## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Up north the cold weather has set in and our outdoor shooting is put on hold until the snow leaves and the ranges reopen mid April. That also means our indoor season is just starting. We have an air pistol silhouette league that runs every other Saturday, weather permitting. Ammo is cheap and no reloading the night before a match.

Just a reminder to get your Freedom Arms Revolver Challenge scores in before the end of the year.

Speaking of end of the year, you need to get your renewals in as soon as possible. We have gone to a calendar year membership so we can send everything out in one mass mailing. That helps keep your membership dues low and the organization growing. Membership renewals received after the mass mailing in March cost the organization more to send as it has to go first class. Make sure your mailing address is correct and your email is current.

We are getting a lot of input on the one year trial set for next year for reflex or red dot sights on production guns and revolvers. During the trial the scores shot with reflex sights will not be eligible for Presidents Club aggregates and for score in championship matches. The jury is out on whether this will be more like a physically challenged correction to allow older (over 60) shooters to shoot on a slightly more even playing field or this will change the makeup of the production class and give those shooters an unfair advantage. That is why this trial is taking place and no matter which side you are on this matter, all I ask is you keep an open mind until we get some hard data on this. Talk to the shooters trying the reflex sight and the match directors who are getting entries with reflex sights. The goal is to keep our members active and shooting more entries. We welcome letters to the editor from both sides of this.

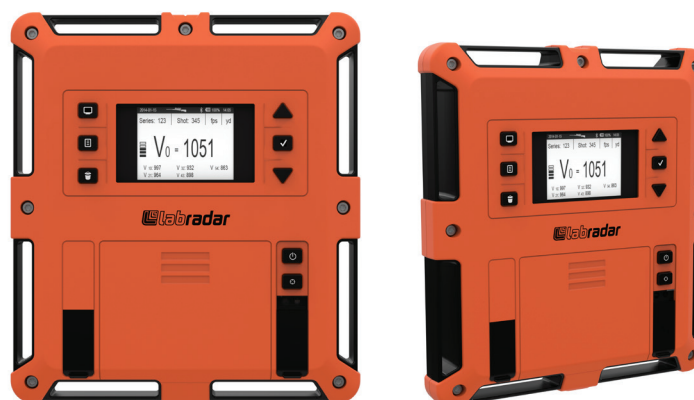

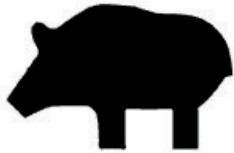

## THE NEW SILHOUETTER

### Jagemann Brass

My very first reloaded cartridges were made using 303 British cases from factory loaded Hansen Cartridge Company ammunition, which as I recall at the time, were made in what was then Yugoslavia. (Yugoslavia ceased to exist as a country back in 1992 and with a few iterations, it is currently broken into Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Kosovo, Montenegro, and Macedonia). I believe the actual manufacturing of the cases I was using was done by Prvi Partizan in what is current day Serbia.

As long as I had a viable cartridge case in my hands I did not pay much attention to brand or quality and took it for granted that all boxer primed cases were pretty much the same. At the time, I was just amazed that I actually produced good ammunition for my British Enfield using a Lee Loader, Remington 180 grain RNSP bullets, Hodgdon BL-C(2) powder and some now forgotten brand primer. While I have come a long way over the years, the process, as with many reloaders, concentrated more on bullets, powders and primers than on cases at first. After all, one of the superior appeals of reloading, at least “apparent” at the time, was the potential cost savings that could be had by reusing brass and only having to buy the remaining components. With that kind of thinking, more attention is paid at first to the components purchased than to the components that are already on hand and free.

In addition to saving my own brass, I joined the phalanx of range scroungers, picking up any yellow metal pieces I could find. Sure, I learned how to process brass, cleaning it, culling out obvious losers, eventually segueing to good practices of inspection, weighing, trimming and the other peripheral operations so necessary for consistency, but it wasn’t until I began buying brass that I really started paying attention to differences in quality.

Interestingly, my first “forced” purchase of brass gave me no choice as to supplier. It was the 7mm BR Remington and there were only 2 choices for brass, both of which were manufactured by Remington. At the time, Remington was still producing the short-lived factory ammo with one 140 grain loading. For my pocketbook it was incredibly cost prohibitive to accumulate any significant quantity this way. Shopping for bulk 7mm BR brass, I found a local dealer who, before giving me the price over the phone suggested I better sit down. When he told me the cost I said he should have told me to sit on the floor because the cost knocked me out of my chair! Nevertheless, it was a much better option than recycling factory loaded cases so that’s the way I went. A nice plus is that the 7mm BR Remington case is quite strong and I get lots of loadings out of a case.

Purchasing 22 Hornet brass was similar although there were more manufacturers of both loaded ammunition and brass cases. Admittedly, 22 Hornet cases are much less expensive but loaded ammunition is pricey. In addition, the 22 Hornet case is weak, damaging easily and stretching more than most cases I shoot. I do not get very many loadings out of these cases, so buying bulk brass is the way to go. As an aside, I have never seen a 7mm BR Remington case laying on the range and the few 22 Hornets missed by their owners are always suspect as to reusability. Also, these two chamberings and like-kind bulk purchase habits are in line with the consistency aspect of reloading. Shooting a round of IHMSA Silhouettes, there is no sense paying attention to all the components except the case. They should all be consistent.

To be sure, I still recycle my own factory loaded cases after firing, but I keep them in separate lots. Some cartridges are more forgiving than other so I may do some selective mixing (especially certain straight-wall pistol cartridges) but those would only be used for casual plinking or other practices (such as trigger control exercises). For matches, everything should always be the same. I’m beyond the point of blaming the equipment or fodder for poor performance. I know it’s me!

New brass comes in three forms: crappy, good and superior. A problem with the first type is that no one markets it like that and there are few no-name brands to avoid. My experience with the crappy stuff is that it comes from bad runs from an otherwise good source. I don’t know how it gets into the consumer pipeline but I have purchased named brass that was good for several purchases and then got a bad batch. Maybe it was sold to distributors as seconds or maybe processing and QC fell asleep, but the few times that has happened to me left a bad taste and I’ve avoided subsequent purchases from that source.





Good brass is available from several sources, the most common being the big producers of factory ammo. Depending on the lot, it can be turned into superior brass by the reloader but may take some work. Consistent weight and internal capacity cannot be fixed so weight sorting is the first order of business. Primer pocket uniforming, flash hole deburring and neck turning can be fixed to a great extent but it does take time and patience.

Superior brass has few if any of the above deficiencies. It is consistent in weight and volume, thickness is even, the primer pockets are uniform, the flash holes are so smooth that they look machined rather than punched, and oh, yes, they are properly annealed. All brass work hardens and the manufacturing process by which cases is made is traumatic to the case in this regard. If the cases are too hard, they will crack easily; if they are too soft, they will crush easily and bullet seating will be a problem.

At this point, let's look at a brief summary of how cases are made, keeping in mind that each manufacturer may do things a bit differently. To begin, cups would be punched out of brass sheets; the cup diameter and thickness depends on the final cartridge to be made. For image, picture something the size of a coin, let's say a quarter, made out of brass. That cup needs to be deep drawn using a series of stampings to gradually draw the side of the cup to form the case body, leaving sufficient thickness for the case head and rim. Multiple annealings need to be done during this process to soften the brass to offset the fact that every time a punch and die are used in the stamping process, the brass hardens and will otherwise crack during the manufacturing process. The case head has to be formed, together with the primer pocket. The flash hole needs to be punched (or machined). For rimless cases, the rim and extractor groove need to be cut. For bottleneck cases, forming dies are used. The overall case needs to be trimmed to size. Now do you see what I mean by trauma? If done to perfection, everything will be consistent within the case and it will be properly annealed. For those manufacturing engineers out there, forgive me if I've misstated anything but I think my one paragraph description is more right than wrong.



So who makes superior brass? The usual choices that come to mind are firms like imports Lapua and Norma and domestic firms Nosler and Hornady. Sometimes inspecting cases from those four makers has become boring due to uniformity. Less frequently, but sometimes, I've also gotten great runs from the big ammo manufacturers, especially Federal, but that's been luck of the draw compared to what I've experienced from the former four names.

Enter Jagemann. While I've been aware of the name for a little while, I've only just gotten some of its product to inspect and use. Just for the heck of it, I asked around at a recent IHMSA match and couldn't find anyone who used it. That's a real shame because the brass I've been inspecting is definitely in the superior class at only a good brass price point. That superior quality comes from Jagemann Sporting Group (Jagemann Stamping Co. of Manitowoc, Wisconsin).

Going through hundreds of bagged cartridge cases in 9mm Luger, 38 Special, 44 Special, 44 Magnum, 45ACP, 223 Remington and 5.56 NATO, the overall lengths within each size had minuscule variances on my dial caliper, the weights on my digital scale stayed well within acceptable deviations and the cuts, including mouth, extractor groove, primer pocket and flash hole were incredibly smooth and burr-free as inspected with jeweler's/printer's loupes ranging from 12x-20x. (If you ever want to inspect metal that you think is smooth, try a 20X loupe; you'll be surprised at the change in "landscape.")

It will take more than just a few shots to evaluate case life, but I anticipate no problems based on how well all the other manufacturing processes have obviously been executed. I'll save that for a future further evaluation. Meanwhile, I did note that the Jagemann website mentions something called Ammonia Vapor Testing, which, among other things, it claims confirms a long life. Additionally, it performs Vickers Hardness Testing at exact locations on the casing base, neck, and head, ensuring durable and reliable performance.

One initial concern I had was availability of the brass. A quick check of a few local shops didn't have any Jagemann brass on the shelves but happily, it is easy to find online. In addition to well known places such as Brownell's, I found several locations, including one in my own town. While there is a good selection of pistol cases, currently the rifle cases are somewhat limited. Hopefully, there will be more choices in the future since, so far, I really like this brass.
