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The 2014 IHMSA World Championship: Site of Great Shooting, Great Work, & Great Fun

Over 80 shooters and getting toward 600 entries crossed the line at the 2014 IHMSA World Championship in Oklahoma City in July.

With cooler temperatures the first few days increasing into very warm temperatures by the end, this year's event was blessed with little wind for the entire 8 days as well as good light conditions, and the shooting results showed the benefit of these conditions.

With around 200 entries more than

last year's World Championship, this event was an obvious success. In addition to the United States, the countries of Australia, Brazil, Canada, and Paraguay were represented.

The annual banquet had many big winners as well. The top prize went to Dave Silva as he was drawn first for a new Ruger handgun. A huge thanks goes out to our many supporters in the industry.

As for some facts concerning the shooting at the World Championship, here are some impressive statistics passed along to me by Jim Fields.

A total of 77 perfect 80x80s were shot, which may be a record in itself. Four 80x80s in fifth-scale is a record. For a breakdown of these perfect scores by discipline:

- 2 were shot in BB Production
- 7 were in BB Unlimited
- 19 were in BB UAS
- 6 were in BB ½ scale
- 7 were in SB Unlimited
- 21 were in SB UAS
- 4 were in SB 1/5 scale
- 4 were in Practical Hunter
- 7 were in Air Pistol

As anyone who has attended a match of this caliber knows, it takes a lot of people to make this happen. Serving as match director, Jim Fields certainly did another fantastic job of putting this together. Jackie Brown and Dave Stone did an incredible job calling the line. Dave even called the line on the 9th day for the 500 meter match. Jim Myers deserves a great deal of credit for coordinating the line officers. Jim doesn't even shoot silhouette, but was there every day, all day. Nancy LaCroix and Cindy Smith kept things organized and in order in the stat house. John Frizzell was there checking guns on and off the line a large number of the days. The target setters worked their tails off, keeping the match going and an incredibly brisk pace as it seems things were usually running ahead of schedule. These are just a few of the many dedicated people who helped make everything work to put on the fantastic event.

A huge thanks goes out to all of the members of the Oklahoma City Gun Club and all the volunteers who made the 2014 IHMSA World Championship a great success.

Update Concerning Recent Perfect Standing Score

As was reported in the August issue of the *IHMSA News*, Joe Cullison fired a 60x60 at the West Coast Championship in Big Bore Unlimited Standing. This was thought to be the first perfect standing score, in that the IHMSA World Records showed no evidence of it, and of the several 20+ year standing shooters who were aware of Mr. Cullison's accomplishment at the time, nobody had ever heard of a perfect standing score. Even the ol' Google search didn't show any evidence of an IHMSA perfect score, though many could be found for NRA matches. I must admit, I found this curious because I couldn't imagine NRA shooters being that much better than IHMSA shooters, knowing how many fantastic and well-accomplished people we have in our sport and our organization.

Well, as it turns out, the NRA may not have better shooters—they just have better record-keeping! Thanks to a few contacts from faithful IHMSA members, as well as the lengthy research performed by Region 1 Director Allan Olsen, it was discovered that this indeed was not the first perfect standing score in IHMSA.

An email from Brian Witzeling was the first one I received, followed by a couple of others, noting that he remembered Jeff Hunt of Kalamazoo, MI shooting a 40x40. When it was brought to our attention that this tremendous feat had possibly been previously accomplished, Allan Olsen took the time to go back through his copies of the *IHMSA News*, dating clear back to 1991, to verify this.

In the beginning of 1999, Blair Hamilton took over the Big Bore Records Program. His June 1999 article indeed reports a 40x40 BB US score by Jeff Hunt

fired on April 25, 1999. Then in the October 1999 edition, he reports Mark Resner (from North Dakota) shooting a perfect score on August 23, 1999 at Bison, SD. In that article, it states that 40x40 as being the 2nd known perfect standing score.

Another informative conversation and great history lesson for me came in a phone call from Lon Pennington. In what turned out to be a quite lengthy conversation, Lon mentioned names such as Marvin Tannehill and Roger Ward as people he believes may have achieved perfection in the standing realm.

While this does not diminish Joe Cullison's great accomplishment—doing something which had seemingly been forgotten or lost to history certainly is an accomplishment—we certainly appreciate the efforts by our members to get this information corrected. It should be noted too that Joe's perfect score was a 60x60 as opposed to the 40x40 scores listed above.

In the near future, I plan to get the existing known records posted in the *IHMSA News*, that way people can see the records we currently have on file. With multiple people conducting the various records programs over the years, one can easily see where maybe something would have gotten lost over time. By posting our existing records, this may bring about other great conversation of times and events which may not be known to current members.

Thanks again for the contacts people have made to me concerning this, to Allan Olsen for his work in researching this, as well as Joe Cullison for performing an accomplishment so exciting that it has allowed us to generate renewed conversation about our sport.

Contender Misfires:

What Causes Them, and What To Do About Them Part 2 of 2 by Mike Bellm

Editor's Note: This is the 2nd part of a great article by Mike Bellm. Part 1 was featured on page 5 of the August edition of the IHMSA News.

Once in awhile a barrel will be too long from the hinge pin back, and the barrel will hit on the breech face before the locking bolts drop down far enough to engage the frame. Not common, but it does happen. You could try to send it to TC, or you can contact me, or take a few judicious strokes with a file on the end of the barrel to correct this. This is rare, so don't go whacking on your barrel until you are sure this is needed.

Once in awhile the chamber is not cut deeply enough for factory ammo or new factory cases, rimmed or rimless. Usually TC chambers are cut amply deep. You are most likely to encounter this problem with custom barrels. Cutting the chamber deeper is the cure if it is for a factory round, best done by someone who knows what he/she is doing with chamber reamers. If it is for a wildcat round, the size die may need to be shortened enough to permit it to push shoulders back farther.

But... 9 times out of 10, **failure to lock up is due to a loose nut on the reloading press—the operator.** Virtually nowhere I have seen are you being told in the mainstream gunzines or by most of your guru buddies about the fact that "give" in the frame lets cases grow in length when fired. If this extra length of the case is not removed, guess what? The case is too long for the chamber. If it is too long for the chamber, guess what? It has to be crammed in by slamming the barrel shut. And if it is severe enough, even slamming the barrel shut will not push the case into the chamber far enough to allow the barrel to close fully and lock up as it should... thus due to the No. 1 cause, cases too long. Then you get misfires.

You must bump shoulders back or eventually be faced with misfires and extraction problems due to cases too long for the chamber.

And by "too long", I am talking about from shoulder to head on bottleneck cases, not the overall case length.

Bottom line is this. The Contender is not a bolt action. Nor is it a fixed barrel single shot rifle. It is a break open design. It does give when fired, and this "give" lets the cases get too long.

And, you CANNOT do an accurate job of adjusting the size die with the barrel on the frame, unless that is, you take steps that I am not going to cover here. With the barrel on the frame, anything you do by the way of size die adjustment is a blind stab in the dark. You can make it work, absolutely, but you won't hit that "sweet spot" where it is just right.

The best results are normally where the case head sticks out of the chamber about .001" LESS than what the gap between the barrel and frame measures, i.e. such that the breech face is not cramming the case forward and up in the chamber

when you close the barrel.

At this point, I refer you to The Experiment Every Contender Shooter Should Perform. Read it, do it, and you will then understand what happens when a case is fired in a Contender. Knowing what happens, you will then see one of the most common, most useful cures for misfires.

And guess what? Your misfire problems will most likely suddenly go away. But don't be too surprised if extraction is easier and accuracy is also better.

Hint: If a case sticks out of the chamber too far because it is too long from shoulder to head, what is the situation when a bullet is seated out too far? Same thing, and the same potential problems.

Another hint: If you continue to fire rounds that are too long and slamming the barrel shut on them is only giving minimal lock up, you stand a strong risk of rounding the locking table in the frame and ruining it. It may be locked up enough to fire, but the minimal contact surface between the locking bolts and the frame cause accelerated wear on the frame at this point. When this happens, the next step is the barrel coming unlocked and flying open when fired.

I think this is a good time to insert my favorite quote:

"Most men occasionally stumble over the truth, but pick themselves up and continue as if nothing had happened."

Many erroneous ideas exist about sizing cases. Many times they work fine for years, whether they are well advised or not. But again, 9 times out of 10 when someone complains of misfires, it is due to not full length sizing cases and doing it correctly. If you understand this point and try other methods, you will at least know what to fall back on when misfires do occur.

The Experiment Every Contender (and Encore) Shooter Should Perform

Step 1:

When the Contender (or Encore) is fired, the frame stretches within its limits of elasticity, then relaxes when the pressure drops. This leaves the fired case longer from shoulder to head than it was before it was fired. You will never see this with the extractor installed, but shooting the barrel without the extractor will show you clearly what happens when a round is fired.

This additional length must be removed when the case is resized, or it will interfere with lockup and cause misfires and accuracy problems.

DO THIS:

Take the barrel off the frame.

Remove the extractor by tapping out the 1/16th roll pin that holds it in.

Drop one of your sized bottleneck cases into the chamber.

The case head should be flush with the end of the barrel. If it isn't, you need to adjust your sized die down in small increments until the case head is flush with the end of the barrel or protrudes no more than about .002". If the case head falls below the end of the barrel, you have pushed the shoulder back too far and created headspace. You can rely on "feel" as you run your finger across the end of the barrel and

case head, or hold the end of the barrel up to eye level and sight across the end of the barrel to determine that the case head is not sticking out of the end of the barrel. .002" is difficult to see... it is not much.

Now load this case with a full normal load, and shoot it.

When you open the barrel without the extractor installed, the case head will be in the position it was when fired.

Take the barrel off the frame and look at the case head again. It will usually be sticking out of the end of the barrel about .010" or more.

This excess length must be removed, i.e., you have to bump the shoulder back in a full length size die. Neck sizing is out. If you insist on neck sizing or just partially full length sizing and have misfire problems, this is the reason.

Typical barrel to frame gap is normally from 0 to about .004". Some will be up to about .006" or so. To be more precise, close the barrel on feeler gauges to determine exactly what the gap is.

Your sized cases should not protrude from the end of the barrel more than the amount of the barrel-to-frame-gap.

Failure to understand the above is one of the two main causes for misfires, and accounts for a big percentage of the questions I get.

So at the first hint of misfires, CHECK YOUR SIZE DIE ADJUSTMENT.

Cases grow in length when fired in these break open guns. DO NOT TRY TO CRAM THEM BACK IN BY SLAMMING THE BARREL SHUT. It is like trying to drive a square peg into a round hole. It just won't work.

Step 2:

...to demonstrate that the firing pin strike collapses the shoulder of rimless bottleneck cases that have a traditional long sloping shoulder angle substantially, thus increasing headspace.

Using our Bellm Headspace Indicator or a depth micrometer with the barrel off the frame and the extractor removed, drop an empty primed rimless bottleneck case into the chamber and measure where the case head is in relationship to the end of the barrel.

Install the barrel on the frame.

Fire the primer.

Remove the barrel from the frame.

Measure where the case head is in relationship to the end of the barrel.

You will find that the firing pin has driven the case INTO the chamber at least several thousandths. Thus, if let's say, you started with .003" actual headspace, in the milliseconds before the powder is ignited and pressure builds, the headspace has been increased by however much the case is driven forward by the firing pin.

Functionally, you now have excess headspace.

Excess headspace and anything that softens the briskness of the firing pin strike contributes to misfires and/or erratic primer ignition and poor accuracy. Note that this also occurs with neck sized cases where the body of the case is binding on the chamber wall and not letting the case shoulder make firm contact at the chamber shoulder.

To alleviate erratic ignition and misfires due to cartridge DESIGN...

- 1) Choose a rimmed cartridge or a cartridge with a sharp "Ackley Improved" type shoulder angle that resists collapse of the case shoulder under the impact of the firing pin.
- 2) if it is a rimmed bottleneck cartridge, set it up with the minimum headspace so the forward stopping point on the case is the rim and the case is not touching at the shoulder.

Rules Addendum: Practical Hunter

Class Description: All 3 classes are to be shot from any SAFE freestyle position including prone, kneeling, sitting, or standing.

The Practical Hunter Long Course will be shot on the 200 meter Big Bore range with the standard full size targets at their normal ranges.

The Practical Hunter Short Course will be shot on the 100 meter Field Pistol range with the standard targets at their normal ranges, using standard field pistol cartridges only.

The Practical Hunter .22LR Course will be shot on the 100 yard SB range with the standard Small Bore targets at their normal ranges.

Classification Scores:

a maximum overall length of 21 inches.

- Optics are allowed up to a maximum of 6x power.
- Gun must be as manufactured with only cosmetic modifications.
- Ported barrels are allowed as long as they are shot from a safe position.
- A rest such as a bipod or a sandbag supporting the barrel in a prone position may be used by a new unclassified shooter and by shooters in classes A and AA.

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Diary of My First IHMSA World Championship

Editor's Note: For those who know Richard Slaton of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, you already know the outgoing personality he brings with him any place he goes.

Having shot IHMSA for just a few years now, Richard participated in his first World Championship this July. Knowing how detailed he is in his continued efforts to improve as a shooter, I asked him to consider submitting an article detailing his experiences—which he readily did. Richard and Patti arrived in OKC on Saturday to absorb the scene, and then he shot on Sunday-Friday. This is a fantastic account of a shooter's great experience and what he learned from it to continue his growth in this sport.

Day 1—Sunday July 20

Well, I guess I can now say I have shot in the IHMSA World Championship! After arriving in OKC before noon on Saturday, I got to take in the sights at the range and learn through observing, helping me prepare for my own actual shooting today.

Things did not go as well as I had hoped, but did go as I expected. Honestly, it was as good as it should have been for a "AA" and "AAA" shooter participating in his first World Championship.

My first ever World Championship entry was in UFS, and as most know, some days you can see the targets and sometimes you can't. Today was somewhere in between. On my 2nd bank of chickens, I shot the first chicken, and when I looked up, the first was still standing and the second was gone. I'm thinking I have done what I normally do at least once a match, which was SHOOTING OUT OF ORDER, which pretty much rattled me for that bank. However, after that bank, the guy running that part of the line came up and told me that I had hit the 1st target; however it did not fall. The 2nd target did fall, which was a malfunction, and that I could have an alibi. So, this let me feel somewhat better—until on the alibi shot, I did hit the target but because of let's just say a little interference, I shot the alibi before the "FIRE" command, so it did not count.

Now I'm rattled/embarrassed worse than before. The next bank, the same thing happened with hitting the first target but having it stay while the second fall down (this is real life—you can't make this stuff up!). But I manned up and made that alibi shot, this time after the "Fire" command. At that point in time, I'm thinking my best option might be to pack it up, say I've been there and done that, get my T-shirt, and go home. But then I found the humor in it and realized if somebody asked years later if I remembered by first entry at the World Championship, I would definitely say "Yes!"

The score was not a new high for me, but is a new memory. I did feel a little better after I saw a real shooter shoot the Small Bore turkeys instead of the Half-Scale turkeys that he was supposed to be on.

Next up was Unlimited Small Bore with Joe Frey as my spotter. I shot the sighter's missing low on the pig and getting center

hits on all the others. I re-shot the pig and center punched it the second time around.

Now to the firing line. I cleaned the four banks of chickens and the first two of the pigs. The first shot on the 3rd bank of pigs went between the legs (remember my sighters—lol), then cleaned bank four.

Onto the turkeys! I cleaned the first 2 banks of those birds, then I did what I normally do in the course of a day—shot out of order! I lost two on that bank, and then cleaned the fourth bank, so now I'm down 3 shots heading into the rams.

I hit high on the first ram, then overacted and shot under the next one, so now I'm down 4. I then missed the first ram on the last bank, so I finished 5 down for a 75x80, which converts to a 37 which ties my highest score.

I had a blast on this first day. I got to hang out and spot with the Frey brothers, spent a little time with Allen Gaskin, and met a lot of people. David Smith spotted for me on fifth-scale and thanks to him for that. I got to watch Dan and the California crew do their thing. I'm pumped up about the fun I will have tomorrow. Up next for tomorrow—UASFS in the a.m., and SB UAS in the p.m.

Day 2—Monday July 21:

I started with FS UAS and because of all the problems yesterday on the chicken targets on the "red" bank, I decided to use the yellow bank. The line officer agreed as well. However, the yellow bank was not any better, so I ended up having to use the yellow and red banks to have 5 targets to shoot at.

I cleaned the chickens and missed one pig. Then the turkeys ate my lunch! But I ended up with a 70 UASFS, which converts to a 35, which is a new high score for me, so I'm with this score, a happy camper.

Next up—Small Bore UAS. I was clean through the 2nd bank of turkeys, missed two of those darned turkeys, then finished by cleaning the rams. A SB UAS score of 78, which is a 39 converted is not bad for a "AAA" shooter, I was a happy camper once again.

I had a fun day. Spent time with Jackie Brown and was on the line with John Anderson. After the match, the Frey family and the Slaton family went to Pop's for ice cream to celebrate Mrs. Slaton's 59th birthday, followed by dinner with Allen Gaskin and his wife, Sheila for more celebrating. Fun day! Tomorrow—SB standing in the a.m., SB production in the p.m.

Day 3—Tuesday July 22:

Well, the heat is here, but that is no excuse. Starting off with SB standing, I shot the lowest score I have shot in 2 years. Started off badly, and without a spotter, I just never recovered. I was on the line with Captain John and Steve Martens (who made my sights). John was asking me how I liked the Martens set up—I told him I was sold on them, but today they were not miracle workers!

After adding up my score, I was writing the total on my score card. A guy leaned over and said, "Oh, are we supposed to convert it to a 40 round score?" I looked at him, and replied, "No dude, that 31 is my 80 round score!" I thought Joe Frey was going to wet his pants laughing. Once again, this is real life stuff that you can't just make up!

On to SB production. Being a "INT" SB production shooter (the only thing I'm INT in), I'm supposed to be able to run with the big dogs. And I did... until I got to the turkeys. As it always seems, I got one of those "Houston, we have a problem" bumps in the road; however, I seemed to get back on track with spotter help from Joe. Then for some reason, I decided to miss the first ram in all four tries, ending up with a middle of the pack 67.

A pretty good day today. All in all, most of the people are really nice—especially the locals.

Tomorrow I start with SB US using my production/standing gun—the same gun I shot both events with today.

Day 4—Wednesday July 23

Today was a record-setting day. I may be tied or set a new low SB US score, and did set a new low BB standing score for me. And thanks to Jackie Brown for bailing me out on the BB standing or it could have been a new all-time low for a World Championship! But on a good note, today was the last of 2 days of shooting standing, and today was the most fun I have had!

I spent time on the line with Richard and Janie Porter whom I met a few years back at their range in Sweetwater, TX. I also spent time with the Bakkens, a super nice couple from Canada, and a host of others that I did not always catch their names. It is always a good start when you're greeted by the always-smiling Jackie Brown and John Anderson. The weather was a great 101 degrees in the shade with 95% humidity, making it just like being at home.

Day 5—Thursday July 24

Well, it is all but over. And yes, it was Alabama day. And Alabama won the first gun, but Oklahoma won the second. I started the day with UAS HS and was clean until... you guessed it, the turkeys. I went 15/20 on those. Got back on track with rams, going 18/20 and finishing with a 73. That equals 36.5 for a new high score for me and put me in 1st in AA UASHS, so I was pretty happy with that.

The second gun, BB UAS (same gun) finished my first World Championship just like I started—doing everything I could to shoot myself in the foot. And I did a great job at that. Let me just put it this way—I shot 79 times, knocked over 78 targets, and my score was 75. I will leave the rest to your imagination.

Either way, I shot 10 guns, had 2 new personal best scores, and tied two other high scores, so I was somewhat pleased with the way I shot 6 of them. I had great fun spending time with Mr. Fields, Jackie Brown is top notch, I got to spend time with an old friend and meet some super new ones.

But the main thing I learned from this match is that the World Championship is no green monster. There is no reason for a new shooter such as me to be intimidated. The people on the line took very good care of me and made it a great experience.

Return to Home:

Well, I'm back home in Alabama, and with an 800 mile drive, I had time to fully analyze my first World Championship. And after doing so, it was still a positive adventure.

Jim Fields, Jackie Brown, and the whole OKC bunch, along with the help of Cindy Smith, is what made this boat float! I rate them right up there with the Georgia and the Oregon bunch, and that is some good company. Every IHMSA member needs to thank Cindy regularly.

As for the range, the target visibility was as good as I have seen, and I think that is about all you can ask for. The main

complaints I heard was it was hot some days, some days it was windy, and every day you shot down hill. Well, suck it up, this is the World Championship. "Conditions" is what separates world class shooters from the rest; "conditions" is what brings the cream to the top. I thought the "conditions" were actually mild, but I'm still willing to use it as my excuse.

My "shooting highlight" was 1st place in AAA SB U with a score that was in the middle of the pack in the INT scores. This one means a lot more than the AA UASHS or AA BB US first place finishes.

My "fun highlight" was a three-way shoot off for first place in AA UASFS. Coming in second isn't all that bad!

My biggest disappointment was the lack of afternoon and evening group socializing like they do at the WCC. But at the WCC, most camp at the range, and sharing food everywhere reminds me of tailgating at a football game. At this World Championship, most people stayed at hotels.

I think the price for admission was a little overpriced, both for entries and the banquet. But this was the World Championship.

As for advice from a first timer, I think it was/would be a lot more fun to go as a "AA" or "AAA" shooter than as an "INT" shooter. If you are going as an INT shooter and you're going just to win and you can't handle the "conditions", then it could be a long week for you. Yes, this is the World Championship to decide the best in the world, but sometimes that fly in the ointment is what causes excitement.

Would I ever go to another World Championship? I hope to, but not every year. Would I ever go back to OKC? In a heartbeat! Of course, all of this is solely my opinion, and opinions are just that.

Final Notes to Self:

- 2 guns a day was the right call—no more, no less.

- Shooting BB Unlimited or half-scale unlimited would have been more fun than shooting SB US.

- If you're lucky and get a spotter, disgust exactly what you need to hear and what you don't need to hear. The main thing for me is to keep ME on the correct target and let me know of any shot trending.

- All my standing shooting shots trended high (shooting down hill at this range) was not a problem with free style.

- Felt tip pen writes better on score cards than ball point!

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
The New Silhouetter


The imagination of target manufacturers is highlighted in the continuing flow of new targets from Birchwood Casey. Whether shooting for score, measuring groups, practicing for a match or just having fun plinking, Birchwood Casey seems to have something for everyone and keeps adding to its repertoire.

Most recently, I've tried three of Birchwood Casey's Eze-Scorer 23"x35" targets. One is a two bullseye target, one is a 6 bullseye target, and one is a "52-Card Shootup." The advantages of these targets include the sheer size and the number of bullseyes or shooting points per target. Our target boards at Falls Township Rifle and Pistol Association are the typical 24"x36" that are found at many ranges. The Birchwood Casey targets utilize the full 23"x35" sheets that I saw millions of passing through sheet-fed presses when I was in the printing business. By the time these sheets are stapled to the target boards, that 1" difference disappears and the shooter gets full utilization of the entire backer board.

For open sight practice, I like the two bullseye version, vertically positioned,



time downrange. The "52-Card Shootup" can be set up for a full day's range shooting, especially with a well sighted and aimed 22LR. There are actually 56 cards



saving one-half of my trips downrange to change targets. For some open sights and many scoped guns, I like the 6 bullseye target, greatly decreasing my walk



per sheet, including all the cards in a full deck, two Jokers and two additional targets. Each separate card has multiple aim points. For example, every suit has two symbols for that suit (spade, heart, club or diamond) plus the center point of the card. I have yet to use a full sheet at one range visit!

While the two bullseye targets are more practical for competition practice,

the "52-Card Shootup" brings back fond memories of the use of playing cards for targets when I was in my youth. My friend Tommy and I would have contests on who could completely remove all the red diamond from a card similar to some boardwalk gallery games. The difference was that we really aimed rifles that shot fairly well instead of the virtual spray and pray of the beat up 22 shorts or BBs that they usually had at the boardwalk.

At the then spectacular distance of just 21 feet, we were always both successful at achieving a ragged hole with all white around it, having completely removed the red. The only contest was who did it first and the winner/loser changed just about 50-50. Reporting the results was always fun. When asked by other friends how we made out, even if Tommy won I could always say I came in second place and Tommy was next to last! For the past 20 years or so, I don't recall shooting anything at less than 25 yards nor have I kept in touch with Tommy, but it would be interesting to try clearing the red at the greater 75 feet distance. I suppose I could get one sheet of "52-Card Shootup" to last a very long time.

Birchwood Casey just announced three new targets in its Ground Strike line. I've previously written about these types of reactive targets made from a firm resin material that almost seems to heal itself. These targets take a pounding with all kinds of fodder including 22LR, pistol and rifle cartridges. Two of the items that are on the way to me are "dancers" where the target is held on a spring like base to wobble back and forth upon being hit. The



third Ground Strike is its Hex Ball Target that is free to spin, fly and dance wherever it pleases. It seems to have more nooks and crannies than the previously tested Ground Strike Jack target. The indentations and cutouts ensure that every shot will result in its own particular reaction. I can't wait to get my hands on these new offerings from Birchwood Casey.

Returning to one of the threads in last month's column, I've now shot my third CMP match at my new 200 yard standard instead of the 100 yards I have been using for the last couple of decades. While not my personal best using my Garand, I have now shot my highest score in over five years, more or less confirming my comfort with the 200 yard sight picture over 100 yards. This also points out the benefit of keeping some sort of records to verify that what you are thinking is true (or debunking it if that is the case).

I expect the same positive result when I eventually return to shooting my Bushmaster AR at 200 yards in lieu of my 100 yards to date. The Bushmaster, being a tight target rifle will always outscore the rack grade Garand, but right now I'm having too much fun with the battle rifle. While the 30-06 uses considerably more powder and bullet weight than the 223, as long as I can get supply, it will remain fun.

I've had some time to play around with the new Hodgdon Reloading Data Center. I was so used to the mechanics and protocol of working the previous Data Center version that I grimaced to myself when things weren't the same. Well that changed quickly as I saw how to navigate the new site and get on screen comparisons of much more data than in the previous version, including the ability to get up to four different cartridges for comparison on tabs. I actually do a lot more "flat screen reloading" than I do at the bench. Besides satisfying my own curiosity, when I do go to the bench, it's with purpose and a plan as to exactly which of my components and recipe I will use. Despite my passion for the hobby, I find less and less time to stand at the bench so tools such as the Hodgdon Reloading Data Center pay off big-time for me.

Hodgdon recently announced its launch of three new professionally produced how-to videos on its Reloading Data Center. The videos cover rifle, pistol and shotshell reloading basics in an easy to understand step-by-step format. Recognizing the current vogue of using hand-held devices, the videos are compatible with smart phones and other devices. When I first went to the Reloading Data Center to view the videos, they did not jump out and hit me in the head. Although they were hiding in plain sight, I had to scroll down and pay attention until I saw them. It must be the male "Where's the milk?" syndrome as we stare into the refrigerator waiting to be berated as our spouses point to the container within inches of our face. Anyway, these

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Looking for a New Silhouette Challenge? Try 500 Meters with a Handgun!

I can still remember vividly the first time I tried IHMSA silhouette shooting 8 years ago—those 200 meter rams looked so far away and so small. I would see people shooting 40's and would think how I could never get to that point with a scoped gun, and to think about hitting 40 with open sights didn't even register at that point.

So here I was years later, getting ready to try a new challenge—my first 500 meter match. The 2014 World Championship had just ended the day before, and I had decided to stay the extra day for the 500m match if I had enough ammo—which I did have 45 cartridges left in my open sight unlimited 6 TCU. I had no idea what to expect, I had never shot past 200 meters, but I had just enough ammunition left to run the course.

I had thought about doing a 500 meter match on a few occasions, but I always found a good excuse not to. It seemed pretty intimidating shooting at standard silhouette targets at those extreme distances, and since my range only goes out to 200 yards, there was never a way to even shoot paper at such lengthy distances.

Luckily for me, Gary Crews of Oklahoma generously brought a scoped XP-100 with ammo for me to try, conveniently chambered in 6 TCU, same as my unlimited gun. It was set up for shooting out of the flop with an 18x Nikon scope—I shoot my Small Bore UAS gun out of the flop,

but I had never shot a center fire gun in such a manner. Gary didn't have sight settings for it past 200 meters, but it was still much more comforting to shoot a scoped gun first rather than try it blindly with open sights.

With full size targets set up at 200, 300, 400, and 500 meters, shooters were given two 2-minute sight in periods instead of the standard one, so I figured I would at least get to use my sighters to get on the chickens quickly, and then hopefully make it out to the pigs and turkeys, and maybe the rams.

Well, chicken sighters didn't go so well. I missed the first 3, and just edged the last two, so by the end of that first sight-in period, I had barely gotten on the chickens—and those are supposed to be the "easy" ones! I was still figuring out the position and new gun, and wasn't doing a very good job of it. Needless to say, I never made it past the pigs on my sighters, so I wasn't feeling too confident going into the start of my first relay.

But now I was more familiar with the gun and trigger. I had never shot an XP-100 before (I'm a Contender guy), but things were starting to feel good, and I got all 10 chickens. Then came the pigs, and after the first one was missed, I cleared the next 9. I was happy with a 19 on the front half. Now came the guess work, though—no sight settings for those evil turkeys, and

unlike any other turkeys I had ever shot before, these were now 1/4 mile away. This is when it got really exciting for me.

Two minutes went really fast on that first bank. Miss—sight adjustment. Miss again—another sight adjustment. Miss once again—another sight adjustment. That clock was running fast, and I hadn't hit a thing other than dirt and gravel. Shot #4—finally, a hit! Seeing that turkey fall from 1/4 mile away was such a thrill! It wasn't a good hit, but it fell. #5 did the same. The second bank of turkeys was equally exciting, as I hit all 5, and I hit those turkeys in essentially every part except the main body. If I had been hunting, I wouldn't have been doing a very good job—aside from the one I hit in the head. But it didn't matter, I had cleared a bank of turkeys at 1/4 mile. That was the biggest thrill I've had shooting silhouette in a long time.

Of course, that euphoria didn't last long, because then I was reminded I have to now shoot rams at 500 meters, once again with no sight settings. We gave the scope our best guess, and I'll be darned if I didn't clear that first bank of rams. Just like with the turkeys, my shots were all over the place, but they were hitting the target now well past 1/4 of a mile. I probably got a little too giddy on the last bank as I only got three of the five, but that was still much better than I would have ever thought going into it—15/20 targets at a 1/4 mile or more. What a satisfying experience!

I finished with a 34/40, which ended up being good enough for second place. It was the most fun shooting experience I have had in quite a while. The fact that I did it with a borrowed gun and no sight settings made it even better. Had Gary Crews and Sean Murray not been there to help me through the whole process, I would have been totally lost.

Now that I achieved a goal of mine, which was to be able to say I had hit a target at 1/4 mile or more with a handgun, and it went really well, I immediately turned my attention to a new goal—to be able to say I have hit a target at 1/4 mile or more with open sights! I got out my TC Contender chambered in 6 TCU, and with Jim Myers spotting for me, I was off again. Same deal—no sight settings, and this time, limited ammo for sighters; I would only have enough for 5 shots. Using my shoot off settings, I started out on chickens, and just like with the scoped gun, I couldn't get on them. So I never got past chickens on my sighters.

I got my first 4 chickens—great start. Then I only got one on the second bank. Same with the pigs—good start, bad finish. Four and two. But oh well, I was over half, so I was happy.

Guessing on sight settings, just using the minute of angle adjustments I had gotten from Gary's scoped gun earlier, up next were those despicable turkeys again. I must have been "trying" to hard, because I would look down range at the turkeys, and I could see them somewhat clearly—

as clear as I can see with the naked eye at 1/4 mile. Then I would settle into the Creedmoor, put the front sight on them, and all of a sudden the once-clear turkey would look like a tiny speck of fuzz sitting on the front sight. I'd look down range again—clear. Put the sights on them—tiny black fuzz. I ended up with 3 turkeys and three rams, and just as with the scoped gun, I was ecstatic. I had hit 6 targets over 1/4 mile away with open sights. Just a few years ago, I would have never imagined being able to do that. Finishing with a 17 seemed like a satisfying score to me on my first outing.

There are so many amazing shooters in IHMSA, I think sometimes we start to take things for granted and forget what an incredible accomplishment it is to be able to perform some of the things that so many of our shooters do virtually every time they go out and shoot. The biggest things that make these accomplishments possible for newer and younger shooters is the generous and outgoing people that make up this sport. The fact that Gary Crews, a person that I only see about once a year, thought to bring out a gun and ammunition for me to use, is a perfect example of that.

500 meter matches are not a sanctioned IHMSA event, so rules and the amount of time allowed per shooting session may vary from place to place. I know some may allow more time for sighters, or give more than 2 minutes to get your five shots off. But I actually really enjoyed that challenge of getting 5 shots off in 2 minutes, with all the sight adjustments and having to pay more attention to the wind than I normally do. I sometimes hear how silhouette shooting is a "slow" shooting sport. Well, try getting 5 shots off at 500 meter rams in 2 minutes, I promise you that it is like being in a time warp. The entire 40 rounds seemed like it was done in 10 minutes! In this particular match, ram hits were also counted if a hit could be determined on the target. Rams were full set, which with the gusting winds we had that day, was definitely a good call. And as match director Jim Fields said, the whole point was just to be out and have fun shooting, and since many of the people there may not have had a gun or load specifically for taking down rams at those extreme distances, this was a good decision for the time and place.

You may find different parameters if you try a 500 meter match someplace else. But no matter what the format, when you are at a range, it is "house rules" and as long as everybody is playing by the same ones, then there is nothing to complain about. Take the ball and run with it.

This certainly was one fantastic experience for me, and something I would encourage any IHMSA shooter to try if you haven't already. There aren't that many chances to shoot silhouette at 500 meters, so if you are at a shoot that offers that, I would encourage you to stay for that extra day and give it a try. There aren't many people out there in the general population that can say they have hit targets with a handgun over a 1/4 mile away.

MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITIONS

The Burris Cup:

Scoped .22 Long Rifle caliber handguns only. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in a freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

The Weaver Trophy:

Scoped centerfire handguns. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or meters. Guns may be bench rested over any solid rest as long as the gun is not in a Ransom Rest, vise, or any other mechanical clamping device. Lying on your back in freestyle position and piling sandbags by your body for support is legal. This will allow scoped guns set up for creedmoor to better compete.

The Merit Challenge:

Centerfire handguns with iron / open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 100 yards or

meters. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

The Daisy Avanti Trophy:

AIR Production guns with Iron/Open sights. Your best 5-shot group at 18 yards. Groups must be fired from an IHMSA legal freestyle position. No benchrest or artificial support allowed.

General Rules: All entries must be shot with IHMSA legal guns. Production, Revolver, and Unlimited guns are allowed in the Burris, Weaver, and Merit classes.

Witness: Winning groups must be witnesses by an IHMSA or NRA member.. Eligible winning targets must be signed and dated by the shooter and witness. Also, please include the shooter's IHMSA number and the witness's IHMSA or NRA number by their name. A witness is not required to enter but is required to win.

Targets: Targets submitted must contain no more and no less than 5 shots in each bull zone.



Match Publication Policy

As we continually have new match directors, following is the IHMSA News' policy on publication of state, regional, and "specialty" match notices and match results.

Any IHMSA sanctioned club in good standing may publish a notice of their club's state or regional championship match at no charge for three months. State match notices are limited to 2 1/4" x 5". Regional match notices are limited to 4 3/4" x 5". If a club is holding a "specialty" match and that match does not replace one of these championships, the IHMSA News will publish a 2 1/4" x 5" notice at no charge one time. These notices will run in Section B only. The club may publish additional notices of the same size for \$45 per issue. Ads must be prepaid before printing. All payments are to be sent to IHMSA HQ, P.O. Box 22356, Cheyenne, WY 82003. The club may specify whether the paid notice is published in Section A or B.

State match results can list both first and second place finishes. Regional match results can list first, second, and third place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a state championship may publish first and second place finishes. "Specialty" matches replacing a regional championship may publish first, second, and third place finishes. All other match results wherein the total number of handgun silhouette entries exceeds 11 (including all IHMSA, NRA & non-member guests) can list only the first place finish. Matches with less than 11 total handgun entries as defined above can list all IHMSA handgun entrants and their place. Regardless of the above, all 40's, 60's, and 80's (depending on the number of rounds fired at the match) can be published from ANY IHMSA match.

An IHMSA club holding a dual sanctioned (IHMSA/NRA) match may submit a match report for publication in the IHMSA News containing both IHMSA and NRA results. The number of published NRA results may not exceed the number of published IHMSA results. **Publication is limited to IHMSA sanctioned handgun disciplines only.**

- South Carolina (Small Bore & Fifth-Scale)—Sept. 13 & 14

- South Dakota over Labor Day weekend—August 28-31
- Virginia—Sept. 6 & 7

Then hunting season starts to roll around for many of us, and we are out scouting, glassing, and tromping through the outdoors. That doesn't mean there still isn't some major silhouette shooting to be had. October features a couple of state matches, as well as the Region 4 Championship.

- Louisiana—Oct. 4 & 5

- Region 4 in Oklahoma City—Oct. 3-5

As you can see, there are still great matches to come from virtually every part of the United States—west coast, east coast, south, north, Midwest. 240 Entries is Top Regional/State Shoot So Far—Will It Hold?

There have certainly been some significantly attended matches this year. Aside from the World Championship, which by my count had 566 entries, there have been several events which have had triple-digit entry counts. If my memory serves me correctly, here are the top-attended IHMSA Region/State matches thus far.

1. Region 8 in Pringle, South Dakota—240 entries
2. East Coast Championship, Lawrenceburg, Kentucky 223 entries
3. West Coast Championship, Grants Pass, Oregon—215 entries
4. Oklahoma State Championship, Oklahoma City—158 entries

Well, there are a few shoots left which may break into these ranks, with a couple that are almost certain to. The LA Extravaganza is an event which I have not attended (as of yet, at least!), but it sounds like it is a crazy good time. The South Dakota State Championship is usually in the 150+ entry range, and located in one of the most scenic areas of the country. Both of these matches are held over the Labor Day weekend, making for a good "end of summer" experience.

But the one event that probably has the best chance of possibly taking the

"bragging rights" for the year and knocking the Region 8 Championship out of that top spot of 240 entries may be the Region 4 Championship, held on October 3-5 at the Oklahoma City Gun Club. Site of two of the past three World Championships, this is one of the premier silhouette ranges in the United States.

If you were somebody who wasn't able to attend the World Championship, but would like to experience a shoot with world-class competition at a much more affordable price than the World Championship, the Region 4 Championship is the place to be. A mere \$95 gets you all the shooting you can handle for three days. All categories of IHMSA shooting can be had here, including indoor air pistol and a 500 meter match. Many of this year's world champions will be in attendance at this match, and it is open to any shooter whether you live in Region 4 or not, so it provides one last opportunity in 2014 to see how you stack up with some of the top IHMSA shooters.

It has been an exciting year of silhouette shooting thus far. Hopefully your personal schedule allows for one more chance to attend one of the many state or regional matches left on the 2014 schedule.






