenal is the Daisy Pointed Field at .221" so that leaves me about three quarters of an inch thickness to manufacture something to "hold" the pellet for loading.

Everything about a pellet, the skirt, the nose, the integrity of the bore riding surface and the diameter is critical to getting it to strike the point of aim consistently; that list deletes almost any part of the pellet you can "grab" or "hold" without disfiguring the soft lead and altering the flight characteristics. The hollow cavity does provide the solution. A short peg of small diameter protruding through and perpendicular to a flat surface will "hold" the pellet for insertion freely into the breach. A small nail driven through a quarter inch board, filled to a length to match the depth of the pellet cavity worked perfectly for my "prototype." For reasons that will become evident in the illustration the "peg" must be no more than .200" from the edge of the flat surface and if you use multiple pegs they can be no closer together than half an inch.

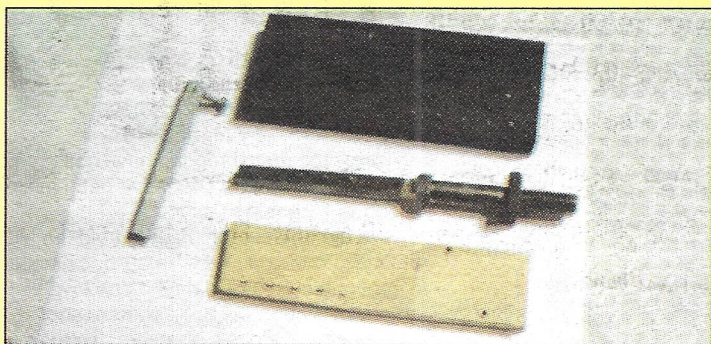
The list of materials to build this device is less than five dollars and while some fairly critical dimensions exist they can be obtained by filing, grinding or considering expense, starting over. The materials list includes.

Base material 1/4" to 3/8" thick. I tried oak, cattle floor rubber mat, and a piece of 3/8" key stock.

"Peg" materials, small finish nails, and spare de-capping pins (cut in half with a Dremmel tool cutting wheel) from my reloading dies.

Extended nut, bolt, and a regular nut.

The pegs (nails) can be ground or filed to length after driven through the pre-



drilled and located positions in the base, the de-capping pins were simply JB Welded into the drilled holes and the selected pellet was used to push the pin in till the skirt contacted the key stock base.

Loading procedure;

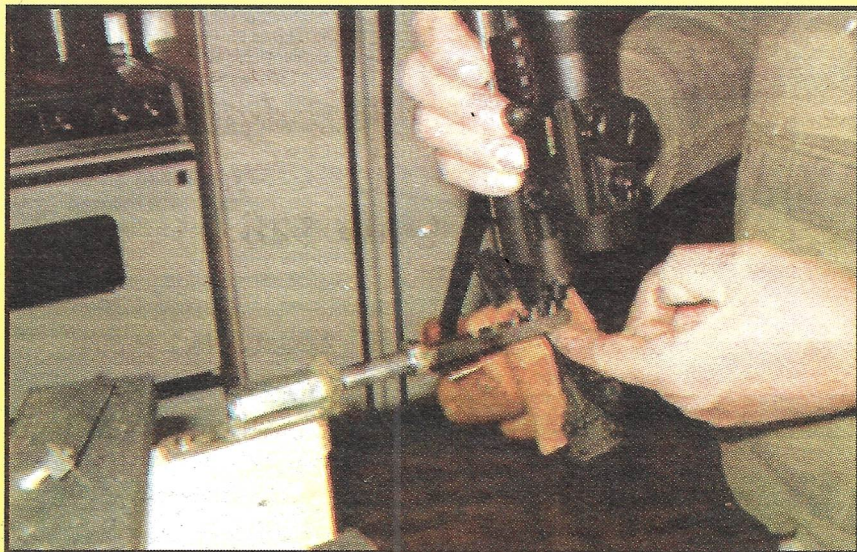
During the ready, place five pellets onto the pegs.

Cycle the pump arm of the 46M to open the loading gate.

Tip the pistol vertically and maneuver the breach over the peg-retained pellet.

Feel the pellet into the breach and use the action of lowering the pistol to insert it completely into the chamber. Note: it helps to place your index finger on the back side of the base material as a tactile index and support.

Lift the pistol free, close the loading gate, and initiate your firing sequence; repeat.



Since I have built and used this apparatus my practice scores have gone up, not because it improved my marksmanship, but I no longer drop shots due to the cease fire command. One other benefit to the multiple peg configurations is if you are practicing without a spotter you always can glance at the device and see which target you should be engaging.

The only limitation on this is that the match director cannot win it himself without satisfying a series of rather complicated requirements involving the transfer of funds which do not concern us here.

The 2010 Rex Cup was awarded to Jeff Hegwald of Kansas for the extremely meritorious reasons that he shot a Half-Scale 40x40 using cast bullets, and then won a shoot-off at 200m on Small Bore chickens. When asked by this reporter what type of cast bullet he used, Jeff launched into a diatribe about the price of gas checks that is not germane to this report.

Once again I would like to thank all of you enthusiastic and unselfish members without whose unstinting assistance another successful season would not have happened. Let's shoot steel next March!

That would mean a single shot weapon would be limited to only two shots, and all weapons would be limited to five shots. You shoot a normal IHMSA Field Pistol course of fire, but there are no skill classifications for "Bordello". You gets your gun and shoots it!

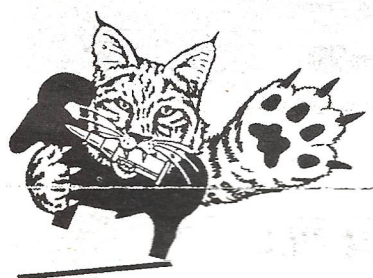

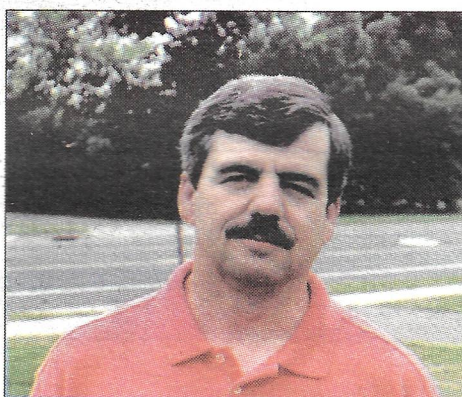

Wildcat Corner

Most of us during the development of our match loads, have found ourselves needing to trim our cases to a specific length. Oddly, most brands of new cases are seldom the listed SAMMI length that we see in loading manuals. They are usually shorter. So the need to trim new cases might be limited unless you desire to have all cases the same length at the start of your loading session. In that case you'd be checking the pile of cases, find the shortest one and then trim the rest to that length.

For the BPCR (black powder cartridge rifle) shooter, there is a desire to have the case the maximum length that will allow a loaded round to be chambered. Black powder operates at lower pressures and it is really important to seal the chamber at the instant of ignition, so they want the end of the case mouth right up into the chamber to help develop the seal needed to produce uniform ignition for each round that is shot. So these guys like to get cases that are just a bit too long so they can custom trim the case to fit a specific rifle's chamber.

Then others (smokeless powder) have to trim their cases because they have grown in length due to repeated firing and stretching of the brass. Cases that are too long will not chamber safely or properly causing safety and performance concerns.

Just about every handloading products company makes some type of case trimmer. Let's take a look at two examples; the Forester and the L.E. Wilson trimmers. I own both so it's interesting to see how they differ.

The current trimming situation I have is the need to trim some 405 Winchester cases to be used in a BPCR that is chambered in .40-70 Sharps Straight. The nominal case length for the .49-70 is 2 1/2". The 405 Winchester is listed at 2.583" but the longest one in the (100) new cases that I have is 2.570". But that's OK. By trimming a case until it will just chamber, I'll be able to determine how long the whole batch should be trimmed to. There were two other options for a parent case for the .40-70; the 30-40 Krag case, which after being re-formed comes out to 2.490" and a brand called Bertram (made in Australia)

which I've not had any experience with.

The first trimmer I owned was the Forester unit. It was my father's and I acquired it after he passed on. The first thing I did was replace the cutter because he had used this thing a lot! But I found over the years that after setting it up and trimming a pile of .41 Mag cases (which are NEVER the SAMMI maximum 1.285" long out of the box), a post trimming spot check revealed variations in the length of the cases, despite having locked the settings quite tightly and trying to be consistent in the use of the tool.

Enter the L. E. Wilson unit. Someone suggested that I try it so I did. Here is where the two units differ. The Forester controls the length of the case after the cutter reaches its maximum extension during cutting and no longer removes material by using a set screw lock ring on the cutter shaft. The L. E. Wilson unit has an adjustable "tail stop" that is adjusted to determine the final length of the newly trimmed case. The cutter is fixed as to how far it extends during cutting for all trimming operations and case lengths so the user does not adjust this stop point. You can retract the cutter shaft to allow insertion of the case and then start the trimming process.

The Forester trimmer uses a small collection of collets and these are positioned in the "tail stock". You insert the case and tighten the collet around the rim of the case until tight. But before you tighten the collet, the cutter pilot is inserted in the case mouth to get the case concentric to the cutter blades. Once you are sure the pilot and the case are aligned, you tighten the collet. Turning the cutter shaft progressively reduces the length of the case. Once the cutter shaft is stopped from going any further forward, the final length of the case has been achieved. The cutter engagement length is controlled by a collar on the shaft that is held in place by a hex head allen screw. There is also a "minor adjustment" that allows the user to

move the stop collar just a small amount to fine tune the final length of the case, which is a helpful feature that the Wilson does not provide.

The Wilson unit has a threaded "tail stop" that is rotated to achieve the final trim-to-length of the case. Once that length is determined an allen head set screw is locked down. Since the Wilson unit does not use a collet to secure the case, it needs another method. This involves a case holder specific to the cartridge. The case is pushed into the case holder which is in-turn placed on the "rails" of the trimmer assembly and the case head is pushed up against the tail stop. A hold down clamp is tightened on the exterior of the case holder and the cutter is turned by hand until the cutter no longer moves forward.

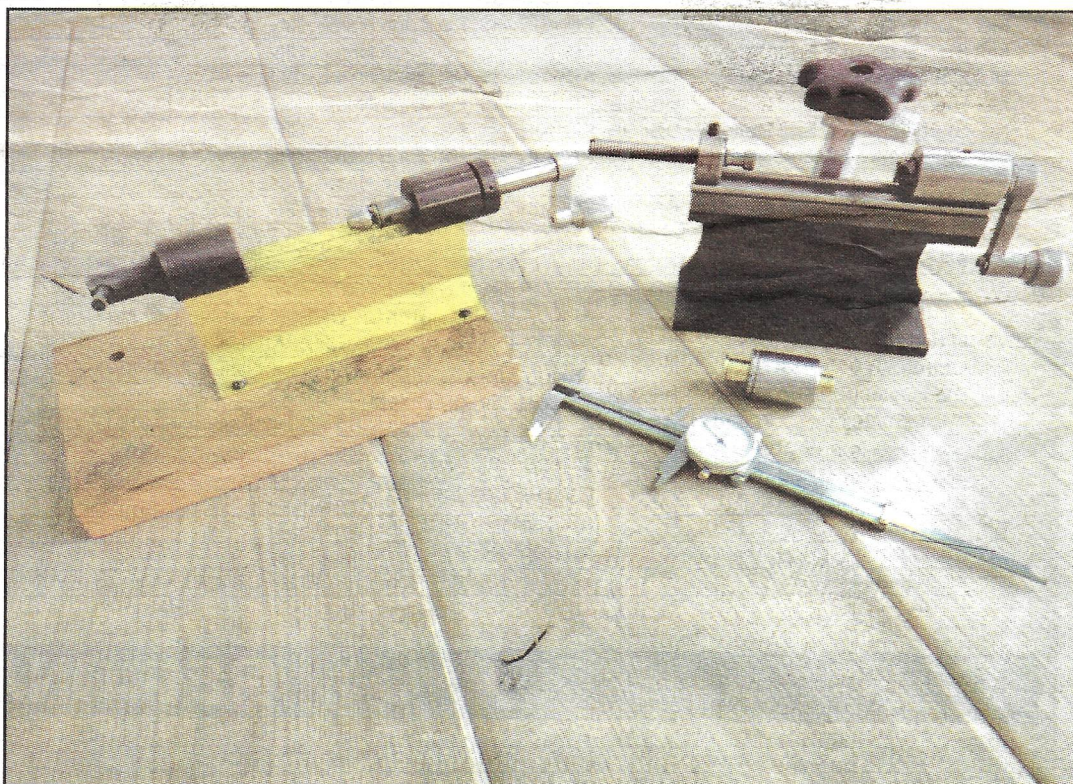
How do the results vary? It has been my experience that the lengths of a collection of trimmed cases that are checked after the trimming is complete, varies more with the Forester unit than the Wilson unit. This could be operator error in not pushing the base of the case into the collet exactly the same each time or not using the pilot on the cutter shaft properly. And the "squareness" of the case mouth with the centerline of the case body of those cases trimmed with the Wilson unit are more consistent. If there is a down side to the Wilson unit, it is the need to have case-specific case holders for each chambering you are working with. In some cases a single case holder can be used with more than one type of case. But the Wilson's slightly better performance outweighs the small cost

of the required case holder. And...the use of some machining or cutting oil is a plus with all case trimmer devices.

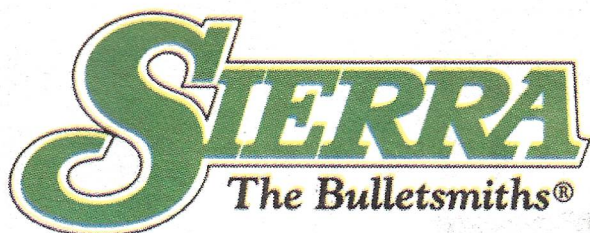
Varying lengths of cases in a specific lot of loaded ammo can have an impact on accuracy. This may be more of a concern with revolver cases or cases where a crimp is applied. Having the crimp occur at different locations along the bullet's "side-wall" can contribute to varying degrees of resistance at the time of ignition. And an "unsquare" case mouth can impart similar varying influences on the bullet during ignition also.

Sinclair, Midway, Midsouth, etc. are some of the sources for the trimmers and accessories mentioned here. Sinclair International offers a well thought-out stand for the Wilson unit along with an easy to use clamping device to hold the case holder in place.

True, nothing is 100%, including case preparation and maybe that's why a hard-core bench rest shooter will take only 8-10 cases to a match with him and load and shoot those "most consistent" cases all day during the match. A lot of work went into identifying those select cases and short of being individually machined out of solid round stock, will be the best that the shooter can come up with. We won't see that practice taking place at a silhouette match but anything we can do to our 40, 60 or 80-rounds used in a silhouette entry will help us be more consistent with our ammunition. And being consistent in many areas will help us produce better scores and have more FUN at our silhouette match!
